FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Dear FOGSIANs and friends,

It gives me pride, pleasure and a sense of responsibility in equal parts to write this message as the President of the Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India for the Annual Report of 2011–12. FOGSI is growing phenomenally with its activities spread across the country. Among its various functions the most important ones are to support the scientific endeavours and general wellbeing of its 27,000 plus members and ensure a more therapeutic environment for the practitioner and the woman.

FOGSI has a deep sense of social responsibility as is clearly set out in its Vision and Mission statements. Perhaps the most important social issues that we face, as women's healthcare providers are sex selective foeticide and maternal mortality. To this effect, a number of societies have formed DOSST (Doctors Opposing Sex Selective Termination) Cells. Even though the massive Government machinery is at work at all levels to check these practices, FOGSI members. have faced some serious difficulties during these operations. FOGSI has done its best to represent the difficulties and ease these burdens. All the members of FOGSI doing ultrasonography are requested to follow the PCPNDT Act religiously.

Maternal mortality is a burning issue, and in order to meet the MDG goals by 2015, we have taken up this issue seriously with the annual theme, 'Let the Life of Every Mother and Neonate Count'. Maternal Mortality Reduction Workshops are also being held to involve FOGSI members and train Government officials. Also notable is the work done by special FOGSI projects namely, the EmOC FOGSI Certification course, FOGSI SIDA project, FOGSI – India FIGO Gates and MNH Initiative, and the National Initiative for Maternal Health.

FOGSI has introduced the Social Security Scheme to enable members to care for themselves and their family members. It has enormous benefits and we can scale these up as membership increases. I urge each and every FOGSI member to enrol for this scheme.

Some of the new developments at FOGSI include:

- The Journal of Obstetrics and Gynaecology of India that will now be indexed on Pubmed Central.
- Electronic archiving of journal issues dating back to 60 years.
- Making the All India Congress of Obstetrics and Gynaecology (AICOG) more stream lined in terms of conduct, venue selection and also employing an event manager for the same.
- Seeking a larger premise for FOGSI and ICOG so that we have our own college premises.
- Initiation of web-enabled services (webcast) to be in touch with all the Member bodies
 of FOGSI. To this effect it will be great if all members could update their complete
 contact details including addresses addresses with pin codes, mobile and landline
 numbers, email addresses, etc.

FOGSI has been guided on various academic and social activity fronts under the able leadership of the immediate past president, Dr. P. C. Mahapatra till January 2012 and then myself.

The FOGSI Annual Report is not only a mere documentation of activities, accounts and programs, but it also represents the spirit and work of its office bearers, chairpersons and members from across the country. I hope that the Annual Report will do its best to capture this spirit and bring to you highlights of the work that has been done.



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

Where we failed:

- Maternal mortality issue: Though there has been a slight dip in the maternal mortality rate, it still remains tremendously high. We need to take
 urgent steps in this regard with our 'Save the Mother' campaign. FOGSI needs to play a larger role in the GOI initiatives and we should think
 actively about FOGSI's maternity hospital. A simpler initiative could be a FOGSI mother adoption policy. Through this, each FOGSI member
 'adopts' and looks after all the needs medical, social, etc. of one mother. We also need to advocate maternity insurance.
- PCPNDT Act: A number of issues related to the PCPNDT Act remain unsolved including sensitization, personal grievances of members and the
 lack of uniformity in which the Act is being implemented. There has been some good news on this front with important decisions coming forth
 through the CSB meeting. One of these was the decision to allow gynaecologists to do sonography. My thanks to Dr. Sanjay Gupte, Dr. Girija
 Wagh and Dr. Rajeev Yeravdekar for their work in this matter.

FOGSI PROJECT REPORTS



1. EmOC FOGSI certification course report from April 2011 to March 2012 by Dr. Sadhana Desai

Dr. Sadhana Desai informed that the FOGSI-ICOG-GOI EmOC certification course was in its sixth year of implementation. Although its five-year contract was over in March 2011, an extension of one year was requested by the GOI to complete the training of MBBS doctors working in FRUs and to set up new EmOC training centres in those states that needed expansion of EmOC training. In 2011, FOGSI set up one nodal center in Chennai, five EmOC tertiary training centers in Hyderabad, Chandigarh, Amritsar, Haldwani and Patna and 33 district hospital centres for practical training of students. 20 master trainers and 66 district hospital trainers are trained in nodal centers and 212 MBBS doctors have taken EmOC training. Thus, a total of 1067 MBBS doctors have taken the training in the long course of 16 weeks and 104 doctors are trained in the short course since beginning of the program.

On July 14 and 15, 2011, under the Ministry of Health and Family welfare, a maternal health workshop-cum-review meeting was organized in New Delhi. The objectives of this workshop were to re-orient the state program managers on the key maternal health interventions under the RCH II/NRHM and to review the progress made by the states on maternal health and to charter the way forward. Various FOGSI EmOC state coordinators, representatives of Avni and Dr. Sadhana Desai attended the meeting.

The EmOC curriculum is six years old. Hence, an expert group meeting was held in Lucknow on September 24 and 25, 2011 for updating the EmOC course curriculum under the leadership of Dr. Vinita Das, Prof. and Head of Dept. at KG Medical College, Lucknow. The meeting was financed by FIGO.

There was also an expert group meeting for the evaluation of skill-based maternal health training under RCH II on January 3, 2012. The meeting was jointly organized by the department of international development and ministry of health and family welfare, Govt. of India. Various state EmOC consultants of FOGSI and National Technical Consultant of EmOC, Dr. Prakash Bhatt attended the meeting. The meeting ended with praises for work done by FOGSI and ICOG in carrying out EmOC program in majority of the states in India.

Dr. Prakash Bhatt attended the UNFPA - Asia Pacific Regional Office workshop on strengthening Emergency Obstetric Care (EmOC), selected Maternal Health and other RH issues, organized in partnership with the South Asia Federation of Obstetrics and Gynaecology (SAFOG) in collaboration with WHO, from April 27–29, 2012 at Colombo, Sri Lanka to represent India on behalf of FOGSI.

2. Report of FOGSI-SIDA project by Dr. Jaydeep Tank

Dr. Jaydeep Tank informed the members that in September, he had presented a detailed report of the SIDA project which has come to an end with the help of the various stakeholders over the years. There are sample registration surveys revealing that for the first time in the history of independent India, the contribution of unsafe abortion to maternal mortality is less than 8%. It is with the help and efforts of all the members and FOGSI that we have been able to do it. FOGSI is one of the active providers and certainly will not obstruct policies that promote safe abortion. Even the 8% of mortality is too much.

The SIDA project has actually taken up the consortium for provision of safe abortion. The essential goal was to access legal, safe and comprehensive abortion services, primarily at the primary health centers. The four objectives of the project were to develop an effective

district level model base which could be CAC, develop a pilot model for expanding a provider base, implement MTP rules and regulations for states effectively and then expand. Fortunately the project has several major pick-ups. We could manage to pilot this model since the Government too has accepted this model as something that can be scaled up in future. He gave the idea of the scale of the project. In Rajasthan over 1,800 communities have been intermediately oriented about it, followed by meetings in 150 villages with 600 women groups. In Maharashtra in 2007, only two out of nine rural hospitals were providing MTP services and none of the 50 PHCs in the district were offering safe abortion services and there were improvements in all service parameters.

He said that something which he had not presented is that FOGSI has two major publications from these projects, both of them deal with

a provision of abortion by mid-level providers. One study is on the comparison between mid-level providers and the efficacy by which they provide abortion. This has now been published in the international prospective of sexual and reproductive health and another study which talks of mid-level providers which has now been published in the Journal Contraception. Besides this there were several other achievements of this project, which were captured in the publication. He spoke of several recommendations being made. As the SIDA project has closed he would not be reporting about it anymore. He said he would be reporting on the FIGO initiative project which is for a period of three years and has now been extended for a period of two years. It is an initiative on behalf of Prof. Anibal Faundes, the coordinator of the project who also actively communicates among various stakeholders. He said that it has been a

difficult time for people who are working in the field of abortion. There seems to be much enterprising between the PCPNDT Act and the MTP Act. At times it also seems that the authorities are using the PCPNDT Act to shut down abortion services. Hence, we need to be careful and vigilant. Let us not take the freedom we have in providing abortion services for granted. We must understand that it has come at a price and that we must be vigilant enough to pay the price. He ended by thanking all the office bearers and presidents under whom he has worked on this project, even though his tenure as a Chairman was over, he was allowed to work on this project and he hoped it was benefiting.

3. Report by Dr. C.N. Purandare (Safe Pregnancy & Delivery Project and FOGSI-India FIGO Gates and MNH Initiative)

'Improving Maternal and Newborn Health in low resource countries through Strengthening the Roles of Obstetric and Gynaecological National Associations', FOGSI-FIGO LOGIC partnership for implementing the project in Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh

- The FIGO-LOGIC team of Prof. David Taylor and Prof. Gwyneth visited Rajasthan to assess the progress of the Maternal Death Review (MDR) program implementation in August 2011 and the team went back impressed by FOGSI's role and implementation by JOGS/AVNI.
- EmOC curriculum National meeting in partnership with GOI was held on September 24 and 25, 2011 to finalize the revised curriculum. (WHO/UNFPA/IAP/NNF/UNICEF also attended the meeting).
- FOGSI India was given the honor to host the 2nd FIGO-LOGIC international meeting in Mumbai. 70 participants from across the world came to Mumbai for the meeting between October 12–14, 2011. FOGSI was also given a full day on October 14 to showcase itself in front of the eight FIGO-LOGIC countries who came for the meeting.

RAJASTHAN

- All field-level MDR trainings completed

 - FOGSI in consultation with FIGO-LOGIC decided to implement Maternal Near Miss Program, in six medical colleges across India.
- National consensus meeting to firm up the Near Miss curriculum/ protocols/tools was held in Delhi on April 13, 2012 and received participations from UNICEF, WHO, NNF, IAP, State Government Representatives and Medical College representatives.

MDR Software

 FOGSI has completed the design and development of MDR software in partnership with GOI and AVNI. Discussions with GOI are on for deployment of the software on a national level.



4. Report by Dr. Sanjay Gupte about the National Initiative of Mother Health programme

- Dr. Sanjay Gupte said that the mission statement of his project on 'Save the Mother and Newborn National Initiative' is, 'Reaching the unreached with reproductive health services to reduce the maternal and neonatal mortality in India'. The initiative is taken up with multi-stakeholder participation with a consortium of FOGSI (member strength 25,000), IAP (Indian Academy of Pediatrics) (Member strength 18,000), NNF (National Neonatology Forum) (Member strength 3500), SOMI (Society of Midwives of India), Karuna Trust and IIM A.
- Also implemented is the FOGSI TAG initiative for reducing MMR and IMR by 50% through partnership with state and central governments. The objectives of the initiatives are for all mothers to get antenatal care (ANC), with supervised delivery, followed by appropriate postnatal care (PNC), effective newborn care, to implement Standard Treatment Guidelines (STGs) in district hospitals and FRUs. Also part of the objectives are capacity development and mentoring of medical officers, midwives and other paramedical personnel, accreditation and empanelment of our members' hospitals.
- The estimated outreach of the project is 31 lakh pregnant women in one year and 1.55 crore in five years. All 28 States and 7 Union Territories will be covered. In each of these, two districts are considered. Hence the total number of districts considered under SMNBI are 70.
- Government support: Union Health Minister and Mission
 Director NRHM have pledged their support to the SMNBI.
 Mr. Pradhan, Mission Director NRHM has issued instructions
 to State NRHM representatives to ensure their support and
 cooperation with our FOGSI fraternity in the implementation of
 SMNBI in their States and selected districts. FOGSI members
 from Karnataka (Belgaum) and Bihar have already reported
 receiving ample cooperation from the government sector.

Phase I: Under Phase I of SMNBI, eight member states have expressed willingness and pledged their support to take this initiative forward in two districts of their respective regions. Till date, all state FOGSI representatives have met. Interactions included government officials such as the CMO, DHO, NRHM representatives in addition to the Prognosis Management and Research Consultants from the agency who were employed to bring about theses interactions.

Phase II: In this phase, the focus would be upon all active considerations on aspects that would promote the inclusion of SMNBI

in State PIPs for 2012. In many states' PIPs and also in the National PIP, iron sucrose is now included. Magnesium sulphate has been accepted as a major proposition at all PIPs. Accreditation of hospitals has been accepted. Skill labs have been working in Patna and the government is looking after opening such labs in other states. This coordination has been initiated. A meeting was attended on 'Impact evaluation of the Chiranjeevi Scheme on mortality' and the 'Study of public-private partnership for EmOC in JSY in Maharashtra' at IIM Ahmedabad. We are now helping to formulate Chiranjivi-like schemes for the Central Government.

A meeting was arranged with the scientists of Karolinska University. The title of the meeting was, 'Evidence for Policy and Implementation: Intensifying efforts to achieving health related MDGs with the aim to increase competencies to make evidence-informed policies and implement them to benefit disadvantaged groups'. Some of our members have already started identifying places. Special mention should be made of Dr. Shobhana Patted's work, BLOGS that chose to implement SMNBI at Gokak taluka and wonderful work has been done at Tukkanatti PHC. Patna society has also conducted various training programmes for ANM, LHV, nurses at different places. A meeting was held with Mr. Anthony Cameron, Director and Head of the NIPI Secretariat (Norway India Partnership Initiative), to exchange knowledge on addressing and improving maternal and child mortality with a focus on MP, Bihar, Orissa and Rajasthan.

Future plans: NIPI Secretariat will meet with the NRHM Mission Director and/or the Health Secretary to outline our proposal with district action plans relevant to areas being piloted in districts such as Angul, Sambalpur, Betul, Alwar, Dousa. Plans are also in place to work with the health ministry, as the Health Minister himself is ready to share ideas with us and a meeting to this effect should be arranged soon.

How FOGSI members can participate: Identify any district or public facility, offer ANC care, mentorship or training, report to us and we will help enhance the service provided, opt to get your hospital accredited and empanelled with the government.

Next steps of the initiative: As applicable and mutually decided, governmental infrastructure such as FRUs, PHCs, CHCs and/or rural hospitals will be made available under this initiative. Untied funds can be utilized for appropriate planned activities under the SMNBI.

- Sensitization towards Research this has been done through research methodology workshops, where postgraduates are oriented to the basics of clinical research, searching scientific data, and publishing. About 35 workshops were held through the entire tenure, of which one third were during 2011–12.
- Independent Ethics Committee of FOGSI the committee was
 established in 2010 and there has been a process of training of
 the committee members. Research applications have started to
 reach the committee in 2011–12 and the committee is meeting
 regularly to discuss them.
- Long Distance Postgraduate Diploma in Research in association with Symbiosis Institute of Health Sciences, Pune, which opened the doors of research education for the FOGSI members for the first time. In a period of one year, 25 members could avail this education and many more have enrolled.
- 4. Workshops on PCOS Research Update began in 2011, under the leadership of Dr. P.C. Mahapatra and have been continued due to their immense popularity in the year 2012 under the leadership of Dr. P.K. Shah. In all, about 40 workshops have been conducted.

- PCOS Registry Another ambitious project launched this year titled 'PCOS Registry' has been shaping up under the guidance of Dr. P.K. Shah, Dr. Mandakini Parihar and Dr. Jaydeep Malhotra, which should soon reveal to us our country's true statistics of PCOS.
- 6. The Committee Workshop at AICOG 2012, Varanasi was very successful. It saw two international faculty members in attendance Professor Roy Homburg and Dr. Anil Gudi. There were four other national faculty and 198 delegates who attended the workshop. The committee workshop for AICOG 2013, Mumbai is planned on the subject of Premature Ovarian Failure.
- 7. A book titled 'Guidance on the Clinical Research Methodology' would soon be published.
- 8. Work on the research front and community-based projects has been going along, with:

Endometriosis Committee

- CMEs were held all over India. International faculty such as Dr. Giuseppe Benagiano and Dr. Osama Shawki participated in these CMEs.
- Four symposia were held, to disseminate knowledge on endometriosis at cities including Kota, Amravati and Jodhpur. The symposia included lectures, panel discussions and video sessions to facilitate understanding and clinical application of the knowledge of endometriosis.
- Several workshops of the Endometriosis Committee were held.
 The workshops were mainly focused on the live presentations of endometriosis-related endoscopy. A large number of delegates were present at several places like Bhilai, Baroda and Jamnagar.
- 4. The Endometriosis Committee is involved in the research work with Dr. B.N. Chakrovorty. The research is on the subject of Implantation Failure in Endometriosis.

- 5. Publications and academic involvement: The Endometriosis Committee had released a bulletin 'Endometriosis Gen' in the MCM in September 2011 at Mumbai. Several articles on endometriosis have been written by Dr. Kanthi Bansal to bring out the knowledge of endometriosis. Dr. Kanthi Bansal was called for an oration on endometriosis at Ranchi on February 26, 2012.
- Several social programs on endometriosis were carried out during 2011–2012 in Pune, Trichy, Lalgudi, Erode, Ahmedabad and Dindigul. The response of the delegates and the audience was excellent and there was an active interaction from the delegates.
- International collaborative activities with endometriosis societies and organizations of various countries including New Zealand, Egypt, Iran and Italy have been held.



Endoscopy Committee

The main highlights of the work done by the Chairperson and the committee for the year 2011–12 **involved improving the standards** of training in endoscopy. The chairperson, Dr. Pragnesh Shah visited the following centres for inspection, accreditation and recognition as FOGSI training centers:

The committee has proposed to upload on the FOGSI website, the minimum course curriculum, application and payment process for endoscopy training at the FOGSI recognized centers. This will enable transparency and ease of administration.

Accreditation guidelines have been proposed and await the approval of the managing committee.

Academic activity:

- Contributed chapter on 'FOGSI Focus on Safe Surgical Practice'
- Completed: GCPRS on 'Diagnostic Endoscopy for Infertility: Clinical Practice Guidelines'

Workshops on pelvic floor defects:

19 workshops were held through the year. Nine workshops were conducted with live surgical sessions at Cuttak, Patna, Madurai, Bengaluru, Deoli-Savangi, Surat, Rajkot, Raipur and Bhilai.

Future activities planned include recommendations to the MCI for curriculum and contents on endoscopy in gynaecology and bringing more uniformity in training and modules especially at the FOGSI recognized centers.

Ethics and Medicolegal Committee

- The main aim of the committee is to sensitize members for ethical practice and litigation-free practice. The objectives are to reach even smaller societies for workshops, to sensitize and make them up-to-date for the PCPNDT ACT for better compliance and a hassle-free practice of sonography.
- The Chairperson sent invitation letters to all member societies to expand their committee membership. He also sent invitation letters with modules to all societies to conduct various workshops outlined below. The workshops were held in societies that replied to the invitation.
- The highlights of the committee's activities were the three workshops on ethics and medicolegal aspects in obstetrics at

- Raipur as part of the North Zone Yuva FOGSI, at Varanasi, AICOG 2012 and the Vadodara OBGYN society.
- The committee also conducted workshops on Critical Care in Obstetrics at 19 societies such as Bhopal, Jaipur, Valsad, Amravati, Kolkata, Rajkot, Kota, Sidhpur, Karad, Sambalpur, Cuttack, Aurangabad, Jalgaon, Ajmer, Gurgaon, Gorakhpur, Kannur, Calicut and Madurai.
- Joint workshops with the Imaging Sciences Committee were held at Valsad and Mehsana.

Academic Activities:

- 45 workshops in B and C societies of FOGSI on Contraception Update. The societies covered are: Burla, Coimbatore, Cuttack, Mysore, Jabalpur, Sagar, Bhopal, Bokaro, Ajmer, Ranchi, Islampur, Kakinada, Vishakapatnam, Rewari, Meerut, Ghaziabad, Akola, Saharanpur, Dehradun, Haldwani, Bareilly, Rajkot, Faizabad, Varanasi, Chandigarh, Ludhiana, Jalandhar, Amritsar, Bhilai, Madurai, Bhubaneswar, Patiala, Guwahati, Tirupati, Nagpur, Trichy, Thanjavur, Nagpur, Salem, Navi Mumbai, Bellary, Malda, Vijayawada, Warangal, Behrampur, Chennai and Rourkela.
- The Family Welfare Committee partnered Mumbai Obstetric and Gynaecological Society for a conference on 'Contraception and Safe Abortion in Focus: Rights and Choices' held on August 7, 2011 in Mumbai. Family Welfare Committee and JHPIEGO held a workshop on August 6, 2011 on 'Newer Contraceptives'.
- 3. Held committee workshop at Varanasi AlCOG 2012 on 'Contraception Eternal a video interactive session'. Delivered a talk on 'Long-Acting Reversible Contraceptives' at Ranchi in the All-Jharkhand Obstetrics and Gynaecology conference held on February 25, 2012.
- Sessions on contraception were organized by the committee in all four Yuva FOGSIs held between April and December 2011.
- 5. Family welfare and MTP committees together started workshops on 'Update on Contraception and Safe Abortion in Clinical Practice' in the B and C societies of FOGSI. The first workshop was done in Kota on March 25, 2012. Dr. Atul Ganatra and Dr. Ritu Joshi were the national faculty.

 The Chairperson participated as faculty in the SAFOG conference in Sri Lanka, at the International Conference on Contraception in Kolkata, National conference on Gynaecology and Endocrinology at New Delhi and at various meetings in Ranchi, Raipur, Mumbai and Bengaluru.

Training:

The Family Welfare Committee and MTP Committee of FOGSI joined hands with PSI for initiating a networking and knowledge-sharing project on IUCD Insertion and Medical Abortion. We completed 10 workshops in three districts: New Delhi, UP, and Rajasthan. This completed Phase I of the ventures. Phase II of this partnership was launched in New Delhi on March 14, 2011 and nine new districts were added as a result. In these workshops, doctors were trained on PPIUCD insertion on the Zoe model.

Advocacy:

- Was invited as one of the experts on the Expert Committee for a GOI meeting on 'Introduction of Cu 375 IUCD in the National Family Planning Program' in Sept 2011 at Nirman Bhavan, New Delhi
- Represented FOGSI in various advocacy meetings by ARC (Advocating Reproductive Choice) in New Delhi on February 8, 2012.
- Invited as Technical Faculty to the 'Comprehensive Abortion Care' workshop held in Srinagar on March 3, 2012 to deliver a talk on 'Safe Abortion Technologies'. This workshop was conducted by GOI, Govt of J&K, and IPAS.



Research:

- With the support of MSD, Family Welfare Committee has undertaken a project 'CELECT' which elaborates the impact of counselling on selecting a hormonal contraceptive method. This will be done in 40 to 50 societies of FOGSI. This project received the approval of the FOGSI Ethics Committee on January 4, 2012.
- The Chairperson has written a paper on 'Knowledge, Attitude and Practice of Long Acting Non Hormonal Reversible Contraceptives in Clinicians of Rajasthan'. This will be presented in FIGO 2012 at Rome.

Publications:

The Chairperson published a chapter on 'Post-Abortion Contraception' in FOGSI Focus.

Social activities:

The Chairperson addressed women on 'Choice of Contraception' at Mahila Mandal Meetings in rural Jaipur.

Foods, Drugs and Medico Surgical Equipment Committee

Chairperson: Dr. Rajendrasingh Pardesi Vice President incharge: Dr. Mandakini Megh.

The committee comprises 12 national advisors, a national workshop coordinator, two national scientific committee members, eight zonal coordinators and in all 40 members.

Some of the important aims and objectives of the committee are to promote awareness about good nutritional management among FOGSI members and the general public. The committee sees anemia as the major nutritional problem and would aim to tackle it by de-worming

school girls in rural areas, providing nutritious snacks (groundnuts and jaggery) to school children. In terms of drug safety, the committee would like to see more regulated use of emergency contraception and MTP pills, publish a booklet on drugs taken during pregnancy/lactation, formulate FOGSI guidelines on antimicrobial use and hold workshops on 'Recent Drugs in OBGYN'.

The committee has organized conferences and meetings as given below:

Some important issues related to drug safety that the committee has overseen are as follows:

1. MTP Pill and Prostaglandins

A meeting was held with Mr. Dilip Shrirao, IPS, Joint Commissioner (Vigilance), Food & Drugs Administration, Maharashtra State, Pune. He has narrated the importance of maintenance of register 'K' for these drugs to resolve the issue of regularizing stock and use of these drugs. We stressed on the use of these drugs in saving mothers.

2. Injection Methergine

A query by the Dhanbad Society regarding the civil surgeon's order to ban Methergine (as per newspaper reports) was answered. The drug can be used safely as per the FIGO guidelines on PPH, keeping the contraindications in mind.

3. B Gap Contraceptive Pill

A query was raised about this drug by some members. Since it is not registered by AYUSH or the Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic sciences, there is no comment from them. Since it is not related to our specialty of Allopathy, it will not be considered in our GCPR of contraception.

Astra Zeneca

The production had temporarily stopped and the company advised stopping the use of some of their products. This was communicated to all our members.

5. **Communication** is in progress with the Indian Bureau of Standards regarding reaffirmation of standards.

Genetic and Fetal Medicine Committee

Chairperson: Dr Prashant Acharya

Vice President incharge: Dr. Prashant Acharya

Academic Activity and Training:

- 24 workshops on Fetal Medicine and Birth Defects have been carried out during 2011–12 with GE Healthcare throughout the country.
- The committee has been working on sensitization and education of members on the PCPNDT Act, its implementation and

compliance as well as formation of DOSST cells.

- 3. Raising awareness about genetic tests available and their use and limitations.
- Workshops on recurrent pregnancy loss, preterm birth and live ultrasound demonstration have been held.



Advocacy:

The following issues have been targeted by the committee for advocacy amongst the public and professionals.

- Thalassemia-free society Postmarital counseling (rather than premarital counseling) to avoid difficulties with marriage. The committee is working on this proposal in Gujarat.
- 2. Indian charts for biometry and fetal growth.
- 3. Appropriate and judicious use of aneuploidy detection tests.
- 4. Appropriate antenatal Anti D prophylaxis.
- Appropriate treatment of members by authorities regarding implementation of the PCPNDT Act should be overseen by the President, FOGSI.

Research:

We have carried out the basic research on:

- Indian fetal biometry showing reduction in growth velocity after 35 weeks in Indian fetuses.
- Fetomaternal hemorrhage during antenatal period usually does not exceed 2ml, implying that a lower dose of AntiD can be used for antenatal prophylaxis.

Publication:

FOGSI Focus will be published in November 2012. **Social activities** include camps for antenatal checkups and the anemia preventions. We have done a large project for Thalassemia Prevention also.

HIV and AIDS Committee

Chairperson: Dr. Sarita Agarwal

Vice President incharge: Dr. Laxmi Shrikhande

The main objectives of the committee are described as:

- For the lay public creating awareness about HIV/AIDS, PMTCT (especially amongst pregnant and to be pregnant women), about safe sex practices and avoiding high risk behavior.
- To improve care provision to HIV positive women in pregnancy and delivery and raise awareness and knowledge about ARV amongst care providers. To also work for preventing discrimination in terms of access to care.
- Safe practices for healthcare providers and spreading knowledge about PEP.

Some important academic activities include CMEs, symposia on the subject of HIV in women and pregnancy as well as safe surgical practices. Panel discussions on this subject at important conferences such as the FOGSI-FIGO Conference have been interactive and fruitful.

I have delivered talks and conducted awareness programs on the subject of HIV, HIV and women's health and PMTCT at various forums, Mahila Mandals, social meetings, and jails.

The committee has published/prepared:

- At a Glance PEP poster 'Occupational Exposure is the Risk but is Preventable'.
- FOGSI Policy statement on HIV.
- HIV guidelines for the obstetrician as a part of GCPR.

Infertility Committee

Chairperson: Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar

Vice President incharge: Dr. Nandita Palshetkar

The aims of the committee and the highlights of the activities in 2011–12 are listed below:

- To increase the awareness of various developments in the field of infertility
- To develop guidelines in basic treatments and protocols and thereby improve the standard of infertility practice in the country
- To make hysteroscopy a user-friendly procedure for all

These three important aims were achieved by conducting three types of workshops in various FOGSI societies:

- Hysteroscopy Workshop Adding hysteroscopy to your practice. This workshop was based on the maxim of 'See One, Do One, Teach One'. Each delegate received a hysteroscopy workbook with practical tips compiled by Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar and Dr. Nandita Palshetkar. This was conducted at Raipur, Pune, Jalandhar, Ludhiana, Amritsar, Chandigarh, Bharuch, Navi Mumbai, Mehsana, Goa, Bengaluru, Manipal, Guwahati, Ahmedabad, Hyderabad, Indore, Muzaffarnagar, Jaipur, Patna and Varanasi.
- IUI Workshop with hands on semen washing workshops were conducted at Ranchi, Daman, Navsari, Palghar, Jamnagar and Ratlam.
- Advanced Infertility CME (hysteroscopy + IUI +ART) were held at Pune, Ranchi, Anand, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Nashik, Kanyakumari, Bijapur, Kolhapur, Varanasi and Kanpur.

Accreditation:

The Chairperson visited and accredited seven centers as FOGSI-approved training centers in infertility. The committee members including Dr. Sushma Baste and Dr. Prakash Trivedi were also involved with the accreditation process.

Academic Activities:

- The Chairperson was also the Organizing Chairperson of a collaborative activity of the IAGE – International Annual Conference IAGE 'Safe Endoscopy' at Pune in June 2011 and the committee members were actively involved in the event.
- The Chairperson spoke in many conferences conducted by FOGSI, FIGO, IAGE and ISAR.

Medical Disorders in Pregnancy Commitee

The committee comprises 15 advisors and about 40 members.

Academic:

- Obstetric Dilemmas Medical Solutions 25 workshops were conducted as a part of the FOGSI-CIPLA collaboration. The highlights were recent trends in the practical management of various medical disorders seen in pregnancy especially diabetes, hypertension, anemia and subclinical hypothyroidism. There was participation from physicians, neurologists, gastroenterologists and cardiologists in these workshops. These were conducted at Cuttack, Gurgaon, Vishakapatnam, Navi Mumbai, Berhampur, Ujjain, Rewari, Jabalpur, Raipur, Kanyakumari, Ghaziabad, Kanpur, Madurai, Coimbatore.
- Nine Months Nine Challenges 15 workshops on 'Nine Months Nine Challenges' were conducted as a part of the FOGSI-Wanberry initiative and highlighted on Hyperhomocystinemia and its adverse pregnancy outcome. Orissa (Cuttack), Siliguri, Jamshedpur, Burla, and West Bengal societies were among the participating societies.
- 'Warning signals Alarming Outcome' 10 workshops on this topic
 were held for the ANMs, nurses and pharmacists. Gurgaon, Cuttack,
 Bhubaneshwar, Puri, Balasore were the main venues. The workshops
 were structured so as to brief the paramedics on the danger signals of
 various fatal diseases likely to occur during pregnancy as they are often
 the first line of contact with patients in emergency conditions.
- Collaboration with DIPSI (Diabetes in Pregnancy Study in India)

 The members of the committee have been actively involved in advocating the single-step screening for gestational diabetes with a goal of detecting and treating cases of gestational diabetes. The consensus meeting on acceptance and popularization of single step two hours 75gm OGCT as a method of screening of GDM was held at Chennai and attended by Dr. Sujata Misra, Dr. Hema Diwakar and Dr. Uday Thanawala.
- Asia Pacific Society for Infectious Diseases in Gynaecology and
 Obstetrics (APSIGO) Dr. Sujata Misra, Dr. Anuradha Khanna and Dr.
 Girija Wagh had attended the inaugural function and formation of this
 society as representatives of FOGSI and the need to create our own
 Indian database of prevalence and incidence of infectious diseases
 in obstetrics and gynaecology was released. A study pertaining to the
 same was conducted by Dr. Sibani Rout at SCB Medical College in
 Orissa this year and the data was analyzed.

Advocacy:

Awareness camps on basic signs of medical disorders in pregnancy conducted in Sakhigopal district of Puri with the aid of an NGO called MAMTA.

- Single-step screening for gestational diabetes we now have a strong database of 25,234 patients screened under this initiative.

- The relation of maternal serum insulin to cord blood insulin

Academic:

- Every year, the Committee organizes the prestigious Dr. C.G.
 Saraiya CME of FOGSI, the landmark annual FOGSI CME programs on the eve of AICOG. This year it was held on January 27, 2012 at Varanasi. More than 3,000 delegates attended this paid CME of FOGSI with great enthusiasm and zeal. The topics were very carefully selected and the national faculty did great

justice to the topics. The first session was on 'Screening in Obstetrics' and the second session was on 'Fibroid Uterus'.

Training:

For postgraduate trainees all over India, the Committee initiated an exam-oriented PG training program called FOGSI Review Course for Examinations (FORCE) in 2010. It has been running successfully all over India as a premier PG teaching and training program of FOGSI in medical colleges, with a very dynamic and regularly updated module and a combination of national and local faculty of eminence. Average attendance in each session is about 100 members. It is a hotly discussed and very well-attended PG teaching program. 16 such programs have been held in 2011–12. The Neonatal Resuscitation poster was distributed to more than 12,000 doctors across the country. Postnatal Care Workshop:

These workshops were started by Dr. Mandakini Megh in the year 2012 and were coordinated by the Safe Motherhood Committee.

Training:

Trainers of Trainers (ToT) Workshop: One-day workshop on Maternal Mortality was conducted on May 15, 2011 at the India Habitat Centre, New Delhi with 65 doctors participating. All major issues of maternal death were discussed and elaborated with practical drills. All the participants were given CDs of the program along with emergency obstetric kits.

Training of Paramedics: The Safe Motherhood Committee coordinated with Dr. D.K. Dutta in the conference on 'Why Mothers Die?' at Kalyani on December 4, 2011 to conduct the workshop on the 'Role of Paramedics in Obstetric Care'. The session was attended by 150 participants. Practical drills on ANC, PPH and eclampsia were carried out by defining appropriate referral issues. The emergency obstetric kit was demonstrated and its uses duly explained.

Advocacy:

- The Safe Motherhood Committee unveiled the logo and slogan
 of Safe Motherhood Committee, which was approved at the
 Managing Committee Meeting FOGSI April 2011 at Gurgaon.
 The logo and slogan will be used in academic and social
