FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

My dear fellow FOGSians

Theme:

The year 2020 turned out to be memorable, not just for me, but for every person worldwide. When I was installed as President, I had declared that safety was the utmost priority. With the onset of the pandemic, this mission was challenged like never before. All year round, we defied the established norms, went back to our roots and relearned basic medical and safety practices, embraced new platforms of expression and operation, and continued to strive for safety. For our patients, the mothers all over our country, no matter where they live or what background they come from, who depend on us to make their experience of pregnancy a safe and joyous one. For our tiny little patients, the fetus and the neonates, who cannot tell us when they suffer, and count on us to understand their unspoken needs to bring them safely into the world. And for us FOGSIANS- our members, postgraduates, staff and our families. Freedom from fear, stress and threats of violence- to do the jobs that we do best.

Covid related work:

As soon as COVID was declared a pandemic, we at FOGSI immediately realized that it was inevitable that we would be managing and delivering patients and newborns affected with COVID. FOGSI has been in the forefront in helping to prevent the spread, and managing affected patients.

We released our 1st short advisory on 17th March and sent it to all our members by a link on bulk SMS. The message was to not do routine low risk work in OPD, and to defer from elective surgeries and diagnostic procedures. We also sent our humble suggestion to MOHFW, GOI to defer from elective surgeries and hospital visits for routine work. The Hon PM Narendra Modi, in his speech for 'Janta curfew' on 19th March advised for the same; to stop elective surgeries and defer from hospital visits for routine work.

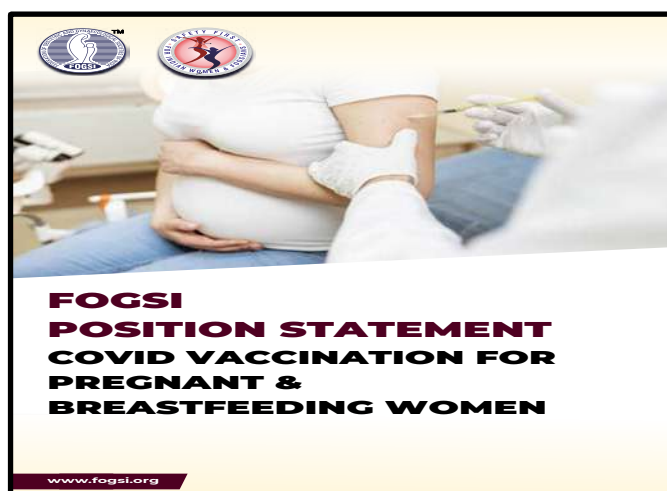
We were invited by our Hon. PM for video conferencing on 24th March. Presidents of seven medical organizations and two nursing associations were given 3-4 min to present their suggestions.

It was indeed a proud moment for FOGSI that our PM had invited us and heard FOGSI's suggestions. We presented 5 humble suggestions, which were well received. We also published these suggestions on social media for the knowledge of our members. To permit the use of telemedicine officially was one of our suggestions for the safety of our members, which was accepted by our PM.

1. We published two GCPR to guide and help our members in probably the shortest time of 9 days. The 1st GCPR was published on 26th March on Perinatal management in COVID-19 in association with NNF and IAP.
2. The 2nd GCPR was published on 28th March on Pregnancy with COVID-19 prepared by FOGSI.
3. We also released our 2nd short advisory on 28th March and sent to all by bulk SMS to use telemedicine in their practice.
4. We also prepared a GCPR on COVID 19 in SRH and Gynecology. The aim of these guidelines was to present ideal management options and some real-world experiences and alternatives. It has been lauded greatly by all our members.
5. We came out with a booklet on COVID FAQ's for sensitization and to solve the anxiety and queries of our patients and health care workers regarding COVID -19, which was also prepared in multiple local languages.
6. Webinars: We dedicated one week continuously for two years exclusively for conducting webinars daily to discuss effects and management of COVID-19 in different health issues of women and girls to update our members.
7. Task force: We started FOGSI's National Task Force for COVID-19 to guide FOGSI in its actions against COVID-19 and our members in managing their patients with COVID-19 on the national helpline number. This was meant not just for the safety of our patients, but our members, students, and staff as well.

8. National registry for COVID-19 in Pregnancy (Data collection and verification): We also started our National registry on Pregnancy with COVID-19 infection, to gather the massive data available to us on a nationwide basis. We received a very good response with more than 2700 cases, from > 60 institutes, From West, North and South. We received inputs from colleges, institutes and members across India. FIGO and PAN registry as well as Imperial college, UK has shown great interest and invited us to work with them for the World registry.
9. COVID-19 Surveys: We published an ICMR- FOGSI study on the prophylactic role of HCQ, the data of which was published in TOI. We also published a study presenting the situational analysis of private facilities of Obstetricians and Paediatricians practicing in Gujarat in context of Covid-19 pandemic. This cross-sectional study was designed with the support of UNICEF, FOGSI-SOGOG, IAP- AOPG and PSM departments of Medical Colleges of Sola, Rajkot, Vadodara and Surat.
10. Donations: Being a responsible federation and the largest federation of any medical specialty, and as per our tradition to donate generously in any national calamity, we donated nearly Rs 40 lakhs to PM cares Fund to support COVID efforts.
11. We also donated face shields and masks to medical colleges and post-graduate students across India, in an effort to support their pandemic efforts and safety.
12. Paramedical staff training: FOGSI & Safe motherhood committee had organized a Focused, Free of charge, practical training course with the help of AIIMS Delhi & WHO. It was attended by > 11000 paramedics and > 150 societies with good interaction and positive feedback.
13. Vaccination: FOGSI has, from the beginning, vociferously supported the use of COVID vaccination in pregnant and lactating women, irrespective of the stage of gestation. We have also advocated its safety and its necessity during pregnancy. It was due to our firm advocacy that the GOI later made this a nationalized policy. Because of FOGSI's efforts and advocacy, 25 million pregnant, 25 million BF women and 25 fetuses were benefited with Covid vaccination.
14. Webinar with Shri Shri Ravishankarji on Psychological aspects in COVID-19 to help our members and our patients.
15. We distributed certificates of Appreciation to CORONA Warriors in Ob-Gyn departments in medical colleges across India for their valuable efforts to treat corona patients.

Academic activities:

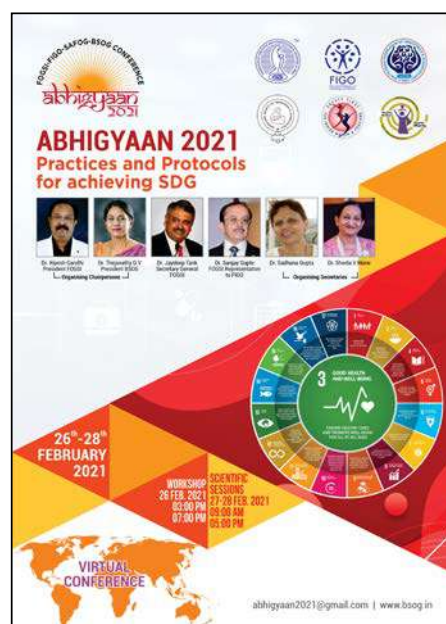
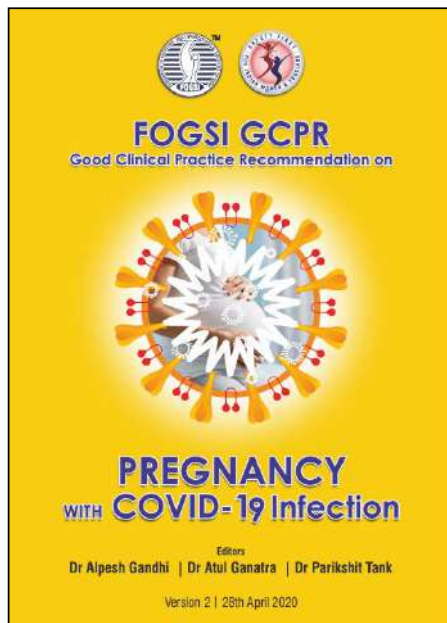
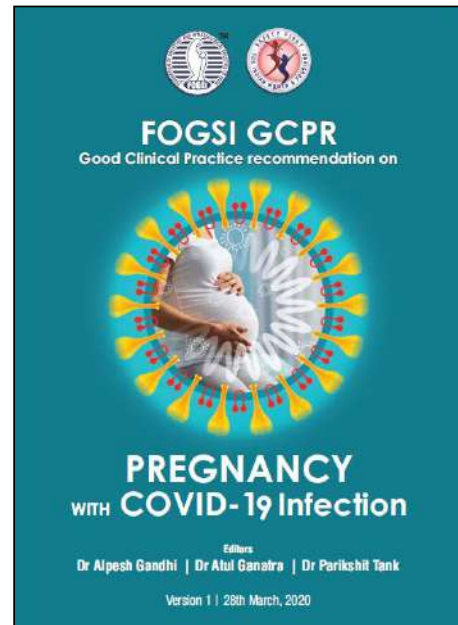
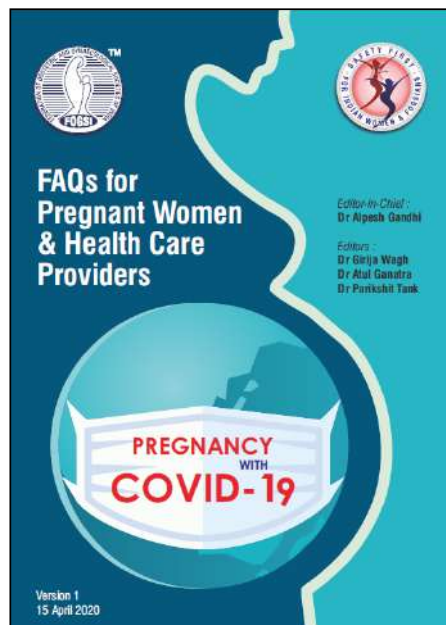
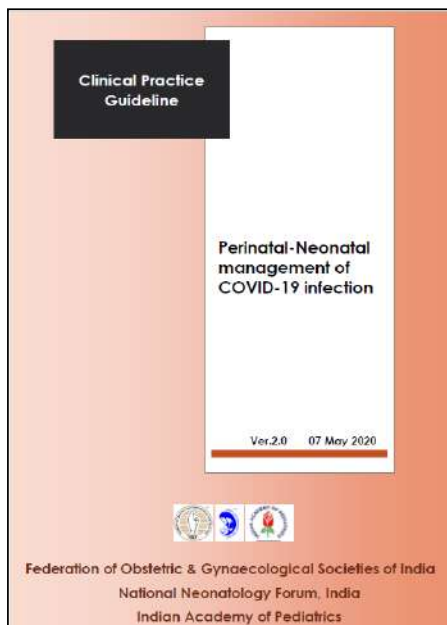
The COVID 19 pandemic attacked us full force at the beginning of the presidential term, and threatened to derail all our academic activities and programs.

Once COVID took over, it was a monumental decision taken by our team to ensure that FOGSI's commitment to academics and social activities remained intact, and the resolution was taken to shift all academic and social activities to the online platform.

Conferences:

1. **Surakshit Naritva:** It was the first physical conference of the year before Covid-19, held in New Delhi on 29th February- 1st March 2020, with 350 delegates, 53 lectures, 5 Round table meetings for joint consensus deliberations on 5 important topics, quiz and public forum with involvement of Government officials.
2. We organized a half day webcast conference of 5 hours on 26th April, Sunday on "**Ob- Gyn Update**", which was very well appreciated and attended by huge number of 5200 delegates with good interaction. We have received 647 questions.
3. **FOGSI-Gestosis-SMFM** web conference on 23rd May, on the next day of World Preeclampsia Day, for 5.5 hours attended by 3337 delegates with 498 questions.
4. FOGSI in association with International Diabetes Federation & Diabetes care foundation of India organized E-Conclave "**Academia-2020**" on 17th July.
5. FOGSI's International **Adolescent Health** E-Conference was organized on 28, 29, 30 August, 2020. B. K. Sister Shivanididi spoke on "Mental health in Adolescence". We also conducted a special workshop on mental health in adolescence as well as an oration by Prof. Pierre Andre Michaud on Developing sustainable adolescent friendly healthcare in COVID era.
6. Anemia E- Conclave was organized for the whole day, was hugely attended by 8146 Participants.
7. FOGSI celebrated World Nutrition month by organizing a conference, E-Conclave "**NutriFest -2020**" on 19-20 September, 2020.
8. Specially designed conference for ONLY PGs, exclusively for research work, presenting papers and posters with No Talks, Panel Discussions, Debates, no orations etc for 12 hours a day from Morning to Evening, first time parallel in 5 halls for two days- 10th and 11th October, 2020. Nearly 100 judges & 40 coordinators were invited, **received 1500 papers-posters**, and > 2500 attended the conference. Results of winners were declared immediately by judges as the marks were given on Google form.
9. FOGSI Organized one day Focused conference on "**Vaginal surgeries extravaganza: Tips and Tricks**" (Talks & Videos), which was attended by more than 5000 delegates.
10. FOGSI'S one day web-conference, focused conference on "**Advanced Imaging in Obstetrics**", Follow the intricacies and finesse of Imaging was organized on 8th November, Sunday, 2020 which was attended by > 3300 fogsians.
11. FOGSI organized one day conference on 1st December on WORLD AID'S DAY CONFERENCE for preventing the preventable: A way forward for HIV free generation.
12. FOGSI in association with POGS (Pune society) organized an international virtual focused unique conference from 11th to 13th December on "**Just Tumours**" with 279 national and 25 international faculties, which was attended by 6587 delegates. We have received E- Paper -113 and E- Poster – 219. AOFOG, Indian society of Oncology were the academic partners and it was endorsed by SAFOG, AMOGS, IMS, Indian society of medical and paediatric oncology and others.
13. FOGSI organized for the first time such kind of focused unique full day web conference on "**Cardio- obstetrics**" on 17th January – 2021, Sunday which was attended by 2500+ delegates. We invited multispecialty experts from different fields. There was a total of 37 faculties comprising of Gynecologists and Cardiologists. It was very well appreciated by all the delegates.
14. FOGSI and OGSSI organized "**Love to Labour**" conference from 22-24 January, 2021 to highlight the intricacies of labour and hence it would portray how to unravel various mysteries. It was a power packed scientific program with a galaxy of international and national faculties. It was inaugurated by Cochrane reviewer Dr Justus Hofmeyr and attended by 2700 delegates.
15. The FOGSI family welfare committee held a virtual conference on 23rd January, on the theme Reproductive health for women and sustainable menstruation.
16. FOGSI-ICOG organized for the first time a focused conference on "**NCD in OB-GYN**" was organized in association with MOGS from 4-7 February, 2021. We have received > 300 Papers-posters and participation from Govt of Maharashtra state. It was inaugurated by Dr Rajesh Tape, Health Minister, Maharashtra and Dr Vinod Paul, member NITI Ayog. It was a 4 Day conference, attended by > 2000 registrations and received > 300 Papers-posters.
17. FOGSI's Abhigyaan 2021 virtual international conference was a mega event in association with FOGSI, FIGO and SAFOG hosted by Bangalore Society of Obstetrics and Gynaecology conducted on 26th, 27th and 28th of February, 2021. The theme was "**Practices and Protocols for achieving SDG**". We had about 3500 delegates logging in from all over the world. Abhigyaan had many novel features- Capsules called "Short bytes - Fresh thoughts", Round Table discussions - "Dialogues across borders", "Ask the expert", Case based discussions where cases were presented by the Juniors to the Experts, FIGO plenary session and SAFOG session, "Impact of COVID 19 on maternal and perinatal health" were discussed at length as well as virtual cultural programs.





Webinars: We conducted hundreds of webinars throughout the year, with not just nationwide but even global participation from international faculties and delegates. Presenting details of only a few of them, just to enumerate, which were organized internationally or with partners are as follows.

1. FOGSI in association with Asian & Oceanic society of Regional Anaesthesia Pain Management & Association of Obstetric Anaesthesiologists- India on 30th May conducted a webinar on COVID 19: pregnancy, fetal care and obstetric anesthesia.
2. On 9th August we had an international webinar on COVID 19 in association with Bangladesh society, with a tribute to frontline warriors.
3. 5th September, on the occasion of Teachers' day, we conducted a live webinar on Preventive Obstetrics: premarital, preconceptional and early pregnancy care and counseling.
4. 12th September: webinar of Recent updates in the diagnosis of bad obstetric history.
5. The UNICEF – IIPHG webinar series was conducted with the theme: addressing safety and wellbeing of healthcare workers, and continuity of essential health services during COVID19.
6. FOGSI in association with AOFOG conducted the blood health forum series with the theme: Micronutrients and blood health: myths and challenges in Asia.
7. ICMR-NIN – FOGSI – UNICEF webinar on Maternal Thinness as part of the maternal nutrition technical E dialogues series was conducted on 29th January.
8. The MILAN workshop was conducted in association with NNF and FOGSI. We had one session for obstetricians by neonatologists, one session for neonatologists by obstetricians and one session for both by both. Workshops were organized in Telangana, Rajasthan, W. Bengal and going to continue to organize it in other states.
9. FOGSI Infertility series was conducted on Principles of daily practice of Infertility. Experts from all across India were invited as faculties. It was well appreciated.
10. FOGSI-Omniscuris organized a webinar on Clinical approach to Iron deficiency in women, which had received 4.9 stars on internet.

CSR activities:

FOGSI reaches the unreached throughout the year. Vision

was to spread FOGSI's vision & good work to community level, & each corner of India. **Vision is to educate and serve as many girls and women in India as possible on preventable health issues and public health issues and to bring Safety to Women, Neonates in India and FOGSIANS. Vision is to make FOGSI, a household name.**

1. On International women's day, 8th March-2020, we held a nationwide cervical cancer screening program for our CRPF and police personnel and their families. It gives me great pleasure to share that inspite of the short time available for preparation and the fear and uncertainty of COVID, more than 200 societies participated. We held camps at over 350 places, with enthusiastic participation from thousands of police and CRPF women. We had screened more than 40000 women across India on that day.
2. We celebrated Mothers' Day on 10th May, 2020 on a different platform. We had a 6 hours long event, based on the theme: Beti Bachao, Beti Vadhao, Beti Padhao, Beta samjhavo. We organized E-Conclave on "Women's Safety & Empowerment". It was aired on YouTube; Facebook live and through a delegate link. The total participation was a massive 41786 delegates. We had a star- studded faculty line- up including Dr. Kiran Bedi, Deepa Malik, Bollywood stars Dia Mirza and Sharman Joshi.

We held essay writing competitions on Mothers' Day and Fathers' day, which received an overwhelming response, with members young and old, pouring in their appreciation for their parents. These essays were compiled into books and published to be cherished as memoirs.

3. On World Environment Day on 5th June, FOGSI held a virtual celebration to promote awareness on conservation of the environment and for Prevention of women and future generations from ill effects of pollution on human reproduction, with eminent speakers from all over the country. **Mr. Ricky Kej**, an internationally acclaimed Grammy award winner, Music Composer, Environmentalist, UNESCO "Ambassador for Kindness" was the main faculty and attraction. FOGSI conducted competitions for FOGSI societies, Fogsians and families like drawing, E-Posters and slogans about environmental pollution, Pictures and videos of indoor and outdoor plants/trees. Tree plantation done by Fogsians was included in the prizes. More than 1000 pictures, drawings, E-Posters, videos were received.
4. We celebrated International Yoga Day on 21st June, 2020 on "**Exercise & Yoga in Pregnancy & wellness**". It was a FOGSI and Brahma Kumaris initiative. Theme was "Take care of your body. It's the only place you

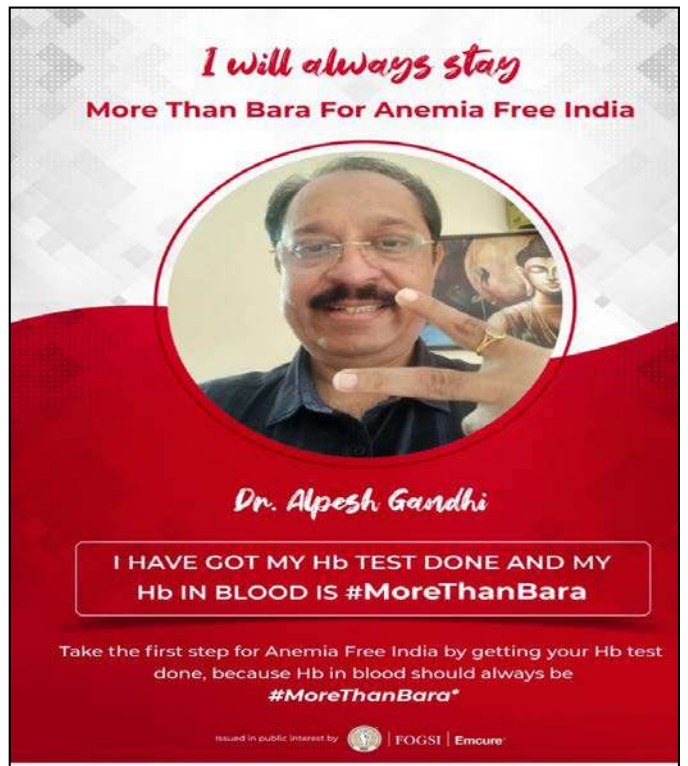


have to live in.”

5. We launched a nationwide Organ Donation pledge and drive on 1st July, Doctor's Day. Dr Harshwardhanji, Hon. Health Minister, GOI inaugurated the E-Conclave. Bollywood stars Ritesh Deshmukh and Genelia Deshmukh were the special guests. We invited numerous Super specialists, and Transplant surgeons to participate. The aim of the E conclave was to sensitize common people about the importance and necessity of organ donation. During launching 1200 people took the pledge. We received pledges from 20 different countries. The media also extensively covered the event. We distributed donor cards from ROTTO-SOTTO office, the authority in India for organ donation.
6. On 11th July, World Population stabilization day, an E- conclave was held with the theme: Safeguarding SRHR of women and girls during COVID, as well as a webinar for Solutions for Sustainable Population.
7. We celebrated International Breastfeeding Week, on 7th August, World BF Day by organizing a community connect Program, E-Conclave to sensitize mothers for the importance of Breast Feeding and to remove many Myths and false beliefs, which was viewed by a huge number of 52,100 women with great interaction.
8. On 10th August, World Youth Day, we held an E-Conclave on Preventable Adolescent Healthcare Education for adolescence and youth between 13-23 years. 1,21,000 (One Lac Twenty-one thousand+) Girls & Boys, Youth attended it, with 10000 questions and comments and 3000+ slogan-posters. This E-conclave was very well received by the media and was appreciated by our PM as well, in a personalized letter to FOGSI.
9. On 15th August, we successfully launched our campaign for an anemia free India: the “MoreThanBara” Campaign, and reached our target of one crore listeners on radio and social media followers. Famous Bollywood actress Twinkle Khanna was the brand ambassador.
10. On 6th September, FOGSI conducted a “Doctors for Clean Air” conclave with experts from varied specialties of medicine, with the theme being Health Benefits of clean air on pregnant women and the newborn.
11. FOGSI celebrated International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women on Wednesday, 25th November to Stop violence against women and doctors. We organized a one-day E-Conclave reflecting on all the corners of this social crisis. Smt. Sumitra Mahajan, the Ex. Speaker-Parliament, India, Bollywood actress Sharmila Tagore, famous cricketer Virendra Sehwag, Chairperson, Mahila Ayog, Smt. Rekha Sharma, famous R.J. Devaki and acid attack survival Laxmi – all spoke from their hearts. Laxmi's talks brought tears to eyes of many delegates. More than 21000 viewers attended the Pathbreaking one day E- Conclave. Shocking revelations, alarming statistics, Poignant victim's stories, Inspiring talks and very enlightening sessions ...all delegates sat glued to the computer the whole day!!!
12. Elimination of cervical cancer: FOGSI believes that the HPV vaccine, which is an important part of preventive oncology should be included in our national immunization program by the Government of India. We also advocated to National Medical Council of India (NMC) to make Preventive Gynaecologic Oncology clinic/facility mandatory for a permission to start a medical college in India, and dedicated one month posting of PG students to such facilities. FOGSI believes prevention and elimination of cervical cancer should be taken up on priority. FOGSI also supports WHO, GOI and FIGO call for the same.

“Cervical Cancer Free NER” Pilot project: We launched a project for Elimination of Cervical Cancer from eight states of North-East India on 7th March, 2021 to fight against preventable cancers of women and eliminate cervical cancer from India by 2030. NER has the highest incidence of cervical cancer in India.
13. We held a web conclave on the theme “safety first for our youths” in March 2021, the agenda was What is safety? How do we achieve our goal? Strategies to ensure safety for youth from cyber-crime & substance abuse? Panel discussion on youth safety. It was well attended by 1469 youths from all over India.
14. From 5th to 9th March 2021, again in honour of International Women's Day, we held screening camps and awareness drives for cervical and breast cancers across India. We received an overwhelming response, with participation from 220 societies. > 4000 members screened 10-20 women between 30-65 years, > 60000 women screened across India, > 1200 members took pledges to provide free screening, > 200 health authorities were met to hand over the FOGSI's advocacy statement, > 50 print media covered the event and received > 700 photos in the report from FOGSI societies. Red Cross and CRPF supported the event.
15. On 8th May, International Thalassemia Day, we held an E-Conclave for Anaemia and Elimination of new cases of Thalassemia from India. Different NGOS and authorities from Govt participated in the program.
16. Again during the year 2021, on International Mother's Day- 9th May, we held a community connect E-Conclave for mass education on preventive women's healthcare issues. All FOGSI Sub committees were involved and organized one session during the conclave.

Checklists:

Checklists used in the medical settings reduce errors caused by lack of information. They give a greater sense of confidence that the process is completed accurately and thoroughly. Checklists can have a significant positive impact on reducing mortality, complications, injuries and harms and improving safety.

My team has done extensive work to produce comprehensive checklists on nearly 30 routine Ob-Gyn situations that we commonly encounter as practitioners. It was prepared as an activity under FOGSI-UNICEF PCA which was appreciated by WHO and SAFOG.

Uniform Consents:

70% of ML cases are because of improper consents and counselling. We developed 30 uniform consents for common ob-gyn procedures, surgeries, interventions, prepared as per the advice of the Hon. Supreme court of India and made by our medicolegal experts and advocates. These have been uploaded on FOGSI's website for easy access. The aim of these consents is to simplify consent taking, and help in the defence of cases of medicolegal litigations. It was prepared in association with National university of Law, Maharashtra and took valuable inputs from 5-6 experts from different fields.

KAVACH: We came out with an important publication "KAVACH" -to Guide and Help Victims of Violence against women and Girls. It contains Helpline numbers of Government agencies and helping NGOs.

Guidelines for DDH screening in India:

A multidisciplinary Expert Group consisting of members of the Paediatric Orthopaedic Society of India (POSI), Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP), National Neonatology Forum of India (NNFI), Indian Radiological & Imaging Association (IRIA), Indian Federation of Ultrasound in Medicine & Biology (IFUMB), Federation of Obstetric & Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI), and Indian Orthopaedic Association (IOA) was convened and worked collaboratively to develop a list of consensus statements that were used to frame guidelines for DDH screening in India.

This guideline has been developed specifically for the Indian context, with the goal of identifying all cases of hip dislocation, instability and dysplasia before the child starts walking but ideally before 6 months of age.

Position Paper on ECD: It was prepared and released jointly by IAP-NNF-FOGSI-WHO-UNICEF.

Yearbook of Obstetrics and Gynaecology – 2020:

The Yearbook of Obstetrics and Gynaecology was published which was well appreciated by our members.

FOGSI Focus:

This year we released seven issues in a concise, easy- to- read and easy - to - practice format. The topics covered were:

- AUB
- Placental Abnormalities
- Fetal Surveillance
- Nutrition in women across ages.
- Uro-Gynaecology
- MTP
- Amenorrhoea

FAQ's: In a novel approach, we published an FAQ book exclusively by and for adolescent boys and girls and their parents, to help navigate the landmines of adolescence.

E journal: As a part of FOGSI's go- green initiative, we released the first ever e-journal flipbook in 2020. It saves paper, money and resources. The journal has achieved many new landmarks during the year including maximum downloading.

Advocacy statements: FOGSI has done a lot of advocacy work strongly and effectively during the year for the community, authorities, media, and Government. FOGSI has prepared and published following advocacy statements and sent it to Government of India and many state authorities:

1. Importance, Rational use and Availability of Blood components
2. Role of steroids in Preterm delivery
3. Need of Preventable adolescent healthcare education and dedicated Adolescent health clinics.
4. Elimination of Preventable cervical cancer from India
5. Role of MgSO₄ in preterm delivery
6. Importance of the 1st 1000 days in life
7. Role of Parenteral Iron in anaemia in Obstetrics

Surveys: FOGSI conducted following surveys and received opinions of our members on:

1. Age for Marriage (for boys and girls) and Pregnancy in India.
2. Effects of COVID -19 on our Professional and Personal life.
3. Violence against Women and Girls
4. Violence against Doctors
5. COVID Vaccine

Curriculum

Textbook for Ob-Gyn for PGs: It was our objective to compile a detailed textbook, that would comprehensively, yet in a concise manner, cover all the topics with the latest scientific evidences for a PG student. We achieved this goal with the publishing of our FOGSI Textbook, with 2 Volumes, 8 sections, a Total of 209 Chapters, an Editorial board of 10 Editors and complete with questions, ppts and MCQ.

LOC and Log book for UG: The newly formed NMC has published a list of competencies to be included for UG and PG curriculum for colleges. To bring uniformity in UG curriculum, for the first time, FOGSI took the lead to prepare Learning objectives of these competencies and sent it to many medical colleges and NMC. FOGSI also came out with the log-book for the UG curriculum.

PG Forum: Activities:

Another project close to my heart during this tenure was the creation of a PG Forum. Its aim was to provide a common Platform to PGs across India, to help them with their overall development and safety. We had a theme in mind that included these 5 modules:

- Updated PGs (education, training, research)
- United PGs (Promote brotherhood)
- Respected PGs (Respectful residency)
- Insured PGs (Providing insurance at less premium)
- Groomed PGs (Grooming for Dressing, Behaviour, Public relation, Stress free life, Safety arts, health & Wellbeing, Future scopes)

Over 7000 PGs joined the forum from all across India. All PGs activities were conducted under one FORUM on one platform. These included:

- PG's webinars
- PG Force program by Medical Education committee
- PG's online journal club meetings by ICOG
- PG's Research activities- Papers, Posters, Conferences, articles, studies
- PG's e. journal
- PG's Quiz
- PG's non-academic programs

Two PG online research webinars were conducted in September, and were a great success with more than 1000 PG's in attendance. The faculty consisted of peer reviewers of Cochrane and other editorial journals, and were able to guide the students in a very effective way.

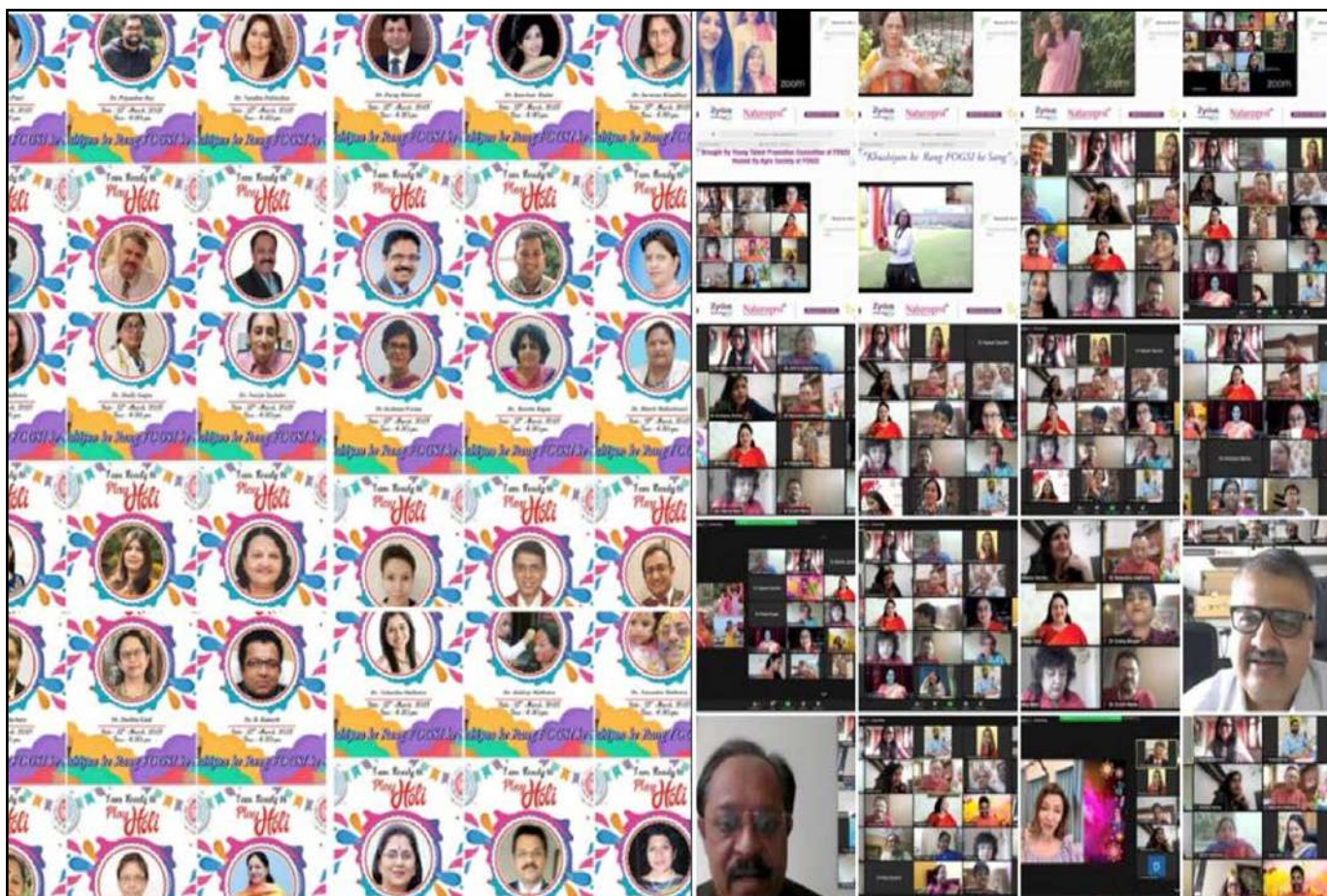
Members wellbeing activities

Insurance: On Doctor's Day. FOGSI has launched a new scheme of Doctors Professional Indemnity Insurance with the Least possible Premium and maximum extra benefits to all its members. The scheme is well received by our members and within a year nearly 3000 members have joined the scheme.

Social security scheme: We proposed an amendment to the already existing SSS. So far, the funds are given to the family on the death of the member enrolled. In the amendment, the funds can be given either to the family on the death of a member or to a member on his/her permanent disability, and the choice will be given to a member as per his/her wish. It was passed in the SSS MCM and FOGSI MCM.

Festival Celebrations: We celebrated Holi as "Khushiyon ke rang FOGSI ke sang" and Diwali with our families. There was very encouraging participation from our members.

Helpline number: In 2020, we launched 2 emergency helpline numbers, one for COVID – 8879448888 and another, a medicolegal helpline number - 8879338888. The aim of this was to provide free immediate advice by ML experts for our members at any time throughout the year for medicolegal crisis.



Digital FOGSI:

FOGSI App: We started FOGSI's App on android and Apple. It is an easily downloaded App Providing quick access to fogsians for FOGSI's website including FOGSI's GCPRs, FOGSI's Algorithms, FOGSI's Check lists, FOGSI's Uniform consents, Counselling videos, Talks of FOGSI's conferences, FOGSI's calendar and many more such useful issues.

Legal work: Review petition for the PCPNDT decision: We decided to file a review petition against the judgement of PC-PNDT case. We have discussed this with legal advisors and also in PC-PNDT Cell meeting.

1. FOGSI shall pursue the PCPNDT matter further at Supreme Court.
2. Review petition at Supreme court shall be made as the next step to review the judgment passed.
3. In due course of time multiple Writs will be made by FOGSI members affected by the PCPNDT act. This shall be then supported by Curative and or Special leave petition to the Supreme Court for getting the due amendments.

Manyata: We promised to take this project forward, by making it easily accessible across India, affordable for all practitioners and more effective for better obstetric outcomes. Manyata grew from 3 states to 14 states in 2020-21, 475 new facilities registered, 399 + certified facilities, 382+ virtual assessments done in lockdown, 51+ LaQshaya Manyata certified with Govt of Maharashtra so far in 2021.

FOGSI Sub-committee Nomenclature: We proposed and passed the following as speciality increases in our field and as per the latest development, we need to increase the number of committees.

1. To merge HIV committee into sexual medicine committee and changed its name to Sexual medicine and STDs committee.
2. To start one new committee with the name of Vaginal surgeries committee.
3. To Change the name of Uro-Gynaecology committee to Uro-Gynaecology and Pelvic floor committee.
4. To start NCD and Environmental Health committee.

5. This will apply when the tenure of present committee will be completed and the new committee on NCD will be stated from the next election.

Partnership:

FOGSI believes in partnership! And with this in mind, we have joined hands with numerous organizations for the betterment of women in India.

FOGSI- USAID MOU: USAID and FOGSI signed an MOU for the first time to jointly work together on priority health issues like:

- Unmet need of Contraception
- Promoting Adolescent and Youth Friendly Services
- Adolescent Helpline number
- Effects of steroids in Premature delivery

FOGSI- FIGO MOU: We made an MOU with FIGO. It was on **PPH Bundle approach in U.P.** FOGSI appointed and supported the position of a Society Liaison Officer (SLO) in U.P. to carry out the activities outlined in the agreed activity plan. We worked alongside MGIMS, UPTSU and FIGO in the implementation of the PPH project.

FOGSI- UNICEF PCA: This UNICEF-FOGSI partnership aimed to leverage to support advocacy, access to information, health care provider capacity building, data and knowledge management and client tracking to ensure essential lifesaving service continuity for mothers and newborn during the national COVID 19 containment response. It was coordinated between UNICEF and implementing partner FOGSI working together with MOHFW, State NHMs, District Chief Medical Officers and health facility management and staff. State and District levels project implementation was coordinated between UNICEF State Offices and FOGSI experts.

This was our first collaboration with UNICEF. Such a project was being undertaken by FOGSI for the first time in public hospitals. It was a rather ambitious Project, to be implemented nationwide in 50 UNICEF supported aspirational and priority districts in Total 256 LaQshya facilities/FRUs/District Hospitals/Medical colleges in 23 UNICEF programming states. Under the project, we could target and reached 160 facilities across India. Its purpose was handholding and mentoring through national and local FOGSI experts to sustain quality of obstetric care in health facilities with respect and dignity. Overall expected impact was to reduce and mitigate the potential direct or indirect impact of COVID 19 on maternal and newborn mortality in India, to achieve LaQshya certifications for the facilities and to promote Obstetric HDUs/OICUs.

FOGSI - ACOG partnership: This was created with the special aim of tele-mentoring of the postgraduate students to help them gain varied experiences and expertise.

FOGSI- GOI MOU: This was created for National TB Elimination Program to address TB among Pregnancy and Infertility patients in India. The activities as part of the collaboration included:

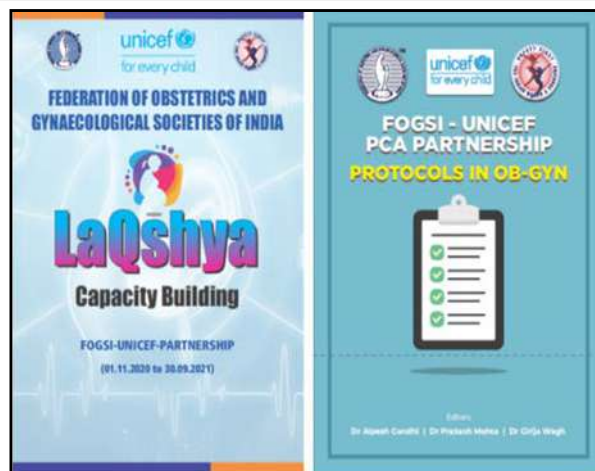
- a. Development of training materials on TB among pregnant women and infertility
- b. Conducting Continued Medical Education activities
- c. Developing and disseminating Information Education and Communication materials through various modes including websites
- d. Publication of articles on TB in pregnancy in journals and conducting related sessions in conferences

FOGSI, FOGSI safe motherhood committee-USAID partnership: The VISTRIT project was launched in January 2021. The pilot project was in Jharkhand with the aim of strengthening quality antenatal care in anaemia and GDM. 33 faculties were enrolled; 44 Doctors and 225 Healthcare workers Trained.

FOGSI & Safe motherhood committee, WHO & AIIMS-Delhi: FOGSI had organized a Focused, Free of charge, practical training course with the help of AIIMS Delhi & WHO. It was attended by > 11000 paramedics and > 150 societies with good interaction and positive feedback.

Bihar SANKALP initiative: It was a collaboration of FWC FOGSI, PFI, ARC and Bihar Government for family welfare work in Bihar.

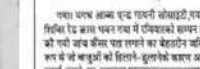

The conference conduct committee: Looking to the challenging uncertain situation and health crisis of the century, the committee suggested to...

1. Postpone AICOG 2021 till the end of June or July 1st week
2. Changeover of FOGSI office bearers will be done in June end or in the 1st week of July
3. Changeover from Dr. Shantakumari to Dr. Hrishikesh Pai after Oct 15, 2022.
4. Next AICOG -2022 planned at Kolkata will be organized in the 1st week of December.
5. Everybody at the meeting were unanimous on these decisions.

Elections: During COVID times, we started E- voting for the very first time in any election campaign. We successfully completed the ICOG election by e. voting.

This time, we received a huge response and voting has increased to nearly 73% from 43% for ICOG elections. We also had the highest ever voting (>90%) for the election of committee chairpersons, and for the VP election of FOGSI. In a landmark shift, we have now chosen to continue this method of election permanently.

President's future project: It was presented, discussed and passed in the MCM that President Dr Alpesh Gandhi will work on his vision for quality and safe RMNCH+A in India for minimum next 3 years for Assessment, Assurance and Accreditation of Preconceptional care and counselling clinic, High risk pregnancy clinics/facilities and Adolescence friendly healthcare clinic. It will be a National Quality & Safety Assurance Initiative for Women's Healthcare as President's Project for next 3 years: this was a new initiative launched to provide comprehensive guidance and support for quality and safety assurance through a structured conformity training, mentoring and assessment model that utilizes a quality and safety improvement approach by accrediting quality obstetric health care facilities.

Proud moments/achievements:

1. We were invited by our Hon. PM for video conferencing on 24th March 2020 to present our suggestions with regards to COVID 19. It was indeed a proud moment for FOGSI that our PM had invited us and heard FOGSI's suggestions. We presented 5 suggestions which were well received.
2. In celebration of Mothers' Day, we held a virtual walkathon, the first of its kind. Due to enthusiastic participation of our FOGSI members, we completed a total of 4.9 million steps, thus bringing FOGSI's first entry in the India book of records for **MAXIMUM PEOPLE PERFORMING INDOOR WALK TOGETHER AT OWN PLACES.**
3. **FOGSI in Parliament:** FOGSI's name was referred as the expert professional organization in the parliament by Hon. Health Minister Shri. Harshvardhan for the amendment of the MTP act.
4. **Anaemia Mukht Bharat:** FOGSI has been appreciated and awarded for its vision, efforts and activities and was awarded for Anaemia Mukht Bharat by IHW Council, India. We could reach more than one crore citizens of India on Radio.
5. **FOGSI's advocacy for COVID vaccination to Pregnant and Lactating women in India:** It has received support from other organizations and media. Our advocacy was successful and GOI has included Pregnant women and BF women in the list of beneficiaries for COVID vaccination which was initially denied by the manufacturing companies and authorities.
6. Implementation of our suggestions for testing criteria and others for COVID in pregnancy by the ICMR
7. COLLECTION OF GOOD NUMBER OF CASES IN FOGSI REGISTRY.
8. FOGSI could form partnerships with many organizations for the first time which has opened a new era and scope of effective working for FOGSI.
9. GREAT ACADEMICS INCLUDING TEXTBOOK AND CURRICULUM
10. Reach of our community connect programmes to the larger masses in all the corners of India and electronic and print media.
11. MEMBERS' SAFETY MEASURES INCLUDING INDEMNITY INSURANCE, ML HELPLINE AND CONSENTS.
12. MANY 1ST and MAXIMUM IN DIFFICULT AND CHALLENGING TIME OF COVID -19
13. Recognition by our colleges & PG forum activities and international recognition & programs.

FROM THE DESK OF SECRETARY GENERAL

“You are not the darkness you endured. You are the light that refused to surrender.” — John Mark Green.

We have lived through a tumultuous time and as we dust ourselves off, pick up the pieces and move on scarred but undiminished, with resolve and purpose, it is with sobering thoughts and a quiet pride in our beloved FOGSI that I bring you this report.

Building on the success of the previous two years as Secretary General with several landmarks ISO accreditation, a sophisticated electronic members database which hands control of their own data to the members, e voting, streamlining the constitution, to name just a few, we rushed into the year with the tailwind of an enormously successful AICOG at Lucknow. Little did we know that humanity was to plunge into one of the great challenges it would face, a once in a lifetime pandemic with COVID.

Dr. Jaydeep Tank was happy to put on record that the Charity Commissioner has taken on record and attached to the schedule of our properties. Our property is on the 2nd Floor. The managing Committee was told about the formation of the society and the procedure which is being followed for getting our share certificate and the transfer of the billing for our electricity from the builders who had managing property till now to the society and individualize billing with Tata Power.

The office had to close due to the Lockdown. Given the uncertainties about the situation, we decided that Work from Home was to be the sine quo non for the foreseeable future and tried our best to make it work for FOGSI. We hired a logistics company to move the computers of the office to the home of each of the staff so that the staff did not have to travel to collect the computers. The staff adapted remarkably well to the vagaries of working from home and if FOGSI could function efficiently and remain prolific and productive, it was thanks to this dedicated band of heroines and heroes of FOGSI - Sangeeta, Kanchan, Varsha, Neelima, Hema, Deepti, Arati, Maria, Prakash Gurav, Prakash Bomble, Satyawar, Suryakant, Poonam, Prasad, Shubhada, Poonam, Sonam cannot be thanked enough.

We adapted very quickly to the virtual medium and what seemed to be the “new normal”. A surfeit of Webinars left

WhatsApp groups and email inboxes flooded with flyers and I also believe kept us busy enough to take our minds off the COVID crisis for some time at least. The amount of academia in FOGSI was perhaps the highest in terms of CME and conference hours ever.

Some excellent initiatives included a FAQ on Pregnancy with COVID-19, an online course on COVID 19 infection, FOGSI QUIZ on COVID-19 infection, Helpline number for COVID-19 Management and a National registry on Pregnancy with COVID-19 infection.

Meanwhile in the best spirit of giving and solidarity FOGSI contributed a whopping INR 40,11,111 to the PM Cares Fund. The money was raised by a unique financial model where members contributed INR 15,21,283 and FOGSI contributed 24,89,828. It is notable that the entire exercise was commenced and completed in less than two months.

FOGSI further sourced and distributed 100 N 95 masks and 20 face shields to 118 medical colleges across the country as a small gesture of acknowledgement for the magnificent efforts of our frontline workers.

Soon enough it was time for the FOGSI Managing Committee. The uncertainty meant that the MCM could not be held in April as is the norm. It was decided that the MCM should take place in June. Prudence mandated that the meeting be conducted virtually which led to the organisation of the first ever Virtual Cell meetings and Managing Committee meetings! Several innovations were added to leverage technology and balance the need to run the meeting smoothly and make it participatory without being disruptive. Some of the innovations we made were using the participants list to take the roll call, using chat for audience interaction, reading out each comment in the chat section (amounted to over 1000 messages in every meeting), using breakout rooms for the cell meetings, and several others. The meetings were very well attended and attendance was steady through the entire duration of the long meetings. I daresay the meetings had a much larger and steady attendance compared to the in person meetings. Several meetings were held besides

the official meetings and our ability to adapt to this virtual medium was remarkable.

We moved toward rationalizing and making it easier to organize conferences with FOGSI. The solution arrived at was a structure (excluding AICOG's) which made a transition from percentage based sharing to a flat amount as revenue share. A lot of work went into looking at an analysis of revenue over the last decade, projecting revenue, accounting for inflation and ease of accounting for the Federation and the committee.

Our Societies and their Presidents, Secretaries, committees and our members must be congratulated for their contribution of subscription to FOGSI despite COVID which resulted in the highest ever number of eligible voters for an election in FOGSI's history.

The 2020 office bearers election saw 8475 votes cast which was the highest ever number of votes cast in an election without a Presidential election. For such election - where there was no election for President - the average number of votes which was cast earlier was 5544. The ICOG election had a total number of 1675 approved voters with 1220 votes cast a never before high percentage of voting at 72.83%. The Chairpersons election saw absolutely stunning voting with 94.35% votes cast. This unprecedented voting percentage speaks to the enthusiasm and the wisdom of the managing committee to participate in such large numbers. 94.35 % by any standard is quite remarkable.

FOGSI signed a MOU with USAID one of the first association of professionals to sign an MOU with the largest sovereign aid agency in the world. We also rolled out a unique and well received indemnity insurance scheme in partnership with ICICI Lombard and CoverYou.

Tough Decisions were taken to reshape the FOGSI terms and postpone and dissociate the AICOG's from the FOGSI terms. The decisions have proven to be beneficial to the Federation.

Finally, this is my last report as an administrative office of the Federation. In the end I would like to leave by sharing some lessons learnt and principles followed during the many years I served FOGSI - Make implementable rules - easy to make, easy to follow, Respect - We are all FOGSI, Occasional conflict between our members and rules or policy should always be resolved in favour of our members, Always see the other perspective, Words and Language are important. Be Impeccable with your word, Narrative, Narrative, Narrative are the three most important words to influence policy and the way we practice modern Ob Gyn, The absence of evidence is not the evidence of absence, Dont make assumptions, The universe has no obligation to make sense to you, Do or do not, there is no try.

Greetings!!

Amongst the various organizations of medical speciality, FOGSI has always remained in forefront in innovation. FOGSI has always appreciated, acknowledged and accepted the innovative suggestions of all the FOGSIans. It is with this collective and inclusive approach, we are able to stand tall amongst our peers. FOGSI has stepped into the digital age several years back and now has ventured forward with several digital initiatives.

The FOGSI website: <https://www.fogsi.org>

Web literally means a "Net". The website virtually brings the community in one net, one web. The World Wide Web ("WWW" or the "Web") is a global information medium which users can read and write via computers connected to the Internet. Google's search engine now one of the most visited sites on the internet was an effort to put some order in to the Web. As Tim Berners Lee, the founder of the World Wide Web put it so concisely "Web users ultimately want to get a data quickly and easily."

The FOGSI website has undergone a comprehensive redesign so that the web users can get a data quickly and easily. The new design seeks to embrace the cutting edge of Web Graphic Design and I am very happy to report that besides the actual coding most of the design has been done by us. Our website is testimony of innovation and dynamism. We have channelized all the suggestions and criticism and the result is obvious. Our website is very much user friendly. We have tried our best to evolve website which is easy to understand and operate. Our members who are not very much tech savvy and who do not have much time to browse our website, are also happy to acknowledge the simplicity of our website. Our main focus is to reduce scrolls on the pages. The lack of scrolling means the content is extremely focused, and the hierarchy of content is clearly established.

We have also introduced Responsive Web Design to re-paginate the content to suit the device being used to view it. The fluid grid allows the content to react to smaller / larger browser windows. Therefore, we could make the website Flat, Responsive and Small. The Responsive Web Design responds to user's behaviour and an environment based on screen size, platform and orientation. The practice consists of a mix of a flexible grids and layouts, images and an intelligent use & CSS media queries. Enough rooms on the edges of the article and background, let your eyes breathe.

Navigation is fluid and context sensitive with the number of clicks being reduced to minimum with the use of hovering to change the content below the menu as you move from icon to icon. e.g. in the page where the office bearers are listed hovering over the office bearers brings up the contact details. We also have a static top menu which remains in

place as you scroll through a page allowing you to have navigation options from anywhere in the page rather than going back to the top of the page every time you need to go to another page. We also now have a dynamic homepage. This year in homepage we have incorporated TOG's, FOGSI Quiz, videos of academic interest like operative laparoscopic surgeries, the President's message videos from 2017 onwards and updated photo gallery with AICOG photographs since 2009 which gives few pictures of all events. There are some dead links on the page for features we will introduce as the website develops.

We have also tried to incorporate "delightful design" into the website. As an example when you hover over the menu above and below the dynamic scroll you will notice that the dot below the text gets magnified to show your place on the page easily. You will also notice the colours of the placeholder dots are saffron, white and green to represent our national flag.

We have introduced Google translate built in to the website which will allow users from all over the world to access the website in their native language. Currently we have the languages from the countries where the Analytic data shows we have the heaviest use from besides English.

In last year, the website hosted 1,65,988 users with 2,96,779 sessions and 11,20,451 page views.

We can be contacted directly from the website simply by filling a form on the home page itself. We have formed a Website Committee. We have also in place a Website Advisory Board consisting of FOGSI members, FOGSI partners and International advisors. We have also put in place an editorial process for the website.

The office:

The office is moving rapidly towards automation of various tasks ranging from the simple like backing up data to complex tasks like the membership management system. The office has invested in state of art IT infrastructure and is making the most of it resulting in greater efficiency and fewer redundancies.

Last year we have introduced Outlook : FOGSI.ORG EMAIL which is easy to operate and have merged with Gmail.

FOGSI has started a new app. Dr. Aswath started working on this app during his VP post under Presidential year of Dr. Nandita Palshetkar. It was launched in this year under the Presidentship of Dr.Alpesh Gandhi. Fogsi.org and FOGSI App are complementary to each other. This App is available on Play Store Google, Android and Apple as well.

The SMS Software continues to prove its utility with messages being used to reach out to our members. The SMS system is built on the database of our members. We have put in place SMS policies and policies to protect member's data. Any conference which is in partnership with FOGSI can send SMS's to our members at no cost for the conference through the office.We are also using no cost SMS policy for important information and with release of each issue of the journal with the link so that members can access directly complete information/ abstract/ full article from their smart phones. From January' 2020 to June'20221 we have sent a total 1,32,61,990 SMS to our members.

Membership Management System

FOGSI is Federation of societies and as such relies on its societies for the data of its members. Although a large majority of the data is good, there are significant gaps in the data which cause a lag in communication. We have therefore developed a cloudbased membership management system. We have empowered our members with the ability to view their data and change it subject to verification using OTP's for verifying the mobile number and email. This year with Membership Management System, we could conduct first ever e voting successfully without invalid votes.

Quality Assurance meeting

The LaQshya program covers over 2400 high delivery load public health facilities across the country. 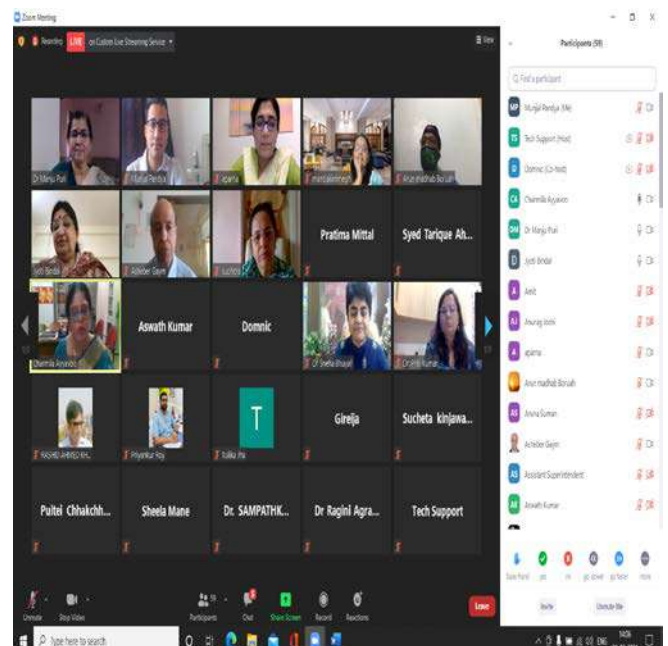
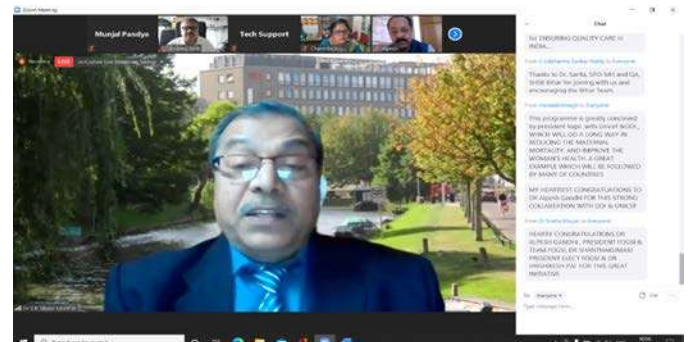
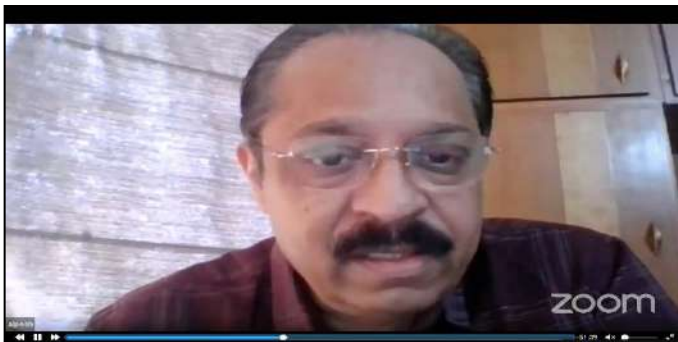
Role of FOGSI: A team was formed with 27 core team members for technical work & 2 for coordination work. Each core team member was supported by state coordinators. The

FOGSI ICOG National Conference on NCD was held between Feb 4-7, 2021 with Mumbai Ob-Gyn Society which was 1st virtual conference in the history of ICOG & FOGSI. Dr. Alpesh Gandhi, President FOGSI, Dr. Mandakini Megh, Chairperson ICOG and Dr. Rishma Dhillon Pai were the Conference Organizers. It was mega conference successfully conducted & attended by more than 3500 members with 400 national & international faculties. It was endorsed by FIGO, SAFOG, AICC RCOG, World NCD Federation, MWIA, AMWI and Govt. of Maharashtra. It has given 20 ICOG credit points and 4 MMC points. There were two main halls named as Dr. C S Dawn & Dr. C L Jhaveri halls and beautiful layout of the virtual conference made by Onference Team. The message from President of FOGSI Dr. Alpesh Gandhi, Chairperson of ICOG, & President of Mumbai Dr. Rishma Dhillon Pai played continuously.
