Aarogya Yog Yatra: Puri

Following the huge success of transformative Arogya Yog Yatra at Tirupathi and Rishikesh, the third pioneering project, among the various other innovative projects of our Dynamic and Visionary President Dr Sunita Tandulwadkar, was initiated at Orissa, across 8 medical colleges of Orissa, on 19th and 20th March 2025. This event, which is the brainchild of Dr Sunita Tandulwadkar, was organised by the Association of Obstetrics and Gynaecological societies of Orissa and in collaboration with UNICEF. Continuing the year long campaign of integrating spirituality with medicine, the event also focussed on two important initiatives of 'Know your numbers' and 'Sampoorna: Swastha Janma Abhiyan'.

The event started off with a CME with the Obs and Gynae specialists in Bhubaneshwar, where our President Dr Sunita Tandulwadkar, highlighted the importance of how medicine and spirituality can intersect in many way , influencing patient care, healing and the overall approach to health and well being. Know Your JOGI Editor In Chief: Dr Sujata Dalvi



Dr Sujata Dalvi is Editor in Chief of 'The Journal of Obstetrics & Gynaecology of India' (JOGI) Her degrees are MD, DGO, FCPS, FICOG

She is from city of Mumbai and was installed as an Editor in Chief of JOGI on January 08, 2025, at the Managing Committee of FOGSI (Federation of Obstetrics & Gynaecology of India) during 67th AICOG (All India Congress of Obstetrics & Gynaecology) at Jio Convention Centre, Mumbai.

Dr Sujata was born to School Teacher's parents on 14th March – Mother Mrs Ramaben and Father Mr Ratilal Patel in the state of Gujarat. She is the eldest of the three siblings. She did her schooling from

Fellowship High School, August Kranti Marg in Mumbai. She was excellent in her studies and got National Scholarship. She joined Jai Hind College, Churchgate for 2 years and then secured admission at Seth G S Medical College, KEM Hospital, Parel, Mumbai in 1977. She got distinction in 2 subjects at UG level. Dr Sujata did her Post graduation in Obstetrics & Gynaecology from KEM Hospital, Mumbai and completed MD in October 1985.

She joined as a Lecturer (Assistant Professor) in January 1987, at Rajawadi Hospital, BYL Nair Medical College for 4 months then was transferred to KEM Hospital. In January 1991, she was promoted as an Associate Professor through MPSC interview and selection and became Unit Chief at KEM Hospital in May 1992. She is recognised Teacher for UG – PG at Mumbai University and had been examiner for UG / PG at various Universities. She has rich teaching experience of many years. She then resigned as an Associate Professor in March 1995 to start private practice.

She is Honorary Clinical Associate at Nowrosjee Wadia Hospital, Mumbai. She is Consultant Obstetrician & Gynaecologist at Glen Eagles, Saifee, Bhatia and St Elizabeth's Hospitals, Mumbai. She superannuated from JagJivan Ram western railway hospital as an Honorary. Her fields of interest being High Risk Obstetrics, preventive oncology, Gynaecological vaginal surgery, Endoscopic surgery, family planning and can handle Emergencies efficiently.

Dr Sujata became Life Member of Mumbai Obstetrics & Gynaecology society (MOGS) in 1984. She was co-opted as Managing committee member of MOGS in 1995 & 2005 and from 2007 onwards, she was elected as managing committee member of MOGS till 2020. She was elected as an Office Bearer of MOGS from 2021 and currently holds the position of Treasurer of MOGS.

Dr Sujata was Treasurer, Joint secretary and Secretary of Association of Maharashtra Obstetrics & Gynaecological Societies (AMOGS) from 2018 till 2024. Currently she is Zonal co Ordinator for AMOGS.

Dr Sujata is President of Mumbai Menopause Society and was Treasurer of 67 th AICOG held in Mumbai in January 2025.

Dr Sujata was selected (interview) and appointed as Joint Secretary of JOGI in January 2012. Since then, going up the ladder on the editorial side of JOGI from Second Joint Assistant Editor, she was installed as an Editor in Chief (EIC) in January 2025 at

67th AICOG held at Jio convention centre in Mumbai. 

SWASTHA NARI ABHIYAAN YATRA: A HISTORIC JOURNEY FROM KASHMIR TO KANYAKUMARI FOR WOMEN'S HEALTH

A FOGSI Presidential Initiative led by Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar Breast and cervical cancer continue to be the leading causes of cancer-related deaths among Indian women. Despite being largely preventable and treatable through early detection, lack of awareness and access to timely healthcare still claim thousands of lives each year. In response to this urgent national concern, the Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI) proudly launches the Swastha Nari Abhiyaan Yatra—a transformative campaign traveling across the length of India, from Kashmir to Kanyakumari, aimed at revolutionizing women's health awareness.

Spearheaded by Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar, President, FOGSI 2025, this ambitious yatra unites healthcare providers, community leaders, and the public in a nationwide movement to combat breast and cervical cancer through education, empowerment, and preventive care.

The initiative is led by Dr. Charulata Bapaye, Chairperson of the Breast & Puerperal Health Committee, with Dr. Vinita Singh as Convenor and the unwavering support of Dr. Ashwini Kale, Joint Secretary, FOGSI.

Key Objectives of the Yatra:

- Raise Awareness: Educate women on self-examination, the significance of early detection, and the need for regular screenings.
- Promote Preventive Healthcare: Advocate for HPV vaccination and healthy lifestyle changes to minimize cancer risks.
- Encourage Screening: Emphasize the importance of breast and cervical cancer screening for early diagnosis and better outcomes.

The Swastha Nari Abhiyaan Yatra will include Awareness Walks in 10 key cities, each accompanied by CME (Continuing Medical Education) programs for gynecologists, focusing on the latest advancements in cancer prevention and care.

The journey was flagged off in Kashmir on April 4, 2025, during the National Conference, by Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar in the presence of FOGSI stalwarts—Dr. Narendra Malhotra, Dr. Jaideep Malhotra, Dr. P.K. Shah, Dr. Suchitra Pandit, and President-Elect Dr. Bhaskar Pal. Also gracing the occasion were Dr. Masuma Syed Rizvi and Dr. Samiya Mufti, President and Secretary of the Srinagar Obstetric and Gynecological Society. Dr. Tandulwadkar emphasized the critical importance of early diagnosis and patient education in achieving her broader vision of 'Sampoorna Arogya'—complete wellness for every woman. Dr. Charulata Bapaye highlighted the role of gynecologists as the first touchpoint in women's health, underlining the need to stay updated on new diagnostic and treatment modalities. A huge collective effort towards understanding the science of HPV was also launched today, after which 100 CME in various societies of INDIA would be conducted to create awareness against HPV under DO TEEKE ZINDAGI KE.

The launch concluded with all participants pledging their commitment to a cancer-free future for Indian women.







- It was my sheer fortune to have Dr. M. C patel as honorary secretary (a legendary leader).



Women's day interview of Prof Jane Conry

What inspired you to pursue a career in Obstetrics and Gynecology, and how did you decide to specialize in this field?

I am a biologist at heart, and any facet of biology fascinates me. I initially completed my doctorate in biology, studying tundra ecology in Colorado USA and the Canadian arctic. I was teaching biology at the University of Colorado, and realized that medicine would be a very rewarding career. I had TWO small children while in medical school—so I said I would NEVER go into OBGYN! I needed a sensible family life. Well, then I did my 6 week rotation in OBGYN and decided that field was absolutely the best for me. I loved the obstetrics, the intimate part of a woman's life. I loved surgery, and I loved primary care. I realized here was a specialty that appealed in so many ways....and have never doubted it was the right choice for me.

Can you share some of the challenges you faced as a woman entering a predominantly male-dominated field, and how did you overcome them?

My challenges were similar to what many women face when balancing children and a career. I remember that when my son tripped at daycare while I was in medical school and broke his leg, the first orthopedic surgeon we consulted told me I needed to stay home with him for six full weeks if I wanted him to heal properly and lead a good life. I had strong family support and wonderful children. There were sexist remarks in surgery, but I just brushed them off. I actually found my main professors to be extremely supportive of both my career and my family. I believe the best strategy is to surround yourself with like-minded individuals who will provide support.

Can you share one of the most rewarding experiences you've had in your career as an OB-GYN?

I know that becoming the President of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and then President of the International Federation of Gynecology and Obstetrics. For both of these I had an agenda--to take USA and then globally: Improve the health and wellbeing of women across their lifespan; reduce maternal morbidity and mortality.

How do you maintain your passion and motivation for the work you do, even during the tough times?

What a great question because there are always problems that can interfere---I would say almost ALWAYS

they are related to personnel--behavior of another that is not ethical, is selfish, does not have the best interests of the organization (like FIGO or ACOG) or an individual is being self-centered. In the most difficult times it has always been the people I work with --those who are self-sacrificing, and devoted to a patient's well being or looking at what is best for the organization. Those individuals have kept my spirits up!

What accomplishments in your career as a woman in OB-GYN are you most proud of?

If you had asked me that as an "IN MY LIFE" question I would have said my wonderful son and daughter. They have been my purpose in life. In my career, I would say it is advocating for the health and well-being of women. Women always put everyone else first--and whether it is my patient, or a goal I put forth for an organization, it is to follow that North star and place the well-being of women first and foremost. I have done that in my medical career--always advocating for better patient care, and in my medical organizations, looking at how to improve women's health. I am very proud to have led the Women's Preventive Services Initiative for the US government and been instrumental in bringing that same work to FIGO. I am also very dedicated to the environmental work of P2i Preconception to Infancy--so that we remove exposures of environmental toxicants from our lives.

How do you advocate for women's health and rights in your daily practice, and what do you believe is most important for improving women's healthcare overall?

I think our most important role is to empower women so that they can advocate for their needs. Education is the key, and in our daily practice, we can educate women about preventive health care, contraception, healthy choices---and most importantly, educate women to take time for themselves. We have had paternalistic societies that determine what women should do, think, how to marry, if and when to have children. Helping women to advocate for their needs, their desires, and their wellbeing is critical.




