I look forward to yet another exciting quarter with ADHUNA's champion voices, launch of our social media handles and intense field level engagement to ensure the best care for mothers and newborn.



Focus this quarter











- ➤ The day began early morning with an educational session on the CPD-1 topics including EMOTIVE, IV FCM and health communication for the DCs delivered by the State Coordinators, GHS and PEU.
- Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar, FOGSI President and Dr. Bhaskar Pal, President Elect, though could not join in person, welcomed the participants and shared their thoughts over a video message.
- ➢ Once all the ADHUNA partners arrived, we began with a keynote address by Dr. Anchita Patil where she provided the background and context to the design of this project engaging the private health sector in improving maternal and neonatal health outcomes. She welcomed the district team while also providing a background to the selection of innovations and the complementary work by the partners supporting this grant.
- ➤ This was followed by an overview of the project milestones and ongoing activities by the ADHUNA Project Director Dr Jaydeep Tank and the launch of our online CPD modules that are now available on ADHUNA's YouTube channel
- Dr. Sushanta Banerjee, Chief Technical Officer from IDF provided their experience and learnings from engaging with private health facilities, including challenges and potential solutions, providing valuable insights for the District Coordinators for their field work.

- ➤ Suchi Mahajan, Vice President, GHS briefed on the communication and advocacy activities in the year, including the engagement with ADHUNA Champions, preparation of the social media calendar and plans for the collaboration hub that will bring together medical practitioners.
- ▶ Dr. Meenakshi Jain, Director at FRHS provided a thorough understanding of the approach to the baseline study that is underway in the project districts; the plan for field visits and support required from the district coordinators.
- ➤ Sattva Consulting has been supporting the PEU in grant deliverables and Lakshmi Sethuraman, Partner, covered the approaches adopted by the team for effective coordination between project partners, governance structures in place and dashboards in use for project progress tracking.
- ➤ The **district coordinators** then took the stage to introduce themselves and each one highlighted their field experiences so far in onboarding private health facilities and consistent support from doctors.

- ➤ The State Coordinators, Dr Meena Samant (Bihar), Dr. Jyoti Bunglowala (MP), Dr. Jayashree Pattnaik, Dr. Hara Prasad Pattnaik, and Dr. Bhagyalakshmi Nayak (Odisha) provided their experience with ADHUNA CPDs and district level engagement thus far. Their continuous support to the district coordinators has helped with successful onboarding in these states.
- ➤ The second half of the day was spent on break out discussions between the partners and district coordinators on facility onboarding, baseline study support and field advocacy activities to be conducted.
- ➤ We also used this opportunity to showcase modified designs of calibrated drapes for blood collection that were on display by select manufacturers. Feedback on design, usage, disposal and pricing were collated. These will be commercially available very soon.

With this event we were able to forge connects between the coordinators, state representatives and partners for smooth operations and collective efforts towards achievement of project milestones.



Continuous Professional Development (CPD) in 9 districts across 2 states

As Project ADHUNA deepens its engagement with the private healthcare sector, the Continuing Professional Development (CPD) program continues to serve as a critical touchpoint to disseminate the innovations and evidence-based practices in intrapartum and newborn care among doctors and nurses in our target districts.

This quarter, the CPDs expanded their geographic footprint across Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh. In April, CPDs were held in Jabalpur, Indore, Ujjain, and Bhopal (MP) and in Lucknow (UP). In May, the momentum continued in Bulandshahr, Aligarh, and Mathura, followed by Prayagraj (UP), that was conducted in the month of June.

CPD Preparatory work

Prior to the program, custom-designed invites and E-MOTIVE stickers are sent to local FOGSI members via India Post—complemented by targeted WhatsApp invites to increase visibility and attendance.

Drawing from the pool of ADHUNA Trainers, each CPD had 2-3 external faculty members that covered the sessions on:

- IV FCM for managing anemia in pregnancy
- WHO endorsed E-MOTIVE bundle for evidence-based postpartum hemorrhage management
- Health communication (conducted by GHS)
- Panel discussion on quality of care and best clinical practices

As part of the training, all participants received supplementary reading materials, including a comprehensive booklet featuring the *Guidance Note on IV Iron* including *Labour Care Guide*. designed to support clinical practice and include two filled-in samples to demonstrate proper usage.

Our monitoring partner FRHS was able to collate feedback on the CPDs from the participants, and also conducted a quick knowledge at the end of each session. We also use this forum to onboard the doctors and their health facilities to ADHUNA, to continue receiving learning material, get access to social media support and online modules.





After the CPDs, the doctors and paramedic staff received their certificates, and were requested to join Project ADHUNA and now continue to receive information and support for improving maternal health outcomes by embedding innovations and evidence-based interventions in their practice. "Onboarding" to ADHUNA is a structured process where doctors fill out a form mentioning the details of their health facility such as delivery load and staffing, and consent to participate in the project. Once onboarded, the particular health facility is covered by the district coordinator during their periodic visits and provided support in a number of ways. The figure above mentions the nature of support provided. Our district coordinators are working hard to onboard the required number of facilities and from April to early July 1100+ have been added. The support from our the ADHUNA State Coordinators and local society President and Secretary has catalysed this effort. The ADHUNA PEU is constantly by the FOGSI President, Dr Sunita Tandulwadkar and the ADHUNA Project Director, Dr Jaydeep Tank. We would not have achieved this momentum without constant encouragement from the FOGSI Office Bearers and ADHUNA Champions.



Nature of support provided to health facilities onboarded to ADHUNA

While onboarding is voluntary, very limited number of facilities have not consented to be part of ADHUNA, primarily if their delivery load is minimal or if the doctors are senior in age and not very active in their clinics / hospitals.

Other than onboarding facilities, our district coordinators are meeting doctors to share the EMOTIVE sticker that is being displayed in their Labour Room wall for ready reference if PPH occurs. In addition, they encourage the facility staff to follow the Labour Care Guide (LCG) during labour.



Updates from Partners



Advancing Quality of Care in Private Health Facilities: select findings

Ipas Development Foundation (IDF) engaged with 62 private health facilities across UP, Bihar, MP and Odisha. The initiative generated valuable insights on various aspects of Quality of Care (QoC), including intrapartum care, collaboration mechanisms, and quality improvement practices. Some of these were:

- Most facilities acknowledged QoC as a core component of healthcare delivery, emphasizing the importance of respectful and comprehensive care, timely and evidence-based treatment, regular training, and acknowledging patient feedback.
- In the area of intrapartum care, clinical judgment and prompt decision-making were seen as critical.
- ➤ Facilities also recognized the potential role of professional bodies such as FOGSI and IMA in strengthening delivery care through Continuing Medical Education (CMEs), policy advocacy, and promoting the use of quality improvement (QI) practices, including clinical protocols and evidence-based care.
- Overall, private sector facilities demonstrated an awareness of their responsibilities and a commitment to providing equitable care, while also acknowledging internal challenges in consistently delivering quality services. The

Other studies

IDF has also initiated a landscaping exercise to understand the Quality of RMNCH services in **PM-JAY empaneled facilities.** The initiative aims to assess the quality of RMNCH services, comprehend the empanelment process and its benefits, and document good practices. The findings will be crucial in developing strategies for improving maternal and newborn health services under the ADHUNA project.

Additionally, IDF is analysing different categories of private health facilities with high potential to improve RMNCH service delivery. This will support the ADHUNA project to focus on collaboration and partnerships with facilities that have high potential to improve RMNCH outcomes.





Update on monitoring, evaluation and learning (MEL) activities under ADHUNA

As the MEL partner for the ADHUNA project, FRHS has focused this quarter on initiating a baseline assessment to understand current maternal health practices and facility-level emergency preparedness across project states. This baseline activity was tailored to ensure that the ADHUNA's interventions are responsive to the needs and reality of health providers and facilities.

The first phase of the baseline assessment was successfully launched in Bihar. The FRHS team conducted field visits in five out of the twenty-nine districts selected for intervention. During this initial round, a total of 45 facilities were covered. These visits involved structured interviews with doctors and nursing staff, along with a facility checklist capturing current service practices, infrastructure, and areas for support and training.

The assessment focuses on key components of the ADHUNA project such as intrapartum QoC, anemia management using IV FCM, postpartum hemorrhage management through the E-MOTIVE approach, prematurity, postpartum family planning, and respectful maternity care. The aim is to understand existing practices and systems, so that support activities can be aligned with facility needs.

CPD monitoring activities have also been carried out side by side. Monitoring was shared in real time on the ADHUNA dashboard. Both qualitative and quantitative participant feedback, along with post activity assessment scores has been analyzed and reported.

In the coming weeks, FRHS will continue interviews with doctors and other facility staff across the remaining states. Preliminary findings will be analyzed to inform implementation strategy and provide timely feedback to project partners.





Ongoing Advocacy and Communication

Global Health Strategies (GHS), the communications and advocacy partner for Project ADHUNA, continues to strengthen the project's visibility and champion engagement efforts across its four implementation states. From April to June 2025, GHS supported a range of efforts, including capacity building exercises, creation of social media content for dissemination, introducing the champion voices network, and convening structured dialogues around the project's focus interventions. Collectively, these efforts aimed to amplify maternal health innovations.

Strengthening capacities through CPDs

As part of the Continuing Professional Development (CPD) series, GHS led the health communication coaching sessions across nine focus geographies – Lucknow, Aligarh, Bulandshahr, Mathura, Prayagraj (Uttar Pradesh); Indore, Jabalpur, Ujjain, Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh) covering content in Hindi and English for over 1200+ clinicians and paramedics Bilingual press releases (Hindi and English) were developed and disseminated after each CPD in the respective geographies, highlighting Project ADHUNA's efforts and vision.





Strengthening capacity through CPDs

Social Media Support to FOGSI Members

During April and May, ~25 social collaterals media were developed and disseminated for significant health observances. These included World Health Day (April 7th), National Safe Motherhood Day (April 11th), International Day of Families (May 15th), and the International Day of Action for Women's Health (May 28th), distributed the **FOGSI** through and ADHUNA networks.

Ongoing Advocacy and Communication

Distributed through the FOGSI and ADHUNA networks, these materials spotlighted the need for interventions such as:

- IV-FCM for treating moderate to severe anaemia in pregnancy and postpartum: Emphasizing effective treatment protocols for maternal anaemia.
- The E-MOTIVE protocol for managing postpartum haemorrhage (PPH): Promoting life-saving interventions for a leading cause of maternal mortality.
- Newer contraceptives (DMPA-SC, subdermal implants): Advocating for informed reproductive health choices.
- The urgency of anaemia screening and treatment: Stressing the importance of early detection and management of this prevalent condition.

Guidance on media engagement to the ADHUNA PEU

Additionally, GHS conducted two briefing discussions with the PEU and Sattva team — one to provide guidance on media engagement, covering essential aspects such as, messaging consistency, and engagement strategies, and another to introduce the Champions Tracker, a matrix developed to track collaborations and dissemination activities with influential individuals, including the champion voices.

ADHUNA Champion Network Activated

Following the Training of Trainers in January, GHS collaborated with the PEU to connect with and onboard key FOGSI spokespersons, introducing the Champion Voices Network. This initiative aims to equip the group with a strong social media messaging strategy to advance the project's goals. In early June, an inaugural call brought together nearly 40 Champions, providing them with an orientation on their role in building awareness and urgency around scaling of select maternal health innovations.

Concurrently, the social media cadence calendar was updated to include content through December 2025. This was to ensure timely and well-planned content was ready to be shared across ADHUNA's channels routinely and during key calendar days.

Thought Leadership at the World Health Summit

In April, GHS convened a panel discussion at the World Health Summit – Regional Meeting, featuring experts from Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW), Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College (JNMC), and FOGSI leadership.

Thought Leadership at the World Health Summit

The session explored pathways to scale evidence-based innovations like the E-MOTIVE bundle and IV-FCM. GHS managed end-to-end speaker coordination, developed communications materials, and executed social media promotion to maximize the visibility and uptake of the session's insights. Additionally, GHS facilitated the participation of Dr. Jaydeep Tank and Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar in related discussions on anaemia and maternal health.

What's coming up in the next quarter:

- Development of IEC materials on focus areas, that can be distributed to and used by clinics across focus geographies
- Whitepaper Launch: Finalize and publish the fetal monitoring whitepaper and plan for its dissemination.
- **Champion Engagement**: Collaborate with the champion voices to effectively share project materials and messages across social media and within their networks.
- **State-level Stakeholder Engagement**: Meetings with state, district, and city-level stakeholders and thought leaders to widen the dissemination of project focus interventions.
- **Collaboration Hub**: Conceptualizing the establishment of a multi-stakeholder engagement platform, to encourage collaboration and dissemination on focus areas.

Looking ahead

ADHUNA is moving from strength to strength and this is evident in the plethora of activities that are taking place on the ground, in coordination with all the ADHUNA partners and spearheaded by the district coordinators. CPD-1 has been completed almost everywhere, with the exception of Ghaziabad that will be held in early August. However, the learning continues with the online CPD modules on YouTube for anyone to revisit the sessions on EMOTIVE, IV FCM and health communication.

The next few months will see a lot more momentum and activities across the districts with the baseline survey, engagement of health facilities by our district coordinators and planning for CPD-2 that will focus on managing prematurity and essential newborn care, encompassing some compelling innovations and evidence-based practices that can prevent prematurity and innovations in care for the sick newborn.

ADHUNAs social media handles will also be launched and we urge you to follow these and actively engage in spreading the messages in your networks. We look forward to coming back with more milestones and achievements in the next few months.
