Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar, President FOGSI had organised a very unique program as a part of Aarogya Yog Yatra to Shrinathji at Nathdwara, Rajasthan also known as Shreeji ki Haveli near Udaipur from 27th to 29th June 2025. There were 12 of us FOGSIANS who flew in from different parts of India to Udaipur including Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar Dr. Rajesh Tandulwadkar and their son Rishi with his wife Ms Lekha Nirmal ,Mr. Maheshji and wife Poonam Nirmal . Nirmalji devout follower of Shrinathji and does Sewa

The Shrinathji Temple in Nathdwara, is a prominent Hindu temple dedicated to Shrinathji, a form of Lord Krishna, and is a major pilgrimage site for followers of the Pushti Marg sect. The temple is known for its rich history, spiritual significance, and the black marble idol of Shrinathji with a diamond encrusted on the chin. This is the seven year old form of Lord Krishna that is said to be self-manifested. It is the 'Bala Swarup of Lord Krishna' when he had lifted the Govardhan hill.

As decided by Dr.Sunita Tandulwadkar, Dr.Prakash



Jain , Dr. Pradeep and Dr. Mahesh had organised a special darshan, the Uthapan at 3.30pm and the Bhog Arti at 500pm. We also had darshan of the sweet Laddu Gopal who is being kept cool by the water showers. The Shrinathji temple also has the Sudarshan Chakra atop its shikhara along with seven Dhwajas (flags) representing the seven houses of the Pushtimarg sect of Vaishnavism. This chakra is a symbol of divine protection and is highly revered. We also saw the various rooms where bhog is prepared for the Lord ..the Doodghar, Paanghar ,Mishrighar, Phoolghar, Rasghar, the chakki,the baithak and the Gahnaghar. The Sewaks were dressed in traditional attire with a smile on their faces and this added to a positive atmosphere. We all moved together within the temple hearing the stories told by Ms.Poonamji and the Sewaks and feeling truly blessed after the darshan.

We then went to the famous shop at the entrance of the temple ,which housed some of the most beautiful Picchhwai paintings of Lord Shrinathji on cloth, walls ,paper and marble . Here the Udaipur team felicitated Dr.Sunita Tandulwadkar and all of us with a pagree and a stole , gave the famous Shrinathji Khaja which is the prasad along with delicious mint ginger flavoured Udaipur tea in earthen kulhads .

We returned to our Ananta Resort and after dinner retired to our rooms for the next day meet . The Progestin meet at the Aravali hall in the resort was a superb learning organised by FOGSI supported by Mankind Pharma. The meeting started off by an address from who Dr.Sunita Tandulwadkar

Moderators were Dr. Suchitra Pandit and Dr. Apurba Dutta who then invited experts to discuss various aspects of Progesterone and Role of Dydrogesterone in various OBGYN condition like Lutel phase support by Dr. Ashish Kale, Managment of Recurrent Pregnancy Loss by Dr.Poonam Goyal, Threatened abortion by Dr.Suchitra Pandit, Endometriosis by Dr. Apurba Datta Heavy Menstrual Bleeding by Dr.Komal Chavan. We had a very good interactive sessions, polling on questions using the mentimeter and some important take home messages were given. Dr. Sunita gave the concluding remarks and suggested that the important aspects discussed should be made ready in the form a booklet which will be of value for our Fellow FOGSIANS.

Post lunch we visited the Mankind factory at Dakan Kotra an hour's drive from Ananta resort. It is a state of art facility which focuses on production of the Dydrogesterone. It is the only Indian company manufacturing the active pharmaceutical ingredient in India. Indeed we had a guided tour and it was fascinating to understand the intricate details of how it is manufactured and how rigorous quality control is maintained. Feeling proud of the Make in India product we returned to our resort enjoying the landscape, conversation with our colleagues and a little local shopping added on to our return journey. A great feast awaited us at the Aravali Hall at Ananta Resort. An entertainment program with local Rajasthani singers and Folk dances were

amazing to watch. The 'Kesariya song with Padharo mara Desh' is still ringing in my years. In the end all of us partcipated in the dance with Rajasthani ladies and than had a sumptuos dinner and the day ended beautifully.

Comprehensive Women's Health Initiative – "SAMPOORNA"

Organized by: FOGSI in association with CIFF & JHpiego Date: 18th June 2025 at Marriot New Delhi



Overview:

The Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI), in collaboration with the Children's Investment Fund Foundation (CIFF) and JHpiego, convened a significant event of "Sampoorna" – A Comprehensive Women's Health initiative. The initiative focused on key health priorities for women and aims to strengthen care for women starting preconceptionally

A Landmark Leadership Summit:

For the first time, a summit of this nature brought together FOGSI leaders (past and present), government officials, and key implementing partners such as UNICEF, UNFPA, PATH, and USAID, ICMR on a shared platform.

The gathering marked a major step in recognizing and promoting preconception care as a standard of care for women in India.

The sessions addressed:

- The current gaps and barriers in delivering preconception services
- Policy and implementation challenges
- The importance of integrating preconception care

into existing maternal and reproductive health services

Practical, scalable approaches for rolling out interventions at community and facility levels

Key Attendees:

The Sampoorna framework is built upon four key pillars critical to improving women's health outcomes:

1. Preconception Care and Nutrition

- Focused on improving women's health before pregnancy through screening, education, and nutritional support.
- Encouraged inclusion of BMI management, anemia prevention, chronic disease checks, and lifestyle modifications as routine practices.
- Highlighted the importance of early intervention for better maternal and fetal outcomes.

2. Contraception

- Stressed the need for expanding access to contraceptive options, especially among young women and in underserved areas.
- Emphasized postpartum and post-abortion contraceptive counseling, rights-based approaches, and strengthening provider training.

3. Heavy Menstrual Bleeding (HMB)

- Brought attention to HMB as a commonly overlooked yet serious issue.
- Experts called for standardized diagnosis, treatment algorithms, and community awareness.
- Urged clinicians to normalize discussions around menstrual health and provide timely solutions.

4. Anaemia

- Identified as a persistent public health issue affecting women at every stage.
- Recommended comprehensive measures includ-



ing supplementation, dietary counseling, deworming, and menstrual hygiene support.

 Advocated for including anaemia screening as part of routine gynecologic and preconception care.

Highlights and Reception:

- The summit was widely appreciated for its practical relevance and clear direction.
- Speakers provided actionable insights and helped build consensus across different sectors for coordinated implementation.

Way Forward:

- FOGSI and its partners will take forward the "Sampoorna" initiative by:
- Developing training modules for healthcare providers
- Embedding these pillars into national health programs
- Strengthening monitoring systems to track progress
- Collaborating with government agencies and civil society for sustained action

Conclusion:

This summit represents a turning point in women's health programming in India. By focusing on priority areas such as preconception care, contraception, menstrual health, and anemia, the "Sampoorna" initiative sets a clear agenda to improve the quality of care and outcomes for women.

The collaborative approach and shared commitment of stakeholders signal a strong momentum toward achieving this goal.

FOGSI's IBR Record-Breaking Pledge on Safe Motherhood Day - A Historic Milestone in Maternal Health Advocacy

This landmark initiative was the vision and tireless endeavour of FOGSI President Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar. whose unwavering passion for maternal health and deep-rooted belief in collective action transformed an idea into a historic movement. Her dynamic leadership and dedication to every mother's wellbeing galvanized thousands across the nation to rise for a shared cause— Safe Motherhood for All. It is her commitment and clarity of purpose that laid the foundation for this national pledge, uniting the medical community in a momentous affirmation of responsibility.

In an inspiring testament to its continued advocacy for maternal health, the Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI) etched its name in history by setting a new India Book of Records (IBR) benchmark on Safe Motherhood Day - 11th April 2025. On this nationally significant day, 11,347 doctors from across the country came together in a solemn and spirited pledge to protect, promote, and prioritize the health, dignity, and rights of every mother. This phenomenal response was more than a numerical feat—it was a movement, a unified declaration of purpose, and a nationwide call to action, echoing from remote health centres to India's premier tertiary hospitals.

Each participating doctor reaffirmed their professional and moral commitment to ensuring safe pregnancies, respectful birthing experiences, and comprehensive postnatal care. The magnitude of this collective vow sent a powerful and resounding message:

Motherhood should never be a risk, but a right safeguarded by compassion, competence, and care. Recognizing this extraordinary accomplishment, the India Book of Records formally conferred its prestigious honour upon FOGSI. This moment of pride was further immortalized on 18th June, when Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar was presented with a medal and certificate to her and to FOGSI and to chairperson of Safe Motherhood committee Dr Poonam Goyal a symbol of not just a record, but a revolution in mindset and mission.

This is a shining emblem of FOGSI's enduring promise to Safe Motherhood.

The record is written in ink, but the impact is etched in hearts.

With each pledge taken, a life stands stronger. As long as life begins through motherhood, FOGSI will remain its fiercest guardian—with skill, with strength, and with soul.

on Adolescent Health & Well-being



A NATIONAL COMMITMENT BY INDIA'S PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS

Released on 12th July 2025 during the Silver Jubilee Zonal Conclave on Adolescent Health, organized by the Indian Academy of Pediatrics, in association with the IAP Adolescent Health Academy, and held during a panel discussion technically supported by UNICEF and the State Adolescent Health Resource Centre, Andhra Pradesh, AIIMS Mangalagiri, at Hyderabad.

This declaration is an outcome of a collaborative initiative envisioned and coordinated under the leadership of the Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP) through its Adolescent Health Academy. - ☑ Encourage our members to volunteer on the 18th of every month for Youth Wellness Day Activities at nearby anganwadi centres, schools, colleges, universities, Adolescent Friendly Health Clinics (AFHCs), etc.
- Focus on priority areas for adolescent health such as Reproductive & Sexual Health (including sexual wellness, teenage pregnancies & HIV/ RTI/ STI), Immunization, Preconception Wellness, Metabolic Wellness & Prevention of Non Communicable Diseases, Mental Health & Phychosocial Well-being, Digital Wellness, Road Safety, etc in line with attached annexure.

- Encourage healthcare facilities/institutions associated with us to undertake adolescent wellbeing activities such as Dedicated Adolescent Health and Wellness Clinic/OPD, expanding OPD/IPD services of existing pediatric departments – upto 18 years with focus on multi disciplinary care involving OBGN, PSM, psychiatry, skin etc.
- ✓ Establish Adolescent Health Resource Centres in Medical colleges in collaboration with State Governments.
- ✓ Promote Research, Documentation & Evidence Based Practices: Initiate and support research initiatives aimed at strengthening adolescent health interventions. Include articles/special Blogs/write-ups on adolescent health & development in official journals. Develop annual reports/newsletters on evidence best practices/activities undertaken and share with all stakeholders. Advocate for Adolescent Health & Development at Annual Conferences.
- ☑ Collaborate for Action: Collaborate for action on this joint declaration with all government and non-government partners involved and strive for adolescent health & Well-being. Nominate one nodal officer who will be responsible for implementation and coordination of the declaration for the coming 3 years, after which the declaration may be revisited.

Regenerative Wellness — From Lifespan to Health-span in Women

Introduction

Regenerative wellness is an integrative philosophy that supports the body's own

repair programs before disease takes root. It weaves together four evidence-based threads:

Pillar	Purpose	Typical Interventions
Foundational lifestyle	Provide the metabolic milieu in which tissues can regenerate efficiently	Mediterranean-style nutrition, structured movement, restorative sleep, mindfulness
Targeted IV therapies	Rapidly replete cofactors that decline with age or heavy metabolic demand	High-dose vitamin C & E, glutathione, CoQ10, NAD+, amino-acid blends
Biologic Deliver autologous or minimally-manipulated signals that jump-start local healing		Platelet-rich plasma (PRP), micro- fragmented adipose tissue, mesenchymal stem/stromal cells (MSCs), exosomes
Digital Track biologic age and guide habits with real-time feedback		Al-enabled wearables and blood-based "age clocks"

Unlike regenerative medicine, which also embraces gene-editing, 3-D bioprinting, and other frontier technologies, regenerative wellness emphasises accessible, clinic-ready strategies that dovetail with daily life. Those deeper laboratory advances exist—and are exciting—but fall outside the scope of this article.



1. Reproductive & Fertility Health

Late-age child-planning now collides with a natural decline in oocyte quantity and quality. Intra-ovarian PRP delivers a burst of platelet growth factors that appear to re-awaken dormant follicles; a 2024 systematic review documented higher antral-follicle counts and improved embryo euploidy in women with diminished ovarian reserve after a single PRP session . Early-phase work with umbilical-cord MSCs and their exosomes is exploring similar follicular benefits while avoiding ovarian hyperstimulation.

IV & lifestyle boosters

- **CoQ10**, **vitamins C/E** A 2024 Oxford review of RCTs found CoQ10 pre-treatment increased mature oocyte yield and live-birth rates in IVF cycles .
- Moderate resistance-plus-aerobic training elevates systemic IGF-1, a myokine cross-talk mediator that supports granulosa-cell metabolism.
- Stress-reduction practices (yoga, pranayama) lower cortisol, the enemy of luteal progesterone.

2. Regenerative Wellness for Menopause

Ovarian oestrogen drop-off drives visceral fat gain, bone loss and vascular ageing. Clinics now blend wellness PRP (vaginal, vulvar or intra-ovarian) with small autologous adipose-derived MSC doses to restore local trophic signalling and relieve genito-urinary syndrome.

Lifestyle cornerstones

- Green-Mediterranean diet from the 18-month DIRECT-PLUS RCT slowed the epigenetic clock by ~9 months, most strikingly in post-menopausal women .
- High-intensity resistance & impact training (HiRIT) preserved trabecular bone and boosted lean mass in a 12-month perimenopausal protocol.
- Night-time hot-flash spikes are blunted by evening magnesium-glycinate IV "pushes" combined with paced breathing.

3. Autoimmune Balance

Women account for ~80 % of autoimmune cases. Intravenous or intra-articular MSC infusions tame Th1/Th17 cytokine storms and expand T-reg populations; a February 2025 meta-analysis of 21 RCTs confirmed durable remission across lupus, rheumatoid arthritis and systemic sclerosis with excellent safety.

Adjuncts

- Hyper-sialylated IVIg can synergise with MSCs, down-regulating Fc-receptor-mediated inflammation in refractory disease .
- A polyphenol-rich Mediterranean plate correlated with 29 % lower incident RA in a 350 000-woman cohort.
- Guided cold-plunge therapy transiently boosts IL-10 and may lengthen time-to-relapse when paired with

immunomodulatory cells.

4. Pelvic-Floor Regeneration

Urinary leakage and prolapse stem from levator-ani micro-tears. A 2024 single-blind RCT showed 68 % composite success at six months after one mid-urethral PRP injection versus 18 % with saline. Micro-dosed exosomes are entering trials to reinforce collagen cross-linking.

Movement medicine

Structured pelvic-floor muscle training for 16 weeks reduced levator-hiatus area and improved continence in a postpartum randomised trial. Bio-feedback apps now gamify daily Kegel adherence.

5. Cardiovascular Resilience

Oestrogen loss accelerates endothelial senescence. Small autologous **bone-marrow MSC or CD34**+ **endothelial progenitor cell (EPC)** infusions have been granted FDA fast-track designation for refractory angina and are already available in research clinics.

Exercise as biologic conditioner – A February 2025 study demonstrated that 12 weeks of endurance-plus-HIIT mobilised EPCs via neuregulin-1 signalling, boosting peri-infarct capillary density and lifting LVEF in post-MI women. IV chelation for heavy-metal load and combined vitamin C/N-acetylcysteine drips are sometimes added for oxidative stress buffering, though large trials are under way.

6. Brain & Nerve Vitality

Allogeneic iPSC-derived dopaminergic progenitors have crossed the safety threshold in Kyoto's Phase I/II Parkinson's trial, but wellness-geared programs rely first on MSC-secretome nasal sprays and exosome-rich PRP for neuro-support.

Key adjuncts

- 500 mg NAD+ IV tripled whole-blood NAD+ and produced acute executive-function gains in a 2024 double-blind pilot.
- ullet Deep slow-wave sleep drives norepinephrine-coupled vasomotion that pumps cerebro-spinal fluid through the glymphatic "brain-wash" system, clearing eta-amyloid and tau
- Rhythmic aerobic exercise raises BDNF, synergising with cell-derived factors.

7. Chronic Pain & Disability

Degenerative osteoarthritis leads the disability charts. A March 2025 meta-analysis of 18 RCTs confirmed that intra-articular MSC injections improved WOMAC pain and function with no major adverse events . Conditioned-media hydrogels and low-level-laser-



primed exosomes are extending cartilage resilience. **Metabolic priming**

A 24-hour fast \rightarrow nutrient-dense re-feed doubled intestinal stem-cell proliferation in mice—but also raised early tumour risk, underscoring the need for clinician supervision when employing fasting as a regenerative stimulus

8. Digital Optimisation

Al-enabled wearables are shifting regenerative wellness from episodic visits to continuous coaching. Real-time biological-age algorithms parse heart-rate-variability, sleep architecture and activity data to flag early drift from homeostasis, allowing micro-course corrections long before lab markers worsen. Some clinics now integrate wearable dashboards directly with IV-therapy dosing and PRP scheduling.

9. Challenges & Practical Guard-Rails

Variability in cell preparations, limited longitudinal data, cost, and equitable access remain hurdles. International task forces are converging on potency assays for PRP and MSCs, while regulatory bodies tighten labelling for exosome products. Patients should seek centres that document outcomes in registries and follow ISO-class clean-room protocols.

Future Outlook

As databases grow and AI refines patient-matching, off-the-shelf MSC-exosome lyophilisates, personalised IV nutrient stacks, and adaptive wearables could make regenerative wellness routine primary care. Gene editing, bioprinting, and organoid transplantation are still ahead—but foundational lifestyle, IV nutrition, PRP and stem-cell biologics are already extending women's health-span today.


