### "Know Your Numbers" is an ambitious health initiative promoting Health Literacy and Management in Women across India.

This project aims to collect essential health data including weight, blood pressure, blood sugar levels (with HbA1C), and haemoglobin levels—from women across India. By emphasising these crucial health indicators, the project strives to cultivate a culture of proactive health literacy management among women. The gathered data will play a vital role in the early detection of common health issues and in promoting interventions that can significantly reduce the risk of chronic diseases. This initiative not only highlights the importance of regular health monitoring but also empowers women with the knowledge and resources necessary to take control of their health, ensuring they lead longer, healthier lives. The goals are to collect essential health data, including weight, blood pressure, blood sugar (HbA1C), and haemoglobin levels, from women across India, encourage proactive health management among them, identify common health issues promptly and advocate for timely interventions

and empower women with knowledge and resources for healthier, longer lives








Do Teeke Zindagi Ke – CERVICAL CANCER VACCINATION












### Inaugural "PACE" program, 2025

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
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## FOGSI ANUBANDH WITH UP, MADHYAPRADESH CHATTISGARH AND RAJASTHAN



### SAFE MOTHERHOOD COMMITTEE REPORT

FOGSI Annual Summary: January 2024 – May 2025 Presented by: Dr. Poonam Goyal, Chairperson, SMC-FOGSI

I have had the honour of serving FOGSI as the Chairperson of the Safe Motherhood Committee from January 2024 till present. During this period, I have had the privilege of working under the visionary leadership of, Dr. Jaydeep Tank and Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar. I extend my heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Jaydeep Tank Sir for his time-to-time guidance, invaluable tips and Dr. Sunita Tandulwadkar Madam for giving me the freedom and encouragement to lead, innovate, and collaborate across multiple verticals of maternal health. My deep thanks to FOGSI Office Bearers for their unwavering support. Acknowledgement is also due to my dynamic team of executive members and experts who have passionately contributed to the SMC's endeavours. True to its mandate, the Safe Motherhood Committee has focused on enhancing maternal care, addressing regional disparities, and amplifying public and professional education on maternal health and safety. Our programs have spanned diverse geographies and addressed varied population needs—from grassroots community training to high-level academic deliberations—unified by one purpose: to ensure dignified, respectful, and safe care for every mother.

The year 2024 began with renewed energy as we launched a series of online programs like ODOT-One Day One Topic, SHIELD Series (Safeguarding Health in Every Labour Delivery) and E-Clinical Grand Rounds for PG training. There were regular webinars on different

maternal health-related topics.

Online Programs: Throughout the year in 2024, SMC embraced digital platforms to deliver high-impact webinars on crucial maternal health themes. Kicking off with a session on PPH: A Bundle Approach in collaboration with Ludhiana Society. A well-attended webinar on RPL in partnership with the Society of Fetal Medicine. In March, a session on Cervical Cancer Screening and HPV Vaccination marked International Women's Day. June brought a powerful discussion on The Maternal Near Miss, led by senior faculty. July featured focused webinars on the Surgical Checklist in the Previous CS and GDM Management. In August and September, we addressed Antepartum Haemorrhage, Hypertensive Disorders of Pregnancy and PPROM, combining real-world case analysis with clinical protocols. Each session underscored our commitment to capacity building and timely knowledge dissemination.

Workshops: The Safe Motherhood Committee actively organized a series of hands-on and hybrid workshops aimed at strengthening obstetric clinical skills across India. These included focused training on managing PPH at Lala Ded Hospital, Srinagar, and a PPH drill workshop in Sewagram in collaboration with WHO and Jhpiego. A Critical care workshop in obstetrics was held in Vizag with OGSV, alongside operative delivery sessions during the SZ Yuva FOGSI conference in Mysuru. Additional skill-building included a Celestial Birthing Workshop during the AOGD Annual Conference & a comprehensive Birthing Skills and Managing Complications at the EZ Conference in Siliguri. Each workshop emphasised

practical, evidence-based approaches tailored to both urban and rural care settings. In 2025 again had the privilege to do it in AICOG Mumbai on the topic of Obstetric Emergencies. The Obstetric Kaleidoscope was conducted at the VP Conference in Kolkata. In all workshops, hands-on NSAG and UBT were sought after. SMC had Active Participation in the 66th and 67th AICOG.

**Training Programs:** SMC conducted impactful training programs for frontline workers and ASHA workers in Delhi and Assam, and a focused session for Medical Officers at Kurnool on ANC and referral protocols. These efforts were complemented by awareness sessions across Andhra Pradesh, Pravara, and Agra to strengthen grassroots maternal health practices. An online certificate course for Obstetricians on "Perinatal Mental Health" was successfully conducted in collaboration with RCOG and PARC. The initiative was appreciated by one and all.

**Collaborative Advocacy:** Engaged in technical consultations on fetal monitoring, labour induction, and HPV vaccination with organisations such as Jhpiego, USAID, UNICEF, and ICMR. Myself and VP Dr. Shyamal Sett represented FOGSI at the Thalassemia Conclave in Delhi on 28th February 2025. Key themes included universal HPLC testing, gene therapy, and strengthening government collaboration. I had the privilege to represent FOGSI at the World Health Summit Regional Meeting (Apr-2025) at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, contributing to panels on reducing MMR/NMR, addressing contraceptive care gaps, and advocating for national attention to menopause. The summit reinforced FOGSI's commitment to advancing comprehensive women's health on global platforms. It was an honor for me to represent FOGSI.

Community Engagement and Outreach: SMC conducted 5 health camps and 23 public awareness programs, reaching hundreds of women and adolescents, particularly in underserved regions, focusing on anaemia prevention, antenatal care, and safe birthing practices. It also participated in national consultations to strengthen the care continuum and launched the YouTube channel "Wisdom Nuggets" for accessible, evidence-based education.

**Special Milestones:** I along with Dr Mitra Saxena, visited Frankfurt University, Germany at President Elect FIGO Dr. Frank Louwen's center to deepen my knowledge on breech vaginal birthing and India's connection to global obstetric practices.

**Sampoorna:** I was given the responsibility of the Presidential Project Sampoorna "Swastha Janm Abhiyan". Across 15 cities, sessions held in collaboration with local societies, promoting inclusive, evidence-based practices focused on Pre-Conception Care, planned Pregnancy, Maternal nutrition, high-risk pregnancy, and fetal wellbeing. Reinforcing FOGSI's commitment to comprehensive care of women and reducing MMR, achieving SDG much before 2030.

Important celebration: SMC celebrated National Safe Motherhood Day in 2024 in an online format with 8 other committees, with lots of activities. This year, we celebrated it nationwide with remarkable enthusiasm, culminating in making a record e-Pledge campaign recognised by the India Book of Records (IBR). The initiative saw widespread participation from FOGSI societies, healthcare providers, and communities, reinforcing the national commitment to respectful and safe maternity care for every woman. Physical CME with 40 Public Awareness camps and distribution of a Booklet on Preconception care were also done. In May 2024, the "Cherishing Motherhood" event was held on Mother's Day, focusing on PPH.

**Gyan Pravah Podcast:** As part of the Presidential initiative, I have been a part of four insightful podcasts in 2025 featuring Dr. Kantikar, Dr. Vipul Tyagi, Mr. Rishi Tandulwadkar, and Dr. Vinay Aggarwal. These conversations explored critical issues in maternal health, policy, and innovation, extending the committee's educational mission through engaging digital platforms.

**Spiritual Symphony:** Arogya – Yog Yatra" was organized at AIIMS Rishikesh in February 2025, focusing on integrating yoga and holistic well-being into women's health. It was a unique experience for me.














## The Concept of Multidisciplinary High Risk Maternity Care

Worldwide, 20 million women have highrisk pregnancies, and more than 800 women die daily from perinatal causes. Of these losses, 6-33% are in the high-risk pregnancy group.5-10% of all pregnancies are complicated by preeclampsia. Malaria, tuberculosis, and chronic iron deficiency anemia are among the other most common pregnancy complications.18.3% of pregnant women who were admitted to primary health care services in South India are considered to be high-risk.

- Risk Perception: the way the pregnant woman defines pregnancy-related risks may affect her ability to seek obstetric care and her willingness to maintain/ comply with the planned care plan.
- Multidisciplinary Care: is the care relating to or making use of several disciplines at once. Multidisciplinary means that health care providers from different professions provide diagnoses, assessments, and treatment for a safe pregnancy outcome.
- Tertiary care on the other hand refers to the care given to the pregnant woman on referral from primary or secondary medical care personnel by specialists

working in that centre.

- Levels of Care- According to the 2019 ACOG Obstetric Consensus, there are four levels of care for maternity services. This classification system establishes maternal care levels for Basic care (level I), Specialty care (level II), Subspecialty care (level III), and Regional perinatal health care centers (level IV), with the goal of standardizing a comprehensive system for risk-appropriate maternal care.
- LEVEL I caters to low-Risk Women with uncomplicated pregnancies and Women with higher risk conditions like uncomplicated Twin Gestation, Labour after Caesarean, Preeclampsia, and well controlled Gestational Diabetes
- LEVEL II Any patient who is eligible for level 1 care and conditions like Placenta Previa with no previous uterine surgery Pregestational Diabetes Mellitus Poorly Controlled Asthma Chronic hypertension.
- LEVEL III-Any Patient appropriate for level II Care and conditions like moderate maternal cardiac disease, suspected Placenta accreta or Placenta Previa with Previous uterine surgery, Adult Respiratory distress syndrome which may need Antepartum or Postpartum

ventilatory support, Acute Fatty Liver Disease, Coagulation disorders, autoimmune disorders, and severe Preeclampsia remote from term.

• LEVEL IV -Any Patient appropriate for level III care and conditions like Severe Maternal Cardiac Conditions, severe Pulmonary Hypertension, pregnant women requiring neurosurgery or cardiac surgery and Pregnant women in unstable condition in need of an organ transplant.

The Capabilities and Health care providers for the four levels are described in the Consensus, giving credence to the fact that many conditions in High-risk pregnancy need multidisciplinary approach.

Multidisciplinary approach in Placenta Accreta

Syndrome is well known. Research shows that the odds of early major maternal morbidity with MDT care was about one-fifth that with Standard obstetric care (aOR 0.22 [95% confidence interval, 0.07–0.71]). Early major maternal morbidity -A change from standard care of patients with PAS to coordinated multidisciplinary care improves maternal outcomes. Women with PAS who were cared for by Multidisciplinary teams had lower median blood loss (2.1 I versus 3 I, P = 0.025) and were less likely to require emergent surgery (23% vs 64%; P = 0.001).

The Obstetric Care Consensus (ACOG) notes that "optimal management [of PAS] involves a standardized approach with a comprehensive multidisciplinary care team accustomed to managing the placenta accreta spectrum." According to the levels of maternal care paradigm, ACOG has also advocated regionalization of care for women with antenatally diagnosed PAS, who, like other women at "extreme risk of massive haemorrhage at delivery," should be referred to and managed in at least a level III hospital. According to the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists, "women diagnosed with placenta accreta spectrum should be treated by a multidisciplinary team in a specialist centre with expertise in diagnosing and managing invasive placentation."

According to an ACOG survey, only 23% of general OBGYNs refer women with PAS to a sub-specialist. Large population-based studies reveal that barely half of PAS patients are diagnosed antenatally. Consider referring to an excellence centre.

Members of the PAS multidisciplinary team must include experienced obstetricians and maternal foetal medicine specialists' radiologists, transfusion medicine experts, obstetric Anaesthesiologists, expert Pelvic surgeons, urologists, Gynaec oncologists, Interventional radiologists, Critical care experts, vascular surgeons,

neonatologists, and pathologists. A well-stocked blood bank is a must-have component of a PAS because MOH-Massive Obstetric Haemorrhage- might occur, which is often abrupt, quick, and life-threatening. A well-defined massive transfusion procedure (MTP), as well as an abundant supply of packed red cells, fresh frozen plasma (FFP), cryoprecipitate, platelets, and fibrinogen Obstetric anaesthesiologists that specialize in catastrophic obstetric hemorrhage.

**MDT in Diabetes complicating pregnancy:** When compared to the general maternity population, women with diabetes continue to have significantly higher chances of bad pregnancy outcomes. A comprehensive study of 12 populations evaluated over the last decade -14,000 women with type 1 diabetes with a background population of four million women compared the prevalence of four fetal and neonatal problems, which were two to five times greater in women with type 1 diabetes than in the general population, demonstrating that pregnancy outcomes for women with diabetes had not improved. According to the research, there is a need to increase teamwork among maternity care professionals. Until date, research has failed to specify how healthcare providers should collaborate or how teams should be constituted. There has been little consistency in the models of care women can access within and between maternity organizations. Evaluations of such models of care are scarce, and the influence of these teams on maternal and baby outcomes has yet to be demonstrated. There is a clear gap in evidence about what an optimal MDT model of care should consist of, as well as the clinical and cost effectiveness of various organizational models of care. The Teamwork in MDT: Teamwork is essential in maternity care services. Poor interprofessional and interagency collaboration leads to poor maternal outcomes. 'Communication failures have been demonstrated to lead to over 70% of unfavourable perinatal outcomes.' At the individual level high caseload, low attendance at meetings, lack of leadership, poor communication, role ambiguity, and failure to consider patients' holistic needs are the barriers to teamwork.

**Multidisciplinary Team approach in maternal cardiac disease** is also well proven, so much so that its being termed as Cardio obstetric Team. Cardio-obstetrics involves specialists from various professions who care on pregnant patients from conception to postpartum.

The Team consists of obstetrician, Primary care physician, cardiology consultation in Modified WHO Class 1,

CIASS II Obstetrician , physician Maternal fetal medicine specialist , Cardiology consultation , Cardio obstetrics expert.

**Adverse Pregnancy Outcomes and CVD:** The link between adverse pregnancy outcomes and long-term CVD risk is becoming more widely acknowledged. Conditions such as hypertensive disorders of pregnancy, gestational diabetes, preterm birth, and small for gestational age are linked to not only short-term maternal and fetal morbidity and mortality, but also long-term risk of cardiovascular events such as myocardial infarction, stroke, and heart failure. Women with APOs are more likely to have CVD risk factors, and the future cardiovascular risk associated with APOs is independent of traditional risk factors. It is unclear whether the link between APOs and future CVD is due to an inherent susceptibility or is the result of vascular insults during pregnancy. The causes are most likely complex, Inflammation, vascular dysfunction, and rapid development of classic CVD risk factors are believed to be the root reasons. APOs are associated with a 2- to 4fold increase in the risk of composite CVD. In all women, getting a full pregnancy history is an essential component of a comprehensive cardiovascular risk assessment. Because many of these pregnancy complications occur in young women who may not seek preventative care on a regular basis, it is critical to raise awareness about the associated CVD risk among patients and clinicians in a variety of specialties, including internal medicine, family medicine, cardiology, endocrinology, and obstetrics/gynaecology. Implementing preventative techniques such as education, screening, and aggressive risk factor reduction throughout a woman's life may result in improved long-term CVD outcomes in this population. Pregnant women with history of APO Adverse pregnant outcome need a cardiovascular assessment at 12 weeks, 3 months and 6 months after enforcing lifestyle changes. Women may also present during pregnancy with previously undiagnosed CVD or develop new CVD during pregnancy, such as peripartum cardiomyopathy (PPCM).

### **Preeclampsia and Cardiac complications**

Diastolic dysfunction and pulmonary edema are two acute cardiac consequences of pre-eclampsia. Pre-eclampsia is also a known risk factor for PPCM. Hypertension associated with HF symptoms, palpitations, or shortness of breath should necessitate an immediate cardiomyopathy examination. Pregnancy and postpartum stroke are also substantially linked to hypertension.

Postpartum hypertension and pre-eclampsia. Preeclampsia is recorded in about 2% to 8% of pregnancies, and contrary to popular belief, delivery of the placenta does not cure the illness. It is now recognized that preeclampsia can develop postpartum. Postpartum hypertension may also be secondary to persistence of gestational hypertension or chronic hypertension. 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
