FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

My dear fellow FOGSians

I pen this with great sense of joy, satisfaction and fulfilment. As FOGSI president 2019, I feel privileged to have shouldered this responsibility and contributed positively towards the improvement of women's health in India.

FOGSI has long been the custodian of women's health and hygiene in India, but this year we took on the onus of going beyond healthcare and supporting women to achieve much more. As an Indian woman, doctor and FOGSI President I strongly felt it's time that we expand our mindset and make earnest efforts for the betterment of all women of India. Hence, the theme for my FOGSI year 2019 has been "We for Stree – Safer, Stronger, Smarter". I think it is prime responsibility of every citizen and organisation like FOGSI to help make each woman of India safer, stronger and smarter.

As President of FOGSI, we identified 10 key priorities regarding women's health in India.

1. To provide optimal antenatal care for best maternal and fetal outcome. #DONTFORGETMOMS

- There was the initiation of Manyata Phase 3 which saw the expansion of the program into Karnataka and Rajasthan and saw the number of accredited facilities increase from 300 to 800.
- We also saw the initiation of world's first private and public Partnership for improvement of quality of care of women in Maharashtra through the LaQshya Manyata Program.

2. Reduce maternal mortality by detecting and treating high risk pregnancies. #SAFEMOTHERHOOD

- Under this abhiyaan, FOGSI released over 15000 posters on post-partum hemorrhage which would help in reducing maternal mortality rates in the country even further
- The Champions of Motherhood program was another initiative which was launched this year where we were able to treat women below the poverty line absolutely free of cost. Over 200 women benefitted through this initiative.
- There were various CME's and camps held all over India to bring about awareness of anaemia and also to update gynaecologists regarding the recent advances

3. To make child birth a safe successful and satisfying experience is the goal of reproductive maternal care. #RESPECTFULMATERNALCARE

- FOGSI has continued volunteering and promoting the PMSMA program and over 2 crore women have benefitted from this initiative
- FOGSI also played a major role in strategising and planning the curriculum for midwifery training in India.

4. To encourage and promote breast feeding practices #MOMSMILKISBEST

- Breast Feeding has always been an important part of maternal and child care and FOGSI truly believes in promoting breast feeding through this abhiyaan. During breast feeding awareness week, there were multiple talks and programs carried out all over India to promote breast feeding practices and also increase the awareness regarding the benefits of breast feeding.
- FOGSI along with Alive and Thrive foundation created a document to bring about Breast feeding practice modules which would promote this abhiyaan. Besides this FOGSI along with Indian association of Pediatrics came out with a position statement regarding breast feeding post LSCS.
- Both these documents have been circulated among all the FOGSI members

5. Promote effective contraceptive methods to cause population stabilization. #POPULATIONSTABILISATION

- Population stabilization is one of the key goals in India. FOGSI collaborated with not only the government but also with FPAI to carry out various programs to bring about awareness regarding this abhiyaan.
- FOGSI with the government and their stake holders met in Delhi to create a position statement regarding injectable contraceptives which would soon be included in the government contraceptive list.
- FOGSI and FPAI released a position statement to ensure that both organizations achieved the goal of population stabilization.

6. Ensure abortion is safe and accessible #SAFEABORTION

- FOGSI has always been a custodian of women's health and the right to safe abortion is something that every woman should have access to easily. FOGSI through various awareness programs via media posters and booklets ensured that the message reached to as many women as possible. Besides this gynaecologists were trained in manual vacuum aspiration, to ensure safe abortions in low resource setting areas. Gyan Varsha CME series helped promote the recent advances in field of contraception and abortions

7. Condemn and strongly oppose female feticide. #BETI BACHAO

- FOGSI and FPAI participated in the Mumbai Marathon by creating a platform to bring about awareness of violence against women and to condemn it. Besides this in the North Zone Yuva FOGSI, there was an awareness walk "BETI BACHAO BETA SAMJHAO". This not only advocated preventing female feticide, violence against women but also advocated that all men (sons, fathers, brothers) should be educated to promote respect for women

8. Propagate awareness and screening of genital cancers in women #FIGHT AGAINST CANCER

- FOGSI launched the WOW that is Wellness of Women in February to help increase awareness regarding genital cancers. There were also camps where over 5000 women were screened and a walkathon to bring about awareness.
- Besides this Breast cancer awareness and screening was another major component which FOGSI wished to cover. Mass Screening programs were held all over India and over 10000 women were not only screened but also taught self-examination so that they can catch any early lesions which can be treated in time.
- There was also a skit for breast awareness carried out.
- Free Cervical cancer screening camps were also carried out throughout the country by FOGSI members which shows their dedication towards women's health.

9. Educate adolescent girls about health hygiene and nutrition in order to get India's girls healthy. #HEALTHYGIRLS

- Menstrual Hygiene has always been a sensitive topic. But this year FOGSI wanted to bring about its awareness in a strong manner. FOGSI and Run for Niine Foundation had an awareness program which was simultaneously carried out all over the country on International women's day.
- FOGSI also wanted to bring about awareness regarding Fibroids and the enigma around it, so there was an awareness walk "Freedom from Fibroids".
- Anaemia testing was done all over the country and more than 2 lakh women were screened in over 130 cities.
- Adolescent health awareness and life skill development workshops for a public forum were carried out.
- FOGSI helped carried out health camps for CRPF and their families to not only screen the women for cancers but their overall health.
- FOGSI also tied up with the Indian Thyroid Society to launch MITA (Making India Thyroid Aware)
- FOGSI also carried out adolescent even called Olympia where over 12000 adolescents participated in 5 days of sporting events
- Adolescent health camps (Health for Her) were held in rural areas to screen adolescents for any health issues

10. Diagnose and treat reproductive tract infections, promote safe sex practices. #SAFESEX

- Various conferences were held on safe sex to bring about awareness and also update on recent advances in this field.
- On 22nd may, Adult Immunisation was carried out.

- FOGSI and FPAI released guidelines on STI and RTI so as to help practitioners get a quick and easy update on treatment options
- Conferences on safe sex's.
- FOGSI with Saathi, NACO, Plan India released guidelines on EMTCT

We set about implementing these abhiyans through 3 verticals simply called as the A B C of FOGSI where –

A – Academics – Increasing knowledge

B – Bridging Collaborations – Building partnerships

C – Community Health initiatives – Implementing strategies to bring about a positive impact in women's health

Core to our universe is the woman. The woman we treat. Whose care, wellbeing, and life is central to our existence. Therefore this year we aimed to bring our focus back to the woman during my tenure as President of FOGSI. FOGSI this year has played prominent multidimensional roles ranging from advocacy, science generation and even social activism. All this wouldn't have been possible without all the support and encouragement extended by each and every FOGSI member.

FOGSI has always been a vibrant and respected organization for its academics which has been a treasure of experience and evidence based practices. Through various conferences, CME's, Conclaves, Webinars, Teaching programs, Publications and joint collaborations, FOGSI has ensured that up to date knowledge and information has been disseminated to all its 37000 members across India.

This year, FOGSI was privileged and pleased to bridge new collaborations and cement old ones with most importantly the Health Ministry, NGO's and public health stakeholders at the spectacular FOGSI Arogya Mahila Summit in New Delhi which was attended by Dr. Harsh Vardhan (Minister of State and Welfare) and Mr. Ashwini Chaubey (minister of state). Various joint strategies, position statements, pledges and health awareness campaigns were launched across the country which will ensure that the community is made aware on the importance of health related issues and accessibility of health care. Quality during health care is a human right and FOGSI's Manyata initiative has amplified this philosophy not only across India but beyond India's borders as well.

"We for Stree- Safer, Stronger, Smarter" was our FOGSI theme. This theme was aimed to help women from all walks of life. Keeping in mind the 10 abhiyaans, FOGSI carried out various health initiatives. With this sole purpose we launched FOGSI community health initiatives so that maximum number of FOGSI members can participate and contribute towards the upliftment of women's health. Over 15,000 FOGSIans participated in these health initiative which positively benefitted the health of over 5 lakh Indian women. As India strives towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and looks ahead to the post-2015 era, progress in reducing maternal mortality becomes a very important frontier. PMSMA was launched in 2016 and I'm proud to inform you that more than 6000 FOGSIans are involved. 2.2 crore ANC check ups have been conducted and 11.75 lakh high risk pregnancies have been identified.

FOGSI Manyata initiative and the launch of the LaQshya-Manyata Program with the government of Maharashtra. FOGSI has gone into a public private partnership with the government of Maharashtra. It is an example of strategic purchase which was decided by the Modi Government in 2012. Thanks Dr Hema Divakar, Dr Hrishikesh Pai, Dr Sanjay Gupte, Ms Pompy Sridhar, Dr Bulbul Sood, Dr Ameya Purandare, Dr Samita Bharadwaj and Dr Rohini Deshpande. As a part of the Manyata initiative, 794 hospitals have been trained providing quality care to about 20,000+ deliveries monthly covering a population of more than 1 crore across 5 states. I would like to thank Team Manyata, NPMU, Manyata champions and donors. Thank you Dr Rishma Pai and Dr Jaideep Malhotra our past presidents.

The kNOw Anaemia campaign was aimed to carve an anaemia free future for India. I am happy that 3000 FOGSIans conducted more than 20 thousand camps which benefitted more than 2 lakh women.

The Champions of Motherhood Initiative was launched with the objective that every FOGSIan should voluntarily perform at least 1 free delivery for women below the poverty line. 130 FOGSIans participated in this noble endeavour and 216 women below the poverty line benefitted from this scheme. Thank you Dr Rajendra Singh Pardeshi and all our champions.

The FOGSI WOW (Wellness of Women) project aimed at providing training for the screening of breast and cervical cancer as well as improving the quality of life. Close to 2 lakh women were screened and I am thankful to Sister Shivani, Dr. Shubda Neel and the 5 thousand Brahmakumari volunteers who participated in this health initiative.

16 FOGSI CRPF Camps were conducted at various CRPF locations for the CRPF Jawaans and their families. 4000+ women were examined and close to 90 FOGSIans participated. A special thanks to Shri. Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar, Dr. Manu Bhatnagar and Dr. Archana Verma for this bridging this significant partnership.

The Health for Her camps for over 3000 adolescent girls were conducted in the tribal areas of Gujarat providing health awareness and screening on key issues of health and hygiene. Gratitude to Reliance Foundation, Jamnagar for this venture. Dr Rohan Palshetkar, Dr Ameya Purandare and Dr Sujata Dalvi

FOGSI Lifeline Express camps for women to educate about and screen for breast and genital cancers at remote villages reached via the lifeline express railway. Through these camps FOGSIans have participated reaching out to over 2000 women. Special Appreciation to Dr. Bhagyalaxmi Nayak and Impact India Foundation for their tireless efforts

FOGSI collaborated with SMILE India foundation, an NGO who has provided free treatment to over 6 lakh affected children with cleft lip and cleft palate. FOGSIans would be making their patients aware about this condition to ensure early diagnosis and treatment free of cost and selective hospitals.

In the PPH end MMR initiative, Protocols for Active Management of 3rd Stage of Labour Posters have been installed in over 18000 labour rooms nationally by FOGSI

FOGSI Olympia was an adolescent health program which encouraged sports participation. Over 12000 adolescents participated in this 5 day program. Rohan Palshetkar and D.Y.Patil Medical College.

Beyond just numbers there were important virtues that FOGSIans achieved via these We for Stree community health initiatives.

- Philanthropy – Champions of Motherhood
- Reaching the unreached – Health for her / Lifeline Express
- Standardizing Quality of care – Manyata
- Building dietary resources and improving nutrition – Anaemia
- Health awareness for early diagnosis – Smile
- Improving quality of life - Wellness of women (WOW)
- Accessible Health Education and Communications - Naarika

Various joint strategies, position statements, pledges and health awareness campaigns were launched with professional associations like IAP, FPAI and IMA etc. and across the country which will ensure that the community is made aware on the importance of health-related issues and accessibility of health care. I strongly believe that women's health needs a multi - disciplinary care so that different perspectives and a holistic approach is obtained. Some of the organisations that we collaborated with include Indian Thyroid Society, Indian Nursing Council, National Woman's Commission, IPAS, WHO, Indian Menopause Society, ICMR, API, NACO, UNFPA, FPAI, Saathi, Plan India, Alive and Thrive, UNICEF, JHPIEGO, McArthur Foundation, GHS, MSD for Mothers, Together for Her and many more.

FOGSI besides being the largest professional organization of specialist doctors in the world is recognized as a powerhouse globally for its academics and health initiatives. This year FOGSI has been an integral part of international events hosted by SAFOG, AOFOG, ASRM, FIGO, RCOG, RANZCOG and EMA. Indeed, I am happy to announce that FOGSI launched its New York Chapter in New York in October 2019.

FOGSI's Audit of Clinical Techniques (FACT) is an important part of our organisational responsibilities toward the key issues of the day. Senior FOGSIans, key opinion leaders, clinical practitioners and government officials collaborated together in brainstorming sessions held on 22nd November 2019 in Mumbai. We drafted key practice points and position statements on PCPNDT, LSCS, Hysterectomy and Respectful Maternal Care. I thank Dr. Hrishikesh Pai, the convenor and all the invited experts for contributing their valuable time and expertise to these consensus documents. I would like to thank the moderators, Geetendra Sharma, Mandakini Megh, Rajani Contractor, Suchitra Pandit, Jaydeep Tank, Ameya Purandare.

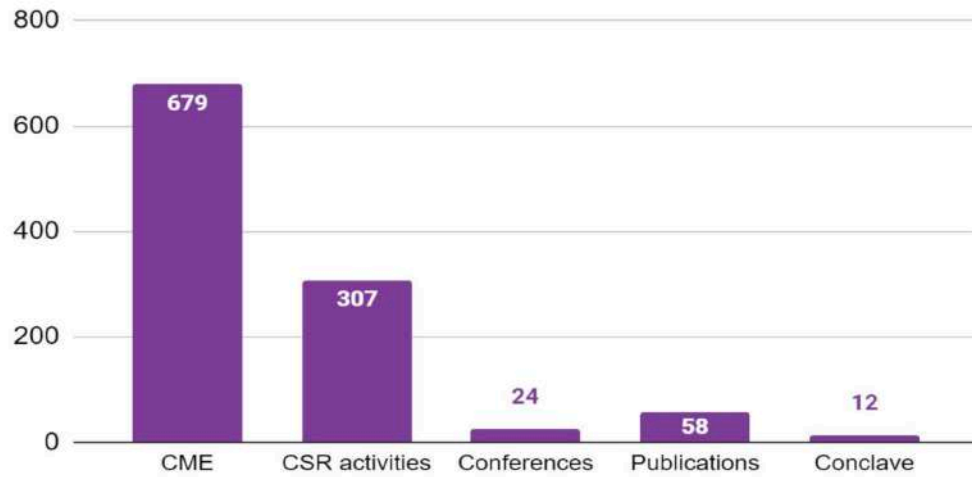
Some of the key highlights of FOGSI 2019 are

- FOGSI goes Digital - **FIRST TIME IN ITS HISTORY** - successful execution of **e-Elections, e-Gurukul, e-Pathshala, online CME courses & Narika** (patient education platform)
- FOGSI and India become the **first national body globally** to launch and expand quality of care and respectful maternal care during pregnancy and childbirth via **LaQshya-Manayata Program**

While FOGSI has made significant contributions to society, previously there has been no comprehensive set of metrics to showcase the scope of this work. FOGSI engaged Catalyst Management Services to support an assessment of its contribution.

A survey was taken of FOGSI members to see how FOGSI impacted its members, society and nation through its work. According to FOGSI data, 679 CME's, 307 CSR activities, 24 Conferences, 12 conclaves and 58 publications were done this year with FOGSI reaching at least 99,300 people this year (although the real numbers may even be higher)

Number of activities conducted in 2019

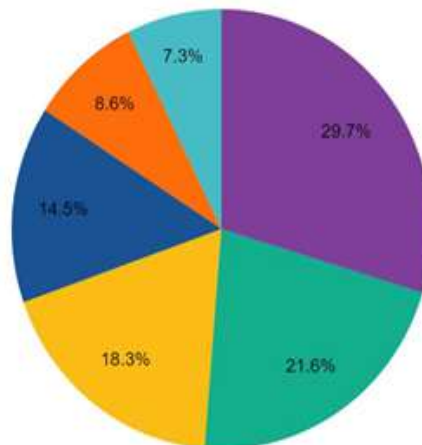


Major Contribution to Healthcare Sector

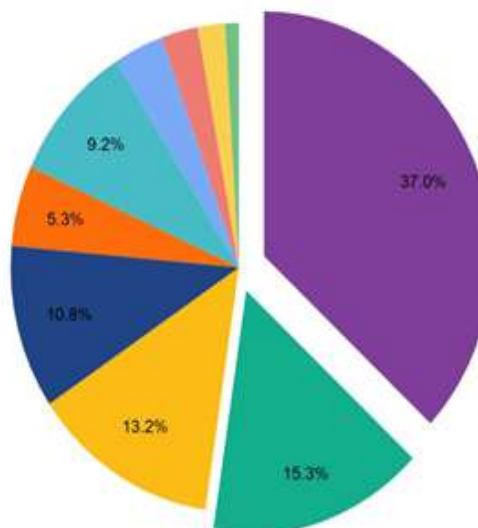

FOGSI's Impact on People's Lives

- ❖ Majority of practitioners feel FOGSI initiatives lead to better health outcomes for women which in turn leads to better health outcomes for their families.
- ❖ A 2012 study of six states in India revealed that many of the primary health centers (PHCs) lacked basic infrastructural facilities such as beds, wards, toilets, drinking water facility, clean labor rooms for delivery, and regular electricity.¹
- ❖ FOGSI initiatives have greatly improved the quality of healthcare being provided to women in the private sector. One such example is the Manyata quality initiative.

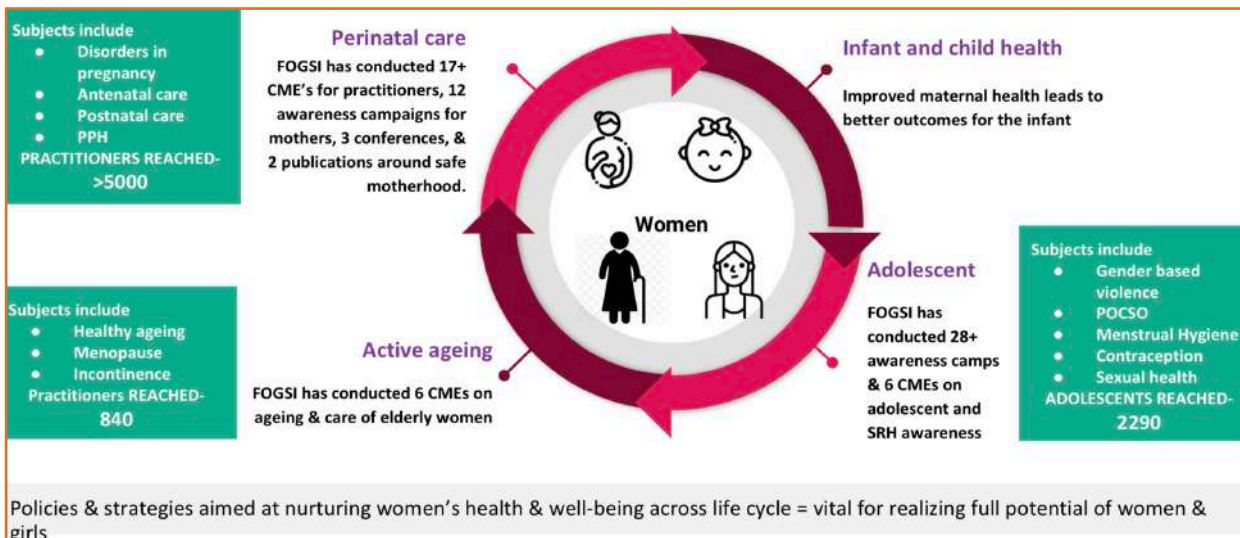

Report from the FOGSI office (FOGSI Year 2019 - 2020)

FOGSI stands firmly on the foundations of all the efforts taken by the past Presidents, Secretary Generals and all the office bearers to hone it into a well oiled machine. The office has now Eighteen full time staff working in a coherent and structured fashion. We run a flat organisation and that makes us uniquely efficient. Systems established in the past year are being strengthened and we are reaping the rewards of the ISO accreditation which was awarded to us in the last year.

The FOGSI team led by the President Nandita Palshetkar, Immediate Past President Jaideep Malhotra, President elect Alpesh Gandhi, Vice Presidents Haresh Doshi, Rajendrasingh Pardesi, Sudha Prasad, Aswath Kumar and Rajat Mohanty, and the administrative team Jaydeep Tank (Secretary General), Madhuri Patel (Deputy Secretary), Suvarna Khadilkar (Treasurer) and Parikshit Tank (Joint Treasurer) have worked very sincerely and hard through the year.

Your office had a bustling year towards ushering in a series of changes some dramatic, some incremental and some tweaks, all geared to make sure that you, the member, can harvest the full potential of all that FOGSI has to offer. It is a pleasure and a privilege to present some updates from a very busy, engaging and ultimately fruitful year.

At the end of the FOGSI year 2019 - 20 we now have 259 member bodies and 37925 members. Each and every society either, already affiliated, in the process of being affiliated and those who aspire to be affiliated deserve our gratitude. It is the member societies on whose shoulders FOGSI stands and we hope that we can expand further and contribute to women's lives.

The FOGSI office continues to support the Indemnity scheme, the Social security scheme and the innovative FOGSI projects like the Manyata project with the NPMU, the WDF project and others. We applied for and received rights to the trademark of the Manyata logo to reiterate our commitment and ownership of the Manyata program. Our Journal (led by Editor in Chief Suvarna Khadilkar), the ICOG (led by Tushar Kar, Laxmi Shrikhande and Parag Biniwale) and the FOGSI website (led by Madhuri Patel) continue to do stellar work. For the first time the President was requested to contribute a page to the

FOGSI pages in the JOGI for every issue and rest are devoted to office issues for e.g. election schedule, caesarean section statement, election result and so on. In a landmark move the editorial side of the Journal has been opened up nationally and this for the first time makes it possible for members from all over the country to apply for the editorial posts in the Indian Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

With its updated infrastructure the office hosted several meetings. Our Office bearers and members also actively participated in several meetings and NIMC inspections all over the nation. Nandita Palshetkar, Jaydeep Tank, Jaideep Malhotra, S Shantha Kumari, Sandhya Saharan, Parag Biniwale, Kawita Bapat, Ajay Mane, Rohan Palshetkar, Jayam Kanan, Mandakini Megh Sudha Prasad, Haresh Doshi, Parikshit Tank, T. Vindhya, Pradyuman Vaja, Rajnikant Contractor, Sudesh Doshi, Archana Baser, Kavita Bapat, Asha Baxi, Dilip Gadhavi, B. Aruna Suman and Dr. Abha Singh. FOGSI also expanded its Real Estate Footprint and almost doubled its area by purchasing a new premises on the second floor just above our existing premises. Thanks are due to the legal team headed by Hariani and Co and our CA Mr Hemant Bhalekar.

Our FOGSI cells led by the conveners Sanjay Gupte (PC PNDT cell), Nozer Sheriar (Prevention of Violence against Women cell), Vidya Bhat (Youth Cell), Bhaskar Pal (Prevention of Violence Against Doctors), Hrishikesh Pai (ART Bill Cell) continue to provide valuable guidance on these issues. We also have expanded the scope of the Cells to function as a think tank beyond these issues.

The statement on Cesarean Section drafted by Jaydeep Tank with inputs from the Core Committee and the MCM was presented at various fora including at the the Federation of Medical Associations (FOMA) meeting in New Delhi. The IMA has endorsed this statement - the first time a FOGSI statement has been endorsed by the IMA. Jaydeep Tank also worked on the statement on Implants and FOGSI wrote to the Union Health Minister advocating for a rapid rollout and availability of Implants in public sector facilities.

We continued with the changes instituted last year in the format of the minutes of our various meetings and the decision to not print copies of the previous managing committee meeting for distribution at the managing committee meeting. The minutes were of course circulated by email to all the member societies in advance. By this simple step we saved the printing of approximately **11200 pages**. The agenda and minutes of the GBM were also circulated electronically to all our members. This saved the printing of over **10 lakh pages**. The Constitution which has been completely overhauled, stream lined, made easy to understand for all members, by

adding explanations where required, creating an index and renumbering with chapter, clause and sub clause to make for easy referencing and cross referencing within the constitution continues to serve us well.

FOGSI contributed to the relief efforts after the Kerala floods and contributed 10 Lakhs to the Chief Ministers relief fund in 2018 which also included contributions from our member societies. and in an effort to directly help the women of Kerala contributed INR 11,33,000 to refurbish and equip again a PHC at Chalakudy. We are thankful to Aswath Kumar, V P Paily sir, P K Shekaran sir, Fessy Louis and Venugopal and the President and Secretary of the Thrissur Socieity Dr Ramesh and Dr Deepthi M and all our members from Kerala for coordinating the activity. The new facilities were opened up the new facilities on 25th July and a golden plaque with FOGSI's name is displayed at the entrance.

In a break from the past we have further implemented the administrative guidelines for representation to International organisations and ensured that there is participation from the entire membership rather than restricting to only the MCM. The terms of reference for the Conference Conduct committee were changed. Instead of the conference conduct committee making a recommendation for the AICOG Venue, the Committee is now mandated to scrutinise eligibility and put forward the eligible applications to the MCM for a final decision. It was also decided that voting for the allocation of the AICOG would take place on the first day of the respective MCM. Discussions to distribute the zonal allocation of the AICOG more equitably were initiated and taken to a logical conclusion to ensure that the distribution of AICOG's would be equitable and commensurate with the number of eligible societies in every zone. Institutionally an important step was taken with the amendment in the eligibility criteria for the Vice Presidents post to account for organisational experience of FOGSI. In yet another important step toward standardisation FOGSI Training Centers are now requested to undergo a renewal every five years.

e Voting!!

In a truly landmark move FOGSI held the first ever elections where voting took place by e voting this year.

The process has been a long time coming and was made possible by a mature and robust Membership Management System developed over the last two years. The System allows members to handle and update their own data, back by a secure OTP based system to ensure that any changes are verified by the member. This enables members to update the data as and when they need without the need for a complex system of having to update in the local society which then

sends to the office. We are giving members control over their own data. If you have not already done, please log on to member.fogsi.org and check your data.

The whole process was only possible because of the support of the entire MCM the GBM, all the Presidents and Secretaries of our Societies and all the office bearers of FOGSI. All the Vice Presidents through the years and ICOG officers Tushar Kar, Parag Biniwale, Laxmi Shrikhande, Mandakini Megh, Parul Kotdawala, Uday Thanawala and all in the ICOG and Journal boosted morale and confidence. The discussions started when Prakash Trivedi, Alka Kriplani and Rishma Pai were the Presidents and Hrishikesh Pai was the Secretary General. Landmark changes to the Constitution to enable e voting (among several other changes) were made when Jaideep Malhotra was the President in my first year as Secretary General and the first ever elections by e voting were conducted when Nandita Palshetkar was the President in my second year as Secretary General. The administrative office bearers and returning officials Madhuri Patel, Suvarna Khadiolkar and Parikshit Tank took the process to heart and gave valuable inputs, and Hrishikesh Pai, Nozer Sheriar, PK Shah, CN Purandare the past Secretary Generals gave important guidance.

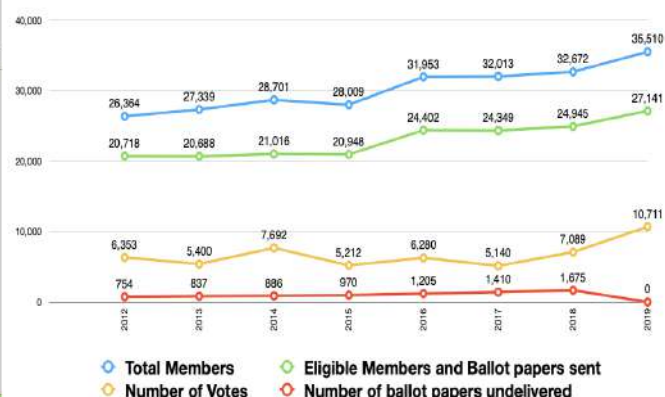
All members also adapted to the system very well to increase the voting last year. I must specifically mention Sanjay Gupta Sir, P C Mahapatra sir, Chandravati Madam, Narendra Malhotra, Suchitra Pandit, Hema Divakar, Jayam Kanan, Sudhir Shah, Niranjana Chavan, Ameya Purandare, Sunita Tandulwadkar, Dilip Walke, Atul Ganatra, Dipak Bhagde, M C Patel, Niranjana Shah, Rajendrasingh Pardesi, Aswath Kumar, Ritu Joshi, Krishnendu Gupta, Dibyendu Banerjee, Basab Mukherjee, Bhaskar Pal, Priti Kumar, Archana Verma, Kalyan Barmade, N Palaniappan, Neharika Malhotra, and all the young brigade on Social media who went out of their way to promote the voting platform. Most of all, the candidates for all the elections also supported and appreciated. Of Course, this would not be possible without the support of the FOGSI staff and the Tech support from Prometheus and the auditors of the election systems Deloitte and Security Brigade.

The election schedule saw a mock election, Committee Chairs election and Office bearers election. All the elections were conducted in two phases. Several members queries were addressed via email and phone calls by the office and resolved. The results were declared within an hour of the close of voting.

The committee chairs elections saw unprecedented participation. **The voting percentage rose from 32.13% in the immediate past year to a remarkable high of 80.18%.** This is record breaking participation. The previous highest participation was 46.29%.

The office bearers election also saw stunningly high participation compared to the past years. The number of votes cast this year was a record breaking **10711 votes - the highest ever and the first time ever that voting for these elections crossed the 10000 votes mark !** The previously unavoidable scrooge of undelivered ballot papers (approximately 1100 per year), invalid votes (average of around 15 to 20% of all votes cast every year) and ballot papers not sent back for various reasons was completely eliminated. **There was not a single invalid vote; every vote counted!!** In all, members from 235 Societies participated in the election making it a truly participative and reflecting the consensus of the entire membership.

The huge participation and the smooth conduct of the elections has been the result of a mammoth effort in developing the digital edifice on which FOGSI now rests, poised to take on the future confidently.

Legal

For the first time ever FOGSI stepped up for its members in judicial activism when FOGSI filed a WP in the Supreme Court for rationalising the PC PNDT Act. Medical bodies had been agitating against the act for over a decade now. Several medical associations were in the several CSB's and so many other meetings where graded responses and other reforms had been promised without ever being delivered. A lot of effort went into the petition led by the Presidents (Alka Kriplani, Prakash Trivedi, Rishma Pai, Jaideep Malhotra and

Nandita Palshetkar) the Secretary General's Hrishikesh Pai and then Jaydeep Tank, all the office bearers, the MCM the legal team and the brave FOGSIan's who arranged for and gave affidavits (Dr M C Patel, Dr Rajnikant Contractor; Dr. Dilip Gadhi, Dr. Kiran Oswal, Dr. Prabhakar, Dr Prakash Patel) and the PC PNDT Cell led by Sanjay Gupte and Prakash Trivedi. FOGSI prayed for an interpretation for the act which was fair and constitutional. The senior counsel, amongst the most prominent in the country, (Soli Sorabjee and Shyam Divan) were also convinced, as were we, that, what we prayed for was just and reasonable. The current Supreme Court judgment maintains the status quo with some added reassurance in the form of assumptions and declarations made in the Judgment, e.g. The submissions

raised by the FOGSI regarding issuance of notice to be made mandatory (Para 23) has been accepted by the Court in its final conclusion in Para 96 of the judgment, the Court has presumed that Advisory Committee constituted under the Act that consists of a legal expert, necessarily aids and advises the appropriate authority in all the cases, which is not true as the Advisory Committee is not even constituted properly at lot of places (Para 43), The records are required to be maintained only when the procedure or tests are conducted on pregnant woman or when patient may have been advised to use pre-conception diagnostic tools to conceive a child; Since follicular studies, semen preparation for intra uterine insemination, IVF, ICSI, oocyte pickup and embryo transfer cannot determine gender hence the same seem to not fall under the purview of the regulation as far as record keeping for these procedures go. Hence if action is taken by the AA against any member for the above procedures, the same can be successfully challenged by the members (para 60). Cases of Indefinite Suspension without the advise of advisory committee can be challenged by the members. That the AA has to consider each case on merits with the help of advisory body which has legal expert as provided under S. 16 and 17(5)(6). Hence if any of our members face any action from AA without the advice of advisory body, same can be challenged. (Para 89). This was a bold, positive and proactive step by FOGSI for its membership and we should continue in the same vein. Clearly this is not

the time to give up but rather buckle down and try harder. All representations are welcome and indeed needed.

Besides this FOGSI has also represented in the IRIA case and the arguments in the Oxytocin case. We also had a successful advocacy effort in circular issued in Beed district regarding a circular on Hysterectomies which was restrictive toward our members. Kalyan Barmade brought this problem to our attention and Nandita Palshetkar and Jaydeep Tank proactively coordinated with the Society, presented FOGSI's point of view. Parikshit Tank presented this at the meeting hosted by the State Government and the Government saw merit in our arguments. We will work together to address this issue.

This report is by no means a complete record of all the work done. There has been much more which has gone into making this FOGSI year a resounding success. Needless to say led by the President Nandita it was a true pleasure and a privilege working shoulder to shoulder with the Office bearers, Chairpersons and the all the members of our great Federation. We all look forward to meeting you at the next Managing committee and General Body meeting and at various CME's and conferences.

Greetings!!

Amongst the various organizations of medical speciality, FOGSI has always remained in forefront in innovation. FOGSI has always appreciated, acknowledged and accepted the innovative suggestions of all the FOGSIans. It is with this collective and inclusive approach, we are able to stand tall amongst our peers. FOGSI has stepped into the digital age several years back and now has ventured forward with several digital initiatives.

Web literally means a “Net”. The website virtually brings the community in one net, one web. The World Wide Web (“WWW” or the “Web”) is a global information medium which users can read and write via computers connected to the Internet. Google’s search engine now one of the most visited sites on the internet was an effort to put some order in to the Web. As Tim Berners Lee, the founder of the World Wide Web put it so concisely “Web users ultimately want to get a data quickly and easily.”

The FOGSI website has undergone a comprehensive redesign so that the web users can get a data quickly and easily. The new design seeks to embrace the cutting edge of Web Graphic Design and I am very happy to report that besides the actual coding most of the design has been done by us. Our website is testimony of innovation and dynamism. We have channelized all the suggestions and criticism and the result is obvious. Our website is very much user friendly. We have tried our best to evolve website which is easy to understand and operate. Our members who are not very much tech savvy and who do not have much time to browse our website, are also happy to acknowledge the simplicity of our website. Our main focus is to reduce scrolls on the pages. The lack of scrolling means the content is extremely focused, and the hierarchy of content is clearly established.

We have also introduced Responsive Web Design to repaginate the content to suit the device being used to view it. The fluid grid allows the content to react to smaller / larger browser windows. Therefore, we could make the website Flat, Responsive and Small. The Responsive Web Design responds to user’s behaviour and an environment based on screen size, platform and orientation. The practice consists of a mix of a flexible grids and layouts, images and an intelligent use & CSS media queries. Enough rooms on the edges of the article and background, let your eyes breathe.

Navigation is fluid and context sensitive with the number of clicks being reduced to minimum with the use of hovering to

change the content below the menu as you move from icon to icon. e.g. in the page where the office bearers are listed hovering over the office bearers brings up the contact details. We also have a static top menu which remains in place as you scroll through a page allowing you to have navigation options from anywhere in the page rather than going back to the top of the page every time you need to go to another page. We also now have a dynamic homepage. This year in homepage we have incorporated TOG’s, FOGSI Quiz, videos of academic interest like operative laparoscopic surgeries, the President’s message videos from 2017 onwards and updated photo gallery with AICOG photographs since 2009 which gives few pictures of all events. There are some dead links on the page for features we will introduce as the website develops.

We have also tried to incorporate “delightful design” into the website. As an example when you hover over the menu above and below the dynamic scroll you will notice that the dot below the text gets magnified to show your place on the page easily. You will also notice the colours of the placeholder dots are saffron, white and green to represent our national flag.

We have introduced Google translate built in to the website which will allow users from all over the world to access the website in their native language. Currently we have the languages from the countries where the Analytic data shows we have the heaviest use from besides English.

In last year, the website hosted 138,688 users with 243,661 sessions and 738245 page views.

We can be contacted directly from the website simply by filling a form on the home page itself. We have formed a Website Committee. We have also in place a Website Advisory Board consisting of FOGSI members, FOGSI partners and International advisors. We have also put in place an editorial process for the website.

The office:

The office is moving rapidly towards automation of various tasks ranging from the simple like backing up data to complex

tasks like the membership management system. The office has invested in state of art IT infrastructure and is making the most of it resulting in greater efficiency and fewer redundancies.

Last year we have introduced Outlook : FOGSI.ORG EMAIL which is easy to operate and have merged with Gmail. Members can directly email to concerned staff for their queries for e.g.FOGSI OFFICE OUTLOOK ID : office@fogsi.org ,FOGSI ICOG OUTLOOK ID: icog@fogsi.org, FOGSI MEMBERSHIP OUTLOOK ID: membership@fogsi.org, FOGSI JOURNAL OUTLOOK ID : jogi@fogsi.org, FOGSI ACCOUNTS OUTLOOK ID : accounts@fogsi.org and FOGSI TRAINING OUTLOOK ID : training@fogsi.org .

The SMS Software continues to prove its utility with messages being used to reach out to our members. The SMS system is built on the database of our members. We have put in place SMS policies and policies to protect member's data. Any conference which is in partnership with FOGSI can send SMS's to our members at no cost for the conference through the office. We are also using no cost SMS policy for important information and with release of each issue of the journal with the link so that members can access directly complete information/ abstract/ full article from their smart phones. This year we have sent a total 49,00,000 SMS to our members.

Membership Management System

FOGSI is Federation of societies and as such relies on its societies for the data of its members. Although a large majority

of the data is good, there are significant gaps in the data which cause a lag in communication. We have therefore developed a cloudbased membership management system. We have empowered our members with the ability to view their data and change it subject to verification using OTP's for verifying the mobile number and email. This year with Membership Management System, we could conduct first ever e voting successfully without invalid votes.

Quality Assurance meeting

I have been representing FOGSI as committee member for Maternal Death Surveillance and Response (MDSR) i.e. Quality Assurance Meeting and MTP Committee meeting at Mumbai District, Maharashtra since last five years.

I would like to thank Dr. Nandita Palshetkar, President FOGSI 2019, Dr. Jaydeep Tank, Secretary General, Dr. C. N. Purandare, my Mentor, Advisory & Committee members of website, Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar, Treasurer, Dr. Parikshit Tank, Joint Treasurer, Web crafters URVI Compugraphics (Mr. HN Trivedi & Mr. Sanjay Gole), Office Staff especially Sangeeta and Kanchan for their valuable inputs and support in these digital initiatives.

TREASURER REPORT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2019

It is my privilege to present the treasurer report of our federation for the year January to December 2019

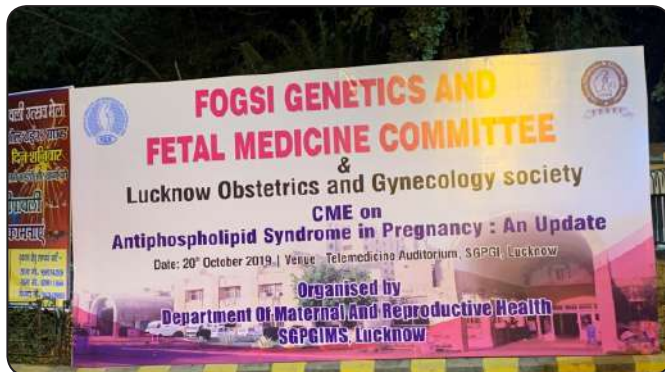

The purpose of Midlife Management would be to ensure that she enters and passes through this crucial phase of life in the pink of health.

Project title: Hyperglycemia in pregnancy: Building capacity

In 2019 a strategic initiative was launched to empower doctors, nurses, auxiliary nurse midwife, and laboratory technician to strengthen the quality of pre, intra and postpartum care for women having GDM/HIP by Government of India (GoI) – Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (Maternal Health Division), World Diabetes Foundation, The Federation of Obstetrics and Gynaecological Societies of India, International Federation of Gynecology and Obstetrics, Avni Health Foundation and participating Medical colleges and Private Medical Centers in Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Karnataka.

Progress so far in alignment with the objectives

- (a) Develop a generic, universally applicable, comprehensive, competency-based Learning Resource Package (LRP) and data collection tools on HIP which can be used for training Health Care Providers (HCPs) and monitoring program success; tailor these to make specific to the Indian context-

A learning resource package (LRP) specific to India is ready and in use. LRP is comprising of the agenda, power-point presentations based on the curriculum, case studies, videos, pre-test & post-test forms, feedback form on overview, diagnosis and management of Hyperglycemia in Pregnancy and programmatic cum administrative guide software training manual.

The trainers and HCPs have been given a copy of the above, approved and appreciated by WDF.

This is to be formally released at the AICOG 2020 at Lucknow.

- b) Roll-out tailored LRP through a cascade training approach - first to Master Trainers and then to HCPs in the 06 identified facilities across India.

A national core technical team comprising of Dr Sanjay Gupte, Dr Meera Agnihotri, Dr Vinita Das, Dr Girija Wagh, Dr Savitha, Dr Amita Pandey, Dr Srinivas, Dr Thelma Sequeira ably led by Mr Ajay Bhardwaj and Dr Hema Divakar support the program technical, implementation and administration.

- (c) Establish Diabetes in Pregnancy (DIP) clinics at these 06 identified facilities to study the impact of the training program in terms of translation of skills into practice, achievement of universal coverage of testing, and identification and management of HIP using a robust reporting system.

The HIP software created for the program enables the following to ensure accountability of service providers:

1. Data entry of the pregnant women as per the data reporting tools – records right from basic details, past medical and obstetric history, current examination and investigations results, treatment plan, delivery outcome to first follow up at 6 weeks.
2. Registration of the participating facilities
3. Registration of the healthcare providers trained
4. Registration of users
5. Export reports on service delivery & training

We have been able to successfully implement the program so far. As on date we have set up six top class GDM/HIP training cum implementation centers, *we have trained 466 doctors/nurses/lab technicians who provide quality service delivery,

*attended to 20,000 pregnant women,

*identified/treated 1200 GDM/HIP women

*and set up a national HIP software to support the program monitoring.

A very positive dialogue with the Central Government has been initiated. We expect them to direct the State health departments to join our training programs using their own funds. This will lead to the States initiating the implementation of the HIP program and mobilizing procurement & supplies of glucose and testing strips for all public institutions.

Manyata is FOGSI's flagship initiative in partnership with MSD for Mothers, MacArthur Foundation and Jhpiego for private sector providers which was formally inaugurated in 2017, after the sign up in 2013 for phase one by Dr Hema Divakar, 2013 President of FOGSI. FOGSI has customized safe delivery standards in alignment with WHO standards and Govt of India standards, for the private maternity care providers in India. Led by FOGSI, the program harnesses the power of a professional society not only to scale but also self-regulate.

National Program Management Unit funded by MacArthur Foundation, under FOGSI, manages the program operations , including sensitization, enrolment and co ordination for assessment visits to conduct quality assurance, which includes trainings for lead assessors, who are deputed to carry out external assessments for certification independently and issue Manyata certification.

AN EVER-GROWING MANYATA COMMUNITY

We started the year with 319 Manyata-certified facilities in January, 2019. As the year draws to a close- expanded to 579 facilities - across Maharashtra, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Karnataka, and this number is expected to grow to 778 in the next three months. In a span of three years, close to **800 private maternity providers** across Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Jharkhand, Rajasthan, Karnataka are under this initiative have received certification or are in the process of seeking Manyata certification . Keeping the Indian Prime Minister's 'Aspirational Districts Program' as a priority intervention, Manyata has already expanded its presence in 9 out of the 19 aspirational districts in Jharkhand. Manyata follows the global principle of Quality, Equity and Dignity (QED) More states are primed to join the program in the near future!

MANYATA'S CENTRE FOR SKILL ENHANCEMENTS (CSEs)

6 CSEs (Navi Mumbai Obstetrics and Gynecological Society office in Navi Mumbai, Dr Gupte's CSE in Pune, Dr Divakar's CSE in Bangalore, Dr Hazra's CSE in Jharkhand, Dr Chandrawati's CSE in Lucknow and Dr Jaideep Malhotra's CSE at Rainbow hospital in Agra were developed in 2019 for conducting trainings for doctors and staff on Manyata standards, skill drills.

MANYATA GOES DIGITAL

The digital platform for Manyata went live from July 26 2019. Providers can now visit www.manyataformothers.org for India or www.maharashtralaqshayamanyata.org for Maharashtra to register, pay and track their quality certification journey with Manyata, seamlessly. Providers can login with their credentials, explore the dashboard and stay clued in to all the developments regarding Manyata.

Project ECHO, a digital blended learning platform, aims to optimize healthcare delivery in India by addressing the challenge of knowledge transfer in the healthcare sector. Integrating technology with the healthcare system, makes it more accessible, robust and dynamic. Project ECHO sessions. CSEs are dedicated training management centers under Manyata. These centers conduct trainings for doctors and staff on Manyata standards, skill drills.

CMEs AND SENSITIZATION SESSIONS FOR PROVIDERS and TRAININGS

Lead Assessors trainings were held at Pune CSE, Navi Mumbai Obstetrics and Gynecological Society office in Navi Mumbai, Jaipur and Mumbai FOGSI Office on **apprising 88 Maharashtra FOGSI lead assessors** on the newly included Facility Standards under the Manyata and LaQshya-Manyata program. One of the training was attended by renowned gynecologist Dr Michael Robson, highly acclaimed for his C-Section classification system. Regular refresher trainings are held at Navi Mumbai CSE, headed by Dr. Uday Thanewala and Dr. Sucheta Kinjawadekar. Many onboarding and training sessions conducted by FOGSI-NPMU team for the newly joined hospitals in Mumbai.

LAQSHYA-MANYATA – A JOINT INITIATIVE BY GOVERNMENT OF MAHARASHTRA AND FOGSI – yet another major milestone

This year, Manyata achieved an important milestone in its pursuit to benchmark quality care for private providers in India. The Public Health Department, Government of Maharashtra



has partnered with FOGSI to launch 'LaQshya-Manyata', a quality improvement and certification program for private maternity care facilities, to be rolled out in every district and Municipal Corporation of the state. LaQshya-Manyata was officially launched amid fanfare on September 8, 2019 in Pune, by Shri Eknath Shinde, former Hon'ble Minister for Health, Maharashtra, and Dr Nandita Palshetkar, President, FOGSI. In attendance were prominent state government officials, FOGSI-NPMU National Convenor Dr Hema Divakar, FOGSI leadership, and MSD for Mothers.

REPORT OF INDIAN COLLEGE OF OBSTETRICIANS AND GYNAECOLOGISTS (ICOG) JANUARY TO DECEMBER 2019)

The chief objectives of ICOG Activities were to promote education, training and to spread knowledge in the field of Obstetrics and Gynaecology and to popularize the ICOG nationally and internationally. In keeping with this, the main activities from January to December 2019 were as follows:

- 1. ICOG Convocation:** The ICOG Convocation was held on January 11, 2019 during the 62nd All India Congress of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at Bengaluru, Karnataka. Mr. K. Jairaj, Chief Secretary (Retd), Govt. of Karnataka was the Guest of Honor, Dr. Ravi Chandran, President AOFOG was conferred Honorary Fellowship. Total 165 new Fellows, 7 new Member were conferred the Fellowship and Membership of ICOG. Also 1 ICOG Emcure Pharma Travel Awardee, 6 Toppers of ICOG Certificate Course training exams in Reproductive Medicine, Gynaecological Endoscopy, USG, Fetal Medicine of January and July 2018 batches were felicitated. New ICOG office bearers were installed as Prof. Tushar Kar, Chairperson, Dr. Laxmi Shrikhande as Vice Chairperson and Dr. Parag Biniwale as Secretary.
- 2. FOGSI-ICOG Dr. C. L. Jhaveri Endowment Symposium 2019:** FOGSI-ICOG Dr. C. L. Jhaveri Symposium was scheduled during 62nd AICOG at Bengaluru, Karnataka on January 10, 2019 from 2.00 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. Dr. S. Shantha Kumari, Dr. Uday Thanawala, Dr. Parag Biniwale and Dr. Rajendrasing Pardeshi, Vice President of FOGSI had chaired this session. Topic: "Quality, Ethics and Dignity of our Profession, What is the way Forward?". Speakers were Dr. Arun Boruah, Dr. Manju Puri, Dr. N. Palaniappana and Dr. Purnima Nadkarni with their subjects as Endoscopy: A boon for women's health issues, Providing Quality Obstetric Care in overburdened Public Health Facilities: A Roadmap, Intrapartum fetal monitoring - "Quality, Ethics and Dignity of our Profession, What is the way forward? & Rural ART set up & concurrent postgraduate Fellowship training program - a combined model. Fifth speaker Dr. Sunila Khandelwal could not attend the

symposium.

- 3. Combined MICOG-MRCOG Part 1 examine:** The MOU between FOGSI ICOG & RCOG has been renewed for Next three year ie. 2019 to 2022 for conducting combined Part 1 & 2 MRCOG courses as well as exams in India.

January 28, 2019: MRCOG Part 1 examination was done at Kolkata and Mumbai centres. Only one candidate was cleared out of 6. The name of successful candidate was Dr. Bagul Kalu T, MS.

May 4-6, 2019: 14th Refresher course was attended by 7 candidates at FOGSI office for July 2019 batch of exam. Dr. William Forsen, UK was the RCOG faculty and National Faculties were Dr. Suchitra N. Pandit, Dr. Hiralal Konar, Dr. Sarita Bhalerao, Dr. Reena Wani, Dr. Purnima Satoskar etc. Dr. Nandita Palshetkar, Dr. Mandakini Megh, Dr. Laxmi Shrikhande, Dr. Madhuri Patel visited for supervision specially.

July 1, 2019: MRCOG Part 1 examination was done at Bangalore and Delhi centres. Total 6 candidates were cleared out of 9. The names of successful candidates were as Dr. Anshu Baser, Dr. Aparna A. Patil, Dr. Sarmishtha Chakrabarti, Dr. Vibhusha Rohidas, Dr. Deepa S. Agrawal and Dr. Jutimala B. Bhattacharyya.

- 4. MRCOG Part 2 examine:** May 19-21, 2019: 2nd Refresher course for MRCOG Part 2 exam was attended by 4 candidates at FOGSI office, Mumbai. Dr. Mohsen Iskander & Dr. Nithya Palaniappan, UK faculties were conducted the course successfully. ICOG Officials Prof. Tushar Kar, Dr. Laxmi Shrikhande and Dr. Parag Biniwale also visited the course.

July 2, 2019: MRCOG Part 2 examination was done at Bangalore and Delhi centres. The name of successful candidate was Dr. Sumeet Baheti, Nagpur.

- 5. Combined MICOG-MRCPI Part 2 examine:** As MOU between FOGSI ICOG and MRCPI was due since 2018 and due to MCI recognition issue, RCPI is not ready to

renew the MOU between us. However, the College has developed a new Diploma in Obstetrics and Women's Health which will replace the current DOWH exam. The new Diploma which is anticipated will be available shortly, will be on offered as a six-month online diploma. This should be of interest to any potential exam candidates wishing to take MRCPI in Obstetrics and Gynaecology.

6. **Result of ICOG Election is as follows:** From 2019, ICOG has adopted Step Ladder System for Office Bearers election. There will not be any election in 2019. Every two years, the elections will be held for Secretary & Governing Council member posts and every alternate year there will be an election for Vice Chairperson Elect. The election will be conducted electronically.
7. **ICOG Certificate Course:** Lot of applications received for various training from all centres. Total 13 new centres recognized in 2019 which are as 1. Dr. T. Ramanidevi, Trichy, Dr. Y. K. Swapna, Hyderabad, Dr. Asha Baxi, Indore & Dr. Sudha Prasad, Delhi for Reproductive Medicine and for Gynaecological Endoscopy as Dr. Renu Singh Gahlaut, Kanpur, Dr. Atul Munshi, Ahmedabad, Dr. Y. Savitha Devi, Hyderabad, Dr. Vasundra Thiagarajan, Chennai, Dr. Alka Kriplani, Gurgaon & Dr. Asha Baxi, Indore etc. Also for Fetal Medicine Dr. Chinmayee Ratha, Hyderabad, Dr. Selvapriya Saravanan, Nagercoil. For USG, Dr. Meeta, Hyderabad centre was recognized. In Critical Care in Obstetrics, Dr. Girija Wagh centre was recognized.

Total 76 candidates in all certificate course appeared for the exam and 52 were cleared the exam. 22 were absent and 2 were fail. The top candidates in each certificate course were Dr. Shilpa Agrawal in Reproductive Medicine, Dr. Aditi Vivek Joshi in Gynaecological Endoscopy, Dr. Dureja Jayati in Ultrasound who all felicitated at the time of ICOG Convocation was held at Lucknow during 63rd AICOG 2020.

a. Report of ICOG Centre Heads meeting done on Feb 13, 2019: 2nd ICOG Centre Heads meeting was held at FOGSI office & it was attended by total 17 centre heads with all OBs. The purpose of this meeting was to have the uniform training module for a particular course across all centres. In previous meetings, there were lot of deliberations on the feedback forms received from the Candidates. In this meeting, first hand information was sought from the Centre Heads and they also had opportunity to discuss the uniform training module. Following points were discussed 1. Who should provide training- Centre head personally or anyone assigned by the centre head and it was decided that only Centre Head should be responsible for giving the training. Training centres should be monitored by ICOG Office bearers and every training

centre should be renewed every 5 years. Centres should re apply after 5 years-ICOG to conduct re inspection, Centres have to pay the fee again for reaccreditation and then it will be Recognized. There was lot of discussion on the duration of course. As per Reproductive Medicine & Endoscopy training Centre Heads, duration should be more than 6 months as these are very vast subjects which can not be covered in six months. After a lot of discussion, it was agreed upon six months training. There was lot of discussion to have Basic-6 month course and Advance-12 month course but uniform consensus was to have strict uniform policy for all the courses as far as ICOG training courses are concerned. There was consensus regarding the timing of the candidates, prescribed in the course will be 9 A.M -5 P.M and one day off (preferably Sunday). But anybody interested can spend more time or adjust the timing in consultation with the centre head.

All the centre heads agreed that the timing should be flexible as OPD timings of different centers are different but it has to be 9 hours /day. Centre head will not force the candidates to work extra. It was decided that centre should take 2 candidates per batch for first three years and then 3 candidates. If candidate is absent, Centre Head should inform ICOG Office. Dr. Parag Biniwale said that if any candidate remains absent for three times, his / her name will be automatically removed from the list of candidates. Those who fail the exam can appear again with a payment of Rs. 10,000/- and how many times a candidate can reappear was asked in the meeting. Each course starts from January/February 1st and June/July 1st and exam will be as decided by ICOG, anyone can join later but exam will be after finishing 24 weeks. They have discussed the fix dates for joining so that training curriculum and log book can be maintained as required. Prof. Tushar Kar suggested that they should prepare a standard Disclaimer which will be followed by all training Centres for smooth running of the training & to avoid future medico legal hassles. Dr. Madhuri Patil & Dr. Manjula Anagani volunteered to share their disclaimer. Dr. Parag Biniwale requested incoming Vice Chair Dr. Parul Kotdawala to prepare the standard Disclaimer. It was once gain made clear that it is Certification course and not fellowship so the centre head should issue certificate accordingly.

There was lot of deliberation on who can conduct the exam and decision taken was that at least one examiner should be expert in that particular subject, Centre head cannot be examiner in his/ her own centre and both the examiners should be from outside except in emergency situations such as any drop out of examiner, local examiner can be allowed. It was discussed whether Exam can be conducted at FOGSI office or at centres, Dr Biniwale said that the officer bearers will look in

to feasibility. Dr Prakash Trivedi suggested to select the Exam Centre where there is direct access by Airways, exam centre should have the capacity of 25 candidates, centre should have few basic things required for exam like Models, dummies etc. and dates should be informed 3 months in advance.

There was a lot of discussion on Log Book. Dr. P K Shah, Past President , FOGSI ICOG suggested that log books should be original, signed by centre head with dates when the cases were done and not just before the exam, should include academic activities as well as the presentations and procedures carried out by the candidate, marks should be reduced to 20-25 instead of 50. It should mention the daily activities of the trainee as well as the number of the procedures, candidate should do one publication at zonal or national conference and two presentation at FOGSI conferences. There were lot of discussion on Exam Pattern also. Dr. Purnima Nadkarni & Dr. P. K. Shah suggested to give the old exam papers to all centres for their knowledge. Dr Madhuri Patil suggested that if more than 20 candidates will be there, they should divide into 2 batches to give sufficient time to examine the candidates. Dr P. K. Shah suggested that log book of candidates should be checked properly as it carry 50 marks and reduce the marks to 20/25. Dr. Shantha suggested that out of 2 examiners, 1 should be office bearer of ICOG to know the ground realities of Exam . Dr. Laxmi Shrikhande said that ICOG Question bank data is very less so Prof. Tushar Kar has given the responsibilities to all 25 G C members to send atleast 20 MCQ's to office before May 31, 2019 which will be more beneficial and appreciated to increase and improve the Question bank of ICOG Training courses. She requested all G C members to do their responsibility in time. There were lot of discussion regarding Q Bank-by compiling the Q papers, to have experts to formulate Q paper, to pay re numeration to experts who are setting the Q paper for ICOG-Rs.50/- as University pays as per Dr Krishna Kumari's information. They should have new Qs every year- Answers with reference which should be given to candidates and centre heads for their reference and have compilation of old Qs –available for everyone-candidates, person who is setting Q paper, ICOG office, examiner etc.

There was lot of discussion regarding refund of training fee as refund allowed to those who have not completed 1½ month training which will be on pro-rata basis ie by deducting the days of attending, No Refund of fee after finishing 1½ month of training (ie.25% attendance), 10% deduction within 10 days with valid reason as suggested by Dr. Parul Kotdawala, No refund after 1 ½ months and can be carry forward for the next batch. It was discussed when to discontinue the center, Dr Megh suggested that If no training imparted for consecutive

3 years, Dr. Parag Biniwale said that it has been approved that any centre of FOGSI & ICOG who did not train single candidate for five years, they should reapply for accreditation with payment. Dr. Shanthakumari suggested that ICOG Office bearers should have surprise visits to the centres in their tenure.

Dr. Laxmi Shrikhande said that following were selected Reviewers to Review the Courses as mentioned:

1. Reproductive Medicine – Dr. Ameet Patki: Vast syllabus-some suggested to make it 12 months. Standard level of syllabus with set of lectures given to centres to be covered over a period of six months. Theory Exam at FOGSI office, some said practical exam also. central MCQ bank which should be reviewed every five years and 20% new MCQs should be added every year. form separate committee to set & update the question bank, question papers. Dr. Parul Kotdawala - upload the 5 model question papers of each course on ICOG website for candidates. After three months, candidates should be called at FOGSI office for appraisal and keep two days lectures for candidates. Dr. Pragnesh Shah- online appraisal. Dr. Prakash Trivedi- don't call them to FOGSI office for lectures also. Selection of Candidates: Dr. Sonia Malik- criteria for candidate selection- online exam for all the candidates, Dr. Madhuri Patil- conducts theory exam and selects 3 best. Dr. Prakash Trivedi- ICOG has given the right to all centre heads to select as per their choice with post graduation proof, FOGSI membership and payment.

2. Gynaecological Endoscopy – Dr. Parul Kotdawala: Duration- 6/ 12 month as it needs surgical skills. Goal of training should be level 3 & 4 of Laparoscopy & level 3 of Hysteroscopy. Dr. Duru Shah- two training courses at same centres is allowed but candidate cannot have two different training simultaneously. Simulators – mandatory.

3. Ultrasound – Dr. Mandakini Megh. PCPNDT issue for ICOG course. Dr. Prashant Acharya Centre. Less no of candidates. Short term FOGSI USG courses doing well but not this one.. may be 6 month is too long. Dr. Usha Saraiya - ICOG has already got one page in two issues of Journal ie in March-April and Nov-Dec but they have to be utilized properly. Wait for 1 year-if no response then convert it to fetal medicine course? Dr. Tushar Kar- ICOG training certificate will be more attractive, thicker, glossy, with golden letters and big in size.

4. Fetal Medicine – Dr. Archana Baser. Only 1 centre- so self assessment is done. This course is in infancy stage not in ICOG but also in country which is evolving. To get more candidates for this course, ICOG needs to do more advertisement and advocacy. Syllabus is OK. Training on simulator for skill development for three months which is not

in syllabus, hands on training should be given.

5. Vaginal Pelvic Reconstructive Surgery – Dr. Ashok Kumar. Endocrinologist is not necessary- name should be removed. Add no and type of vaginal surgeries performed to get a fair idea about the center. Make colposcope must for the centre -only magnification. Remove the word reconstructive from the course. Simulator. Video, Models.

6. Critical Care in Obstetrics – Dr. Sadhana Gupta. Only 1 centre at Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi – Dr. Pratima Mittal. Started in 2016 reach as many Medical Colleges & PG students to spread knowledge on availability of the course. There are total five centres in Private sector and out of five, only one associated with ICOG. Training needs Team of Obstetricians, Anaesthetists, Critical care physicians, Cardiologists, Pulmonologist, Respiratory therapists. Delete the fetal invasive procedures under the "SKILLS" section. Dr. Alpesh- by 2020 Govt will have 300 HDU and 200 OB ICU- so continue the course. 1 month observership course -15 k fee. Problems with Critical care course. As per ICOG GCM fee reduced to half-15 K / duration 1 month. Dr. Alpesh unhappy with reduction of fee and duration. Dr. P K Shah- uniform policy for all the training courses. Dr. Laxmi Shrikhande – make it short term course like FOGSI courses if there are no takers for 6 month training. Nutshell- Total 25 GCM- 7 GCM- Reproductive medicine Course- Review, Q paper, Q bank. 6 GCM- Gynec Endoscopy Course- Review, Q paper, Q bank. 3 GCM- Fetal Medicine course. 3 GCM- USG course. 4 GCM- critical care course. 3 GCM- Pelvic vaginal surgery course. 1 For Review, 1 for setting Q paper, 20 MCQ / GCM before May 31.
