Committee meeting. He read out the message which has received by the lawyers. Dr. Jaydeep informed that the office is now ISO accredited. We have hired two new staff in the office Mrs. Shubhada Redkar and Ms. Poonam Mendhare, we have also bought their salaries in line and I have made a proposal that we need to relook at the staff salaries and peg them to inflation, need to study them statistically,peg them to inflation to make sure that our staff is not underpaid or for that matter overpaid also. So he will bring that for discussion in April.

Dr. Jaydeep Tank informed about the case in Ratnagiri. Dr. Bawaskar, unfortunately, had a maternal death and she was really hounded terribly. She had to actually become a fugitive because she was not getting bail from the lower court, then she spoke to us, he helped her to go to the high court, actually spent a full day in the high court during her hearing because they wanted him as an expert witness, unfortunately, that bail was rejected in high court also. So he helped her to approach the supreme court and today, fortunately the supreme court has given her a bail so they have struck down the order of the high court and this is very important order because if the court would have upheld this then all of us would have been in trouble because it would be precedence in the supreme court and then all of us would have potentially had problems getting bail in the future.

Dr. Jaydeep asked how do we declare the results because in the managing committee we make an announcement there is no meeting.

He said the problem with SMS is that somebody will lose and somebody will win the election and I don't think somebody who loses wants 34000 members to know immediately by sms that I have lost. His suggestion actually was to put up the announcement on the website, I think it is equally good and whoever is interested to go and see and anyway the person who wins is going to send an sms to everybody. We can then send a link to the page on the website with the results by SMS

Dr. Bhaskar Pal said that when the sms goes out, sms doesn't go out that who has lost, the sms goes out that who has won. I think it is a dissemination of the information to the 34000 that who is going to be a next President, Vice President of the FOGSI. Dr. Jaydeep said it will not be one sms, sometimes there will be a long list of people, VPs and committee chairs etc. it just more convenient to put on the website. Dr. Parikshit said to send a link on the webpage. Dr. C. N. Purandare said to send a link through the SMS so that everybody can click and see the result.

After discussion it has been decided that we put up the pdf on the website and send the link saying that but will have to be very smart about it, as soon as the result declared Sanjay has to put it immediately on the website and immediately we have to send the link on same day. Will have to be very careful about that because we don't want to delay the results.

Dr. Jaydeep also said that today we read out the entire changes and we have explained them to you in the Managing Committee so that we can either put up one slide after another so you just proposed and seconded with out discussion or we can have discussion he asked members what would you prefer. All were agreeable with proposing and seconding.

Proposed constitutional amendments of ICOG presented by Dr. Parag Biniwale

Recommendations by ICOG Governing council and managing committee to the general body as far as the constitutional amendments of ICOG is concerned

- Governing council had received a letter regarding ascendency pattern in ICOG like in journal & administrative office bearers
- Secretary ICOG & Secretary General FOGSI worked on a model & submitted to Governing council.
- The proposal was discussed in ICOG GCM in September and in MCM. It was accepted by majority.
- Resolution was prepared and presented to ICOG governing council and the managing committee on 8 January 2019
- It was accepted in both the meetings by majority.

Old Clause

7. Governing Council: The Governing Council shall comprise of FOGSI Office Bearers, ICOG Office Bearers (Chairman, Vice Chairman and Secretary), Chairman Elect, Vice Chairman Elect and twenty five Elected members. In addition, all the Past Presidents of FOGSI and Past Chairpersons of ICOG will be the members of the Governing

Council. All are eligible to vote. The Governing Council shall have twenty five members elected every two years by the Members and Fellows of ICOG. The Elected members shall continue to function till such time that the new council is elected and their successors appointed by the Indian College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists. Only Fellows of ICOG can be Office Bearers or Elected members of the Governing Council of ICOG.

New Clause

7. Governing Council: The Governing Council shall comprise of FOGSI Office Bearers, ICOG Office Bearers (Chairman, Vice Chairman and Secretary), Chairman Elect, Chairman Elect Designate Vice Chairman Elect and twenty five Elected members. In addition, all the Past Presidents of FOGSI and Past Chairpersons of ICOG will be the members of the Governing Council. All are eligible to vote. The Governing Council shall have twenty five members elected every two years by the Members and Fellows of ICOG. The Elected members shall continue to function till such time that the new council is elected and their successors appointed by the Indian College of Obstetricians & Gynaecologists. Only Fellows of ICOG can be Office Bearers or Elected members of the Governing Council of ICOG.

Old Clause

- 8. Office Bearers: The Members and Fellows of ICOG shall elect the following office bearers from its Fellows. Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary.
 - Persons so elected as Office Bearers of ICOG shall hold their respective office as Vice-Chairman and Secretary until their successors are appointed.

New Clause

- 8. Office Bearers: The Members and Fellows of ICOG shall elect the following office bearers from its Fellows, Vice Chairman and Secretary. (deleted Chairman).
- The Vice Chairman will ascend to the post of Chairman elect designate and then Chairman Elect and Chairman with no election. (January 2019, 2020, 2021 only)
- The secretary will ascend to the post of Vice Chairman elect with no election at the end of her / his tenure.
- · Each post will have to be ratified by the Governing Council.
- The Vice Chairman (elect) post will be opened for election during the second year of the secretaries' tenure (applicable after 2020).
- The post of chairman elect designate will only be open for these three years.
- This amendment will be applicable from election year 2019.
- Persons so elected as Office Bearers of ICOG shall hold their respective office as, (Vice-Chairman and Secretary - to delete) until their successors are appointed.

as Chairman Elect and Vice Chairman elect and will be members of the Governing Council. They will take office of the Chairman and Vice Chairman at the inauguration of AlCOG from 2013 onwards. The Chairman and Vice Chairman taking office in April 2012 will have a tenure upto January 2013.

(iv) "Members of the Managing Committee" shall be deemed to include the President, Vice-Presidents, Immediate Past President, President Elect, Secretary General, Deputy Secretary General, Treasurer, Joint Secretary, Joint Treasurer, incoming Vice Presidents, Editor, Associate Editor, Joint Associate Editor, Assistant Editor, First Joint Assistant Editor, Second Joint Assistant Editor of the Journal, Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Secretary of ICOG, Committee Chairpersons, FOGSI Representatives to FIGO, AOFOG,

Proposed by Dr. Kamini Patel and Seconded by Dr. Rajan

SAFOG and any other International Organisations, Members nominated by Memberbodies of the Federation, all Past Presidents, Vice Presidents for a period of 10 years with voting rights for three years (with effect from 7.1.2011), Past Secretary General for a period of 10 years (with effect from 28.9.2014), Past Chairpersons of ICOG, Conveners and Co-ordinators of FOGSI'S special projects.

Page 4, New Clause no 1

(iv) "Members of the Managing Committee" shall be deemed to the President, Vice-Presidents, Immediate Past President, President Elect, Secretary General, Deputy Secretary General, Treasurer, Joint Secretary, Joint Treasurer, incoming Vice Presidents. Editor- In - Chief, Associate Editor, Joint Associate Editor, Assistant Editor, First Joint Assistant Editor, Second Joint Assistant Editor of the Journal, Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Secretary of ICOG, Committee Chairpersons, FOGSI Representatives to FIGO, AOFOG, SAFOG and any other International Organisations, Members nominated by Memberbodies of the Federation, all Past Presidents, Vice Presidents for a period of 10 years with voting rights for three years (with effect from 7.1.2011), Past Secretary General for a period of 10 years (with effect from 28.9.2014), Past Chairpersons of ICOG, Conveners and Co-ordinators of FOGSI'S special projects. Editor -in - Chief should be allowed in the Managing Committee for ten years (with effect from Sept 23 9. 2018).

25A. President:

(e) The tenure of the post of President is one year only or till his successor is installed. After the tenure is over, he will not contest for the post of President again in future, nor contest for any post of office bearers of FOGSI, Chairman of committee's of FOGSI and Chairman of ICOG in future. However, he will be entitled to contest for the post of Representative of FOGSI to FIGO, AOFOG, SAFOG and any other international organisations, office bearer of Journal Committee i.e. Editor, Associate Editor, Joint Associate Editor, Assistance Editor and Office Bearer of ICOG i.e. Hon. Secretary, Vice Chairman, Chairman and member of any specific committee appointed by Managing Committee / General Body only.

Proposed amendment (already approved in September 2017 and minuted as mentioned below)

25A. President:

(e) The tenure of the post of President is one year only or till his successor is installed. After the tenure is over, he will not contest for the post of President again in future, nor contest for any post of office bearers of FOGSI, Chairman of committee's of FOGSI and Chairman of ICOG, Editorial post of JOGI in future. However, he will be entitled to contest for the post of Representative of FOGSI to FIGO, AOFOG, SAFOG and any other international organisations, Chairman and member of any specific committee appointed by Managing Committee / General Body only.

- Teaching experience of minimum five years for undergraduate for MBBS and / or Postgraduates for M.D. or equivalent qualification.
- Teaching experience in recognized Medical College and teaching hospital affiliated to University.
- Should have held the post of Associate Professor / Reader / Hon. Associate Professor in recognized Medical College and teaching hospital affiliated to University.
- Should have published minimum ten publications in our Journal.

Proposed

- a) Criteria for selection on Editorial side for the post of Second Joint Assistant Editor
- Teaching experience of minimum five years for undergraduate for MBBS and / or Postgraduates for M.D. or equivalent qualification.
- Teaching experience in recognized Medical College and teaching hospital affiliated to University.
- Should have held the post of Associate Professor / Reader / Hon. Associate Professor in recognized Medical College and teaching hospital affiliated to University.
- Should have published minimum ten publications in our Journal.

Should have served for three posts of three years each as National Corresponding Editors

Jaydeep Tank raised a query that as per the proposed clause the candidate should have served for three posts of three years each as National Corresponding Editors and that is total nine years!

Dr. Khadilkar clarified that JOGI's administrative side post holders spent three years each starting from lower most post that is Jt. Assistant Secretary till Secretary and Manager and this becomes total of nine years. Therefore the candidates who would be applying for the "Second Jt. Assistant Editor"

- should have worked in JOGI for nine years as a National Corresponding Editors.
- Dr. Jaydeep Tank said that in the September meeting it was discussed and decided to make it two years tenure.
- Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar said that it was suggested but nobody agreed upon as then everyone's term will become two years it will affect the whole team.
- Dr. Geetha Balsarkar said that the administrative people spend nine years before they appear for the interview of the "Second Jt. Assistant Editor", therefore we should not disturb this process and stick to the three years tenure.
- Dr. Jaydeep Tank said that if you are going to open directly at Second Jt. Assistant Editor then have you put mechanism that how will select Second Jt. Assistant Editor?
- Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar explained Dr. Tank that it is already in place i.e. the editors advertise the post and after receiving the applications it is scrutinised and eligible candidates are called for an interview at head office FOGSI. The best amongst the applicants are then selected for the vacant post.
- Dr. Jaydeep Tank said that this mechanism will work when the applicants are only from Mumbai but do you think that the same mechanism will work when the applicants would be from out of Mumbai.
- Dr. Suvarna Khadikar said that why the applicants can't come for an interview for their future 12 years post in JOGI?
- Dr. Jaydeep Tank asked that are there any other way for the selection besides an interview? As we don't have an interview for any post in FOGSI and this is the only post we are having interview for.
- Dr. Geetha Balsarkar said that whereas Journal is concerned there have been always interviews.
- Dr. Jaydeep Tank said that he understands and it worked very well when the editors were from Mumbai but now that we are opening it up nationally then do you think there is role for a different process.
- Dr. Ashwini Bhalerao Gandhi said that we should go as per the criteria and when the post is by selection then interview has to be held.
- Dr. Jaydeep Tank said that he understands it but then we should think through all the issues.
- Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar said that we have still not defined that interviews will be held where? And it can be still discussed as it comes under admin guideline.
- Dr. P.K Shah asked Dr. Jaydeep Tank that when is he asking about the process then what is in his mind?
- Dr. Jaydeep Tank said that in his mind is whether we have explored all the options. He gave an example of dispensing with the interviews maybe we can have some other mechanism, how the other journals select their editor? If you are going to open it up nationally then now it is a good time relook at everything, see what other people are doing and then put a process in place.
- Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar said that when she was the IMS president and they had a system in place where editors are selected by interview at the conference so if the committee agrees then they can have interviews at AICOG conference.
- Dr. Dilip Dutta suggested the election for the post of "Second Jt. Assistant

Editor". Dr. Geetha Balsarkar said that now we cannot change selected post to elected post.

Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar strongly objected to the suggestion of election. She further said that this is the post where certain minimum requirement is there, we require scientific basis, teaching experience as it is not the post of popularity so we should not have an election but only selection.

Proposed by Dr. D. K. Dutta and Seconded by Dr. C. N. Purandare.

Dr. P.K Shah said that our Journal is very prestigious and when you hold an interview then you can find out one to one as we want the best person to manage our Journal and that should be left to our interviewers. For the time being we should accept it and if Dr. Jaydeep Tank feel that he has better way then we can have it in future.

Dr. Jaydeep Tank raised a query that does this mean that if somebody has gone through the administrative side of the journal then there is possibility he or she may not be able to become "Second Jt. Assistant Editor"?

Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar clarified that when Dr. Pankaj Desai was the president that was the time when the link was broken otherwise every Jt. Assistant Secretary would go directly to the editor in Chief's post but then everyone realised that having such hierarchy in between there should be a break so the editorial post was open to interviews.

Dr. Jaydeep Tank suggested that in the next managing meeting EIC can present the terms of an interview that is its procedures and all. Let the managing committee also understand that how the process works. He said that it can be passed at present but in the next managing committee meeting in April they should come up with interview procedures.
